4. Application for an Expedited Review of a Premise Licence under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 under Urgent Items

The Respondent and the Applicant Legal Representatives addressed the Chairman at the beginning of the meeting to request a delay to the start of the hearing to allow them an opportunity to discuss what actions the Respondent had taken since the serving of the s53A application and to allow the Police's Legal Representative to take further instructions in order to narrow the issues for consideration.

The Chairman agreed to allow a recess of thirty minutes.

The Chairman of the Licensing Sub-Committee reconvened the Meeting. The Legal Representative for the Respondent, asked to address the Committee on a preliminary matter concerning the application signed by Superintendent James Nye, and the correct criteria being applied in the serving of this type of application. The Applicant's Legal Representative proposed that this matter should not proceed, as the application was flawed due to an inaccuracy in the Applicant's Notes for guidance. He proposed that an ambiguity had arisen and that Members could not be satisfied without the presence of the Superintendent himself to confirm his mindset at the time of signing this application.

The Legal Representative for the Police, accepted that the Notes for Guidance were printed incorrectly but that it was no more than a clerical error and the test actually applied by the Superintendent was that of a more stringent one.

The Committee withdrew to deliberate this point before proceeding.

Decision:

Having carefully considered Representations by both parties, Members resolved that the Superintendents attendance was required before they can proceed to clarify the intention of the Application.

Additional Information:

The Applicant and the Respondent were asked to await the arrival of Superintendent Nye and hoped that they would afford the Committee reasonable time to wait as was afforded to them earlier before the start and advised that the Meeting would reconvene at 11.30 a.m.

The Chairman re-opened the Meeting at 11.30 a.m. with the Superintendent in attendance.

The Applicant's Legal Representative was asked to proceed in clarifying the preliminary matter raised by the Respondent. In doing so, the Superintendent was asked to clarify his mindset at the time of signing the application and had he applied the correct test. Clarification was given that the correct test had been applied by him in connection with Operation Ambassador and that the contents of the Notes for guidance was an oversight on his behalf but that it had not caused him to apply the wrong test.

The Respondent's Legal Representative questioned the Superintendent on the process in which the application had been signed and why the Notes for guidance detailed the wrong age. The Superintendent confirmed that this was an oversight but that he had applied the correct test in signing the application.

Brief summing up of this matter was made by both the Respondent and the Applicant's Legal Representatives.

The Committee subsequently with drew to deliberate on the Representative's submissions.

Decision:

Having heard further Representations and Submissions from the Superintendent, Members are satisfied that although an oversight of the submitted documents had occurred, the mindset the Superintendent when making the application, was that of an individual attaining the age of 21 years given the nature of the operation that has been undertaken by the Police in the last 6-8 weeks.

Members resolved that the Superintendent presented as a credible Witness and had no reason to disbelieve his intentions when signing the application.

In light of this the Members agreed unanimously this Application is valid.

The Meeting was reconvened.

Request to extend the time for Oral Representations:

The Chairman agreed to the request from the Applicant and the Respondent's Legal Advisors to allow 30 minutes for Oral Representations.

Respondent's response to Representation:

The Respondent's Legal Representative advised what interim steps had been taken to address the Representation from the Police. An Independent Report had been commissioned and was due to later this week which the Police were aware of. A new CCTV System was being installed and would be fully operational later today. Plastic glasses had been ordered and were expected to be in the Premises by this

evening. A cloak room was going to be available at weekends to address the number of theft incidents.

Additional information:

Members asked the Respondent to provide confirmation of the proposed interim steps undertaken.

With permission from the Chairman, a letter from the CCTV Company and an email chain about the delivery of glasses was circulated to Members.

The Respondent advised that the CCTV would be completed by 3pm today and the e-mails concerning the glasses stated that there should be 3 deliveries, two of which they were awaiting and confirmed that one delivery had already been received.

The Committee requested submissions from the Respondent regarding the calling of an ambulance and/or the Police and keeping accurate incident records.

Decision:

Following the Section 53A Summary Review application by the Police, Members have resolved that the Premises Licence be suspended with immediate effect until 25 June 2012, whereby a Review Hearing would have been heard on the 22 June 2012, as in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 provision.

Reason for Decision:

Having carefully considered all oral and written Representations, Members have serious concerns about the issues that have occurred at this Premise, as identified by the Police in their Application.

Members noted on the evidence before them that in their opinion three of the four Licensing Objectives have been undermined by the serious incidents reported in the Polices Application namely:

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder The Promotion of Public Safety The Protection of Children from Harm

and this had caused them grave concern.

Members further noted at the time of making this decision the proposed measures put forward by the Respondent did not go far enough to address the risk of further serious disorder and that steps already taken had not yet been fully implemented. As such, their concerns were not alleviated, given the serious nature of the incidents that have already occurred at this Premise.

In concluding, Members felt that the only interim step appropriate and proportionate to ensure that the Licensing Objectives are promoted, is for the Premise Licence to

be suspended with immediate effect until a decision of the Licensing Committee at a Full Review Hearing can be determined.

