#### 1. Purpose and Introduction

1.1 A ballot in respect of the proposal to create a combined retail and tourism business improvement district for the whole of Torbay is planned. It is proposed that the business improvement district will enable more effective working between the retail sector and tourism sector to increase staying and day visitors as well as increasing footfall within the town centres and retail areas. The Council will be entitled to vote in the ballot, and there needs to be approval as who will cast the votes for the Council.

#### 2. Proposed Decision

2.1 That the Executive Director of Operations and Finance, in consultation with the Mayor and Group Leaders be nominated to cast the Council's votes in the ballot for a retail and tourism business improvement district.

#### 3. Reason for Decision

3.1 The Council will be entitled to vote in the ballot, and there needs to be approval as who will cast the same.

#### **Supporting Information**

#### 4. Position

4.1 On 25 September 2014, the Council approved funding of £100,000 over a two year period to develop the Tourism and Retail Business Improvement District (TRTBID) for Torbay with a view to reaching a ballot by autumn 2015.

- 4.2 The Council contracted with Mosaic Partnership to progress the TRTBID and they gave formal notice requesting the billing authority (Torbay Council) to hold a ballot in relation to the TRTBID proposal, (in accordance with Regulation 4(2) (ii) of the Business Improvement Districts (England) Regulations 2004) on 5 January 2015.
- 4.3 The TRTBID levy will be applied to all ratepayers within the defined area of the Borough of Torbay with a rateable value of £7,500 or more. Only businesses with the following rates categorisation will be included:
  - Retail
  - Retail (Finance)
  - Public Houses
  - Public Conveniences
  - Marine
  - Language Schools
  - Food and Drink
  - Entertainment and Leisure
  - Conference
  - Communication
  - Car Parking
  - Beach huts
  - Advertising
  - Accommodation (Self Catering)
  - Accommodation (Hotel)
  - Accommodation (Guest Houses)
  - Accommodation (Caravan Park)
  - Accommodation (Camping)
  - Accommodation (Holiday Units)
- 4.4 Based on current records, Torbay Council will be responsible for casting a vote within the TRTBID for the 44 hereditaments included at Appendix 1 to this report as the Business Ratepayer (owner or occupier). The BID levy payable by the Council based on the current levy recommendation of 1.75% of business rateable value will be £33,932 (Note: this may be subject to change following the consultation end date of 5 June 2015).

#### 5. Possibilities and Options

5.1 If the ballot is to take place, it is important that the Council exercises its right to vote.

#### 6. Fair Decision Making

6.1 In determining how to vote on behalf of the Council, in its capacity as a landowner/occupier, the Executive Director of Operations and Finance will consult with the Mayor and Group Leaders.

#### 7. Public Services (Social Value) Act 2012

7.1 Mosaic Partnership will contract with Electoral Reform Services to conduct the ballot. However they will formally need to be given the go ahead by the Returning Officer at Torbay Council which is the responsible body as determined by the BID legislation for this element.

#### 1. Purpose and Introduction

- 1.1 To appoint the Council's committees for the new municipal year. In addition to ensure the committees have appropriate terms of reference and that appointments to those bodies are made in accordance with the relevant statutory requirements.
- 1.2 To appoint the Mayor and Councillors to outside bodies for the next four years.

#### 2. Proposed Decision

- 2.1 that the overall political balance of the committees, as set out in Appendix 1 to the submitted report, be approved;
- 2.2 that, subject to 2.1 above being approved, the committees be appointed with the terms of reference set out in Appendix 2 to the submitted report;
- 2.3 that, subject to 2.1 above being approved, nominations be received to fill the seats on the committees;
- 2.4 that the outcome of the review and proposed appointments to the outside bodies and other groups for 2015 to 2019 set out in Appendix 3 to the submitted report be approved.

#### 3. Reason for Decision

- 3.1 The Constitution requires Members at their annual Council meeting to determine which committees to establish for the forthcoming municipal year, their size and terms of reference and the allocation of seats in accordance with the political balance rules.
- 3.2 Following the local elections on 7 May 2015 the Council is required to agree the appointments to outside bodies and other groups for the next four years.

