96% of RE taught by class teachers; some support from HLTAs.

Confidence in delivering the syllabus is moderate; training needs identified.

Humanism and diversity units well received.

Concerns raised about limited engagement from academies.

1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to update SACRE members on the progress of the Learn, Teach, Lead RE (LTLRE) hub network.
- 1.2 Hub leaders' training (2025/6): 16/10/25 (pm), 6/3/26 and 3/7/26.
- 1.3 The Torbay/South Devon LTLRE hub group continues to be successful, with termly meetings attracting a good number of teachers of RE. These meetings take place both in person and online, depending on the context and topic being covered.
- 1.4 The annual conference was held on 17th October 2025 at St Mellion, with a theme of Embracing Diversity and Inclusion through a Religion and Worldviews approach to RE.
- 1.5 This was a very successful day with 100 delegates attending: 72% strongly agreed and 22% agreed that the training met their expectations (5% were neutral).
- 1.6 LTLRE requests that Torbay SACRE continues to support the training of LTLRE hub leaders through the payment of £500 for the academic year 2025/6.