5. Licensing Act 2003 – An application for a Variation to a Premises Licence to Specify an Individual as the Premises Supervisor of Rhythm and Blues, 12-14 The Terrace, Torquay

The Committee were advised by the Senior Licensing Officer that the item had been withdrawn. This was due to the Police withdrawing their Representation as a new application specifying a different Designated Premises Supervisor had been accepted by the Licensing Department.

The application was introduced by the Licensing Officer who advised that there were no Representations from any Responsible Authority or any other interested party.

With permission from the Chairman, a document advising of permitted Alcohol Sale Times for supermarkets in Torbay was circulated to Members.

Applicant's response to Representations:

The Applicant's Solicitor advised the Licensing Sub-Committee that this new Asda Store would be operating on the same Licensing hours as nearby supermarkets and noted that there had been no Representations from Responsible Authorities or local residents to the application. The Representations received expressed concerns with no evidence given, highlighting problems that 'might happen.' Asda undertakes full and examined training of all staff with Challenge 25 as standard operation, not Challenge 21, with till prompts and regular test purchases being undertaken.

Decision:

Having carefully considered the written and oral representations, the Licensing Sub-Committee resolved to grant the Application for a Premise Licence in respect of Asda Supermarket, Borough Road, Paignton TQ4 7EP with the addition of the condition that the Challenge 25 Policy should apply in order to promote the Protection of Children from Harm.

Reason for Decision:

Representations that to grant this application would create problems of Crime and Disorder, Anti-Social Behaviour and Public Nuisance and expose Children to the Risk of Harm are not substantiated by evidence.

There are two supermarkets nearby which sell alcohol with similar licensing hours and no evidence has been presented to suggest they are undermining the Licensing Objectives by adding to the problems feared.

1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine a Review of a Premises Licence following an Expedited/Summary Review which was heard by the Licensing Sub-Committee on the 31st May 2012. The Premise is situated within the Cumulative Impact Area.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Crime and Disorder", "The Prevention of Public Nuisance", "Public Safety" and "The Prevention of Children from Harm".
- 1.4 The Authority must hold a hearing to consider the application and any relevant Representations.

The Authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant Representations, take such of the steps as detailed below, if any, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

The steps are –

- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
- (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- (c) to remove the Designated Premises Supervisor;
- (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- (e) to revoke the licence;

and for this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

If the licence is subject to sections 19, 20 and 21 (requirement to include certain conditions in Premises Licences) they remain.

Where the Authority takes a step to modify the conditions or exclude a licensable activity, it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for only such period (not exceeding three months) as it may specify.

1.6 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Responsible Authorities at the determination of the matter.

2. Introduction

2.1 Following an application by a Senior Member of Devon and Cornwall Constabulary under section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council must within 28 days of its receipt, Review that Licence in accordance with section 53C of the Act and reach a determination of that Review.

The following information is provided to assist Members in reaching a determination of that Review:

Decision of the Licensing Sub-Committee held on the 31st May 2012 is shown in Appendix 1.

A copy of the current Premises Licence is shown in Appendix 2.

The Police have submitted a Representation with further supporting information which relates to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Crime and Disorder", "Public Safety", "The Prevention of Public Nuisance" and "The Prevention of Children from Harm". The information provided includes the original documents submitted to the Licensing Sub-Committee on 31st May 2012. This is shown in Appendix 3 and 4.

2.2 Torbay Council as the Licensing Authority has received Representations during the consultation period from Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties and is satisfied that the Representations have been received within the appropriate time scale, have not been subsequently withdrawn and are not vexatious, frivolous.

Public Protection have made a Representation relating to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Public Nuisance" and "Public Safety". This is shown as Appendix 5.

Torbay Safeguarding Children Board have made a Representation relating tho the Licensing Objective "The Protection of Children from Harm". This is shown as Appendix 6.

The Licensing Authority has received 2 Representations from Interested Parties in relation to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Crime and Disorder" and "The Prevention of Public Nuisance". These are shown as Appendix 7.

There have been no Representations from any other Responsible Authority or any other Interested Party.

The Respondent has submitted information in response to the Review following the Expedited/Summary Review Hearing. This information is shown as Appendix 8

and 9.

- 2.3 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representations and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.4 Once the matter is determined, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 8(2) of Schedule 5 to :-
 - (a) the Applicant for the Review,
 - (b) the holder of the Premises Licence, or
 - (c) any other person who made relevant Representations in relation to the application.

In the event that an Appeal is entered, the determination will not have affect until the Appeal is either determined or withdrawn.

- 2.5 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' court may:-
 - (a) dismiss the Appeal,
 - (b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or
 - (c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court,
 - and may make such an order as to costs as it thinks fit.

MANDATORY CONDITION: WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-1)
 - at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (a)
 - at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal (b) licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal 2) licence.
- 3) (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on
 - the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (i)
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies 6) to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 7). The responsible person shall ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (ii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

MANDATORY CONDITION: DOOR SUPERVISION

- Where one or more individuals are carrying out security activities, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- But nothing in the aforementioned conditions requires such a condition to be imposed in respect of a) and b) and (b)(i) and (b)(ii)
 - in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), are exempt.
 - (b) In respect of premises in relation to-
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- 3) For the purposes of the aforementioned conditions:-
 - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

MANDATORY CONDITION: EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

ANNEXE 2

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

Additional Conditions Transferred from the Licence

Full CCTV system to operate on both floors and the outside terrace area, such CCTV system to be maintained and
used at all times the premises are open to the public and to include full recording facilities and a monitor behind both
bar serveries on the ground and first floor for viewing by staff. All recordings to be kept for a minimum of 14 days and
the police shall have access to recordings at any reasonable time.