#### Supporting Information

#### 4. Position

4.1 The election held on 7 May 2015 resulted in changes to the political composition of the Council. There are now 26 members of the Conservative Group (including the elected Mayor), 7 members of the Liberal Democrat Group, 3 members of the Independent Group and 1 UK Independence Party (UKIP). The political balance is now:

Conservative Group	26 seats	= 70.2%
Liberal Democrat Group	7 seats	= 18.9%
Independent Group	3 seats	= 8.10%
UK Independence Party (UKIP)	1 seat	= 2.70%

- 4.2 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires the Council to allocate seats on committees to political groups in accordance with the size of each group as a whole, unless alternative arrangements are notified to all members and agreed without any councillor voting against them. The Council is required to observe the following principles as far as it is reasonably practicable:
  - (a) that not all seats on the body are allocated to the same group;
  - (b) that the majority of seats on the body are allocated to a particular political group if the number of persons belonging to that group is a majority of the authority's membership;
  - (c) subject to paragraphs (a) and (b) above, that the number of seats on the ordinary committees of a relevant authority which are allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the total of all the seats on the ordinary committees of that authority as is borne by the number of Members of that group to the membership of the authority; and
  - (d) subject to paragraphs (a) to (c) above, that the number of seats on the body which are allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the number of all the seats on that body as is borne by the number of Members of that group to the membership of the authority.
- 4.3 The Executive is excluded from the requirements of political balance.
- 4.4 The Council is required to determine the number of seats on each committee and the allocation of those seats to the political groups and the independent members. Applying the principles of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 and the supporting Regulations, the distribution of seats (attached in the table set out in Appendix 1) would be proportional (co-opted members are not included in the calculation for proportionality purposes).
- 4.5 Members are asked to note that any decision to waive the requirements of political balance will require a resolution of the Council with no member voting against.

- 4.6 The Council has carried out an extensive review of its appointments to outside organisations and other groups which has informed the appointments process for 2015. Appointments to outside bodies are made every four years (where possible) following the whole Council elections.
- 4.7 Torbay is entitled to one place on the Devon and Cornwall Police and Crime Panel and the Council is required to appoint its representative each year. The Police Authority (Community Engagement and Membership) Regulations 2010, which came into force on 17 March 2010, amends Regulation 8 of the Police Authority Regulations (appointment of members by relevant councils) and gives provision for Elected Mayor's to be appointed as the authority's representative if that person and the Council indicate that they wish them to be appointed as their representative. The Mayor has confirmed that he does/does not wish to take up this appointment. The Council's representative on the Devon and Cornwall Police and Crime Panel also sits on the Safer Communities Executive.

#### 5. Possibilities and Options

5.1 The allocation of seats on committees must be proportional to the political composition of the Council unless the Council resolves otherwise with no member voting against.

#### 6. Fair Decision Making

6.1 The appointments have regard to equal opportunities.

#### 7. Public Services (Social Value) Act 2012

7.1 The Public Services (Social Value) Act 2012 is not applicable as no procurement is being undertaken.

#### 8. Risks

8.1 There is a statutory requirement to undertake a review of political balance following a change in the political composition of the Council. This review has been completed. Therefore there are no risks unless members fail to determine the matter.

#### 4. **Position**

4.1 Before the end of each Municipal Year the Council considers the provisional calendar of meetings for the following Municipal Year, which is then ratified at the Annual Council Meeting.

- 4.2 The meetings of the Council have been programmed to allow sufficient reporting time between the meetings for the plans and strategies which are required to be approved through the Council's Policy Framework process and for the budget setting process.
- 4.3 The Annual Council meeting which was scheduled to take place on 26 May 2015 has been changed to 11.00 a.m. on 1 June 2015 to avoid the school half term holiday with the adjourned Annual Council meeting being held at 1.00 p.m. on 1 June 2015 with the civic dinner being held on Thursday, 4 June 2015.
- 4.4 Licensing Committed scheduled for 28 May 2015 has been moved to 4 June 2015 due to the change in date of Annual Council.
- 4.5 The Council meeting scheduled for 29 October 2015 has been moved to 22 October 2015. The Council meeting scheduled on 4 February 2016 has been moved to 3 February 2016 and as a result the Overview and Scrutiny Board scheduled for 3 February 2016 has been cancelled.
- 4.6 The Development Management Committee meeting on 8 February 2016 has been moved to 9 February 2016 due to deadlines for motions in relation to the budget.
- 4.7 To align with the reporting requirements of partners and stakeholders the Health and Wellbeing Board will meet on 18 June 2015, 8 October 2015, 3 December 2015 and 24 March 2016.
- 4.8 The calendar has also been structured to allow, wherever possible, for each type of meeting to be allocated a certain day e.g. Development Management Committee to meet on Mondays, Licensing Sub-Committees on Thursdays and Council on Thursdays.
- 4.9 Meetings of the Employment Committee and Civic Committee are proposed to be held on an ad hoc basis, to be determined by the Governance Support Manager in

consultation with the relevant Chairman/woman.

- 4.10 It is proposed that the Priorities and Resources meetings will be determined by the Governance Support Manager in consultation with the relevant Chairman, after the Elections in May 2015 to enable the Mayor and Administration to determine how they wish the budget meetings to be run.
- 4.11 The Health Scrutiny Board will be undertaking its work using Review Panel methodology with visits and informal meetings forming the basis of its work. The Health Scrutiny Liaison Group will continue to meet with the NHS Trusts during the course of the Year. Meetings of the Health Scrutiny Board will be arranged on an ad hoc basis, normally to discuss proposed changes in services. Due to the nature of service change, programmed meetings invariably do not meet the timetables required for such discussions and it is therefore more efficient for meetings to be arranged as required.

#### 5. **Possibilities and Options**

5.1 Wherever possible the timings of meetings have been set in accordance with the needs of the Committee Members and the Public, for example the Licensing Sub-Committees convene at 9:30 a.m. which is suitable for those making representations. Timings are kept under constant review by the Governance Support Manager. There is a small risk that some people will still not be able to attend these meetings, however, in most cases where public participation is permitted, the Council will accept written representations to enable people to put their points of view across.

#### 6. **Preferred Solution/Option**

6.1 Members may wish to set alternative dates for meetings. However, the meetings have been timetabled to allow sufficient time for the reporting of the plans and strategies which make up the Council's Policy Framework and the Council's budget setting process. A calendar of meetings is required under Standing Orders and facilitates the organisation of the Municipal Year.

#### 7. Consultation

7.1 The Mayor, Group Leaders and the Executive Director have been consulted on the provisional calendar of meetings for 2015/2016.

#### 8. Risks

8.1 Each Business Unit will be involved in preparing reports and officers will be required to present reports at meetings where appropriate.

- 3. (i) The Deputy Mayor will be responsible for the discharge or all executive functions relating to the regeneration of the Castle Circus area of Torquay as the Mayor owns properties in this area and has a personal and prejudicial interest;
  - (ii) the Deputy Mayor will be responsible for the discharge of executive functions if the Mayor:
  - is absent (e.g. on holiday) for a period of time or in cases of urgency where the Chief Operating Officer is satisfied that the Mayor cannot be reasonably contacted;
  - (b) is incapacitated through illness; or
  - (c) has a person prejudicial interest in any matter requiring determination.
  - (iii) If the Mayor or the Deputy Mayor (Councillor Derek Mills) are unable to act on a matter requiring a decision then the Executive Director of Operations and Finance shall have the power to determine any matter requiring a decision.
- 4. No executive committees have been appointed at the present time.
- 5. No executive functions have been delegated to area committees, any other authority or any joint arrangements at the present time.
- 6. The Mayor has also (so far as lawful) delegated to officers the discharge of those functions that are referred to in Schedule 7 and are executive functions in the manner set out in that Schedule, in accordance with (and subject to) the Council's Standing Orders in relation to the Executive.
- 7. So far as the Constitution requires officers to consult with "the relevant member", the areas of responsibility of the Executive Leads are as set out paragraph 2 above.