Additional Conditions Transferred from Public Entertainment Licence

- On every day when the premises are open, the following conditions will apply:
 - a. The volume of all amplified music shall be at a level to be set and agreed to the satisfaction of the council. The settings shall be secured in a locked area and capable of amendment only by the manager or licensees following appropriate application to and consultation with the council.
 - b. All windows and doors shall be kept closed from 11pm each night. Entry to and exit from the premises shall be by way of the Strand entrance only. This condition will be in force in all circumstances except when an emergency evacuation of the premises is necessary.

General

- 1. There shall be no entry/re-entry to the premises after 2am.
- 2. A full range of non-alcoholic drinks shall always be available.
- 3. In respect of the first floor balcony, the consumption of alcohol in the designated red zone shall be by persons sat at tables only and in the designated green zone shall be by persons standing.
- The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 shall be adhered to at all times.
- 5. When standing is permitted on the First Floor Balcony, an SIA steward must be in attendance on the balcony for the purpose of supervising public safety and preventing crime and disorder.
- 6. Consumption of alcohol on the ground floor terrace shall be by persons seated only and no alcohol shall be served in glass bottles within those areas from which it is intended or likely that a person shall drink.
- 7. Entry to and exit from third floor must be by way of access from second floor only.
- 8. In respect of third floor Terrace, consumption of alcohol shall be by persons sat at tables only in the red zone and standing shall be permitted on green zone.
- 9. Access to the first floor balcony and third floor Terrace between the hours of 02.00 and 03.00 shall be as a designated smoking area with an SIA steward in attendance. No drinks shall be permitted.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. 'Chill out' music shall be played in the last hour of operation.
- 2. The premises must be a member of Night Net Radio system.
- 3. The premises shall join and maintain membership of the Torquay Night Time Economy Forum where premises management shall attend at least two meetings per calendar year.

- On every operational day when door supervision is required then those SIA door supervisors employed in front of house duties shall wear high visibility reflective clothing (jackets/T-shirts) for the entirety of their duty.
- 5. All drinks must be served in shatterproof glasses and no alcohol shall be served in glass bottles after 11.00pm from which it is intended or likely that a person shall drink.

Public Safety

- Staff must be trained in first aid.
- 2. On any Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday night the premises remain open for the sale of alcohol after midnight and then closes after 0030hrs, SIA door supervisors shall be employed on the premises from 22.00hrs until close, at a ratio of 1 supervisor per 100 customers. (This condition shall also apply on Christmas Eve and New Years Eve when they do not fall on a Thursday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday.) On all other occasions, the premises licence holder shall risk assess the requirement for door supervisors and employ such door supervisors, if at all, in such numbers and at such times determined by that risk assessment.
- 3. A safe capacity of the whole premises and each floor of the premises shall be maintained at all times. Such capacities to be agreed with the Fire Authority.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- Customers must be encouraged to depart quietly.
- Windows must be kept closed after 23.00.
- Entry and exit from the premises must be by way of the Strand entrance only.

The Protection of Children from Harm

- Unaccompanied children must not be permitted on the premises.
- 2. Accompanied children shall only be permitted on the premises for the consumption of substantial food.
- 3. Regular ID checks shall be carried out and only current photo card driving licence and passports shall be accepted as ID.
- No under 18's shall be permitted after 2100 hours.

ANNEXE 3

CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

General

 Access to and use of the 3rd Floor balcony after 1am and until 2am shall be as a designated smoking area only for no more than 20 persons with an SIA Door Steward in attendance, and no drinks shall be permitted in this area after 1am.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- Noise from the premises shall not be audible within any dwelling with windows open for normal ventilation especially
 after 11pm. This shall be assessed from the boundary to the nearest residential properties, on all sides of the licensed
 premises. The criteria that shall be applied are;
 - (i) Before 11pm Noise emanating from the premises shall not be clearly distinguishable above other noise.

- (ii) After 11pm Noise emanating from the premises shall not be distinguishable above background levels of noise.
- (iii) The local authority shall reserve the right in cases of tonal noise and where premises are attached to others, to make further assessments from within the residential property.
- 2. Doors and windows shall be kept shut during entertainment to reduce noise breakout. A management scheme shall be in place to ensure this situation remains.
- Entrances shall be provided with lobbies with automatic door-closers. The lobbies shall be in use throughout the time
 of entertainment.
- 4. A senior member of staff (manager) shall assess the impact of any noisy activities on neighbouring residential premises at the start of the activity/entertainment and periodically throughout the activity/entertainment to ensure levels of noise have not increased.
- 5. Provision of mechanical ventilation and air conditioning system shall not allow noise breakout from the premises or cause a nuisance by its operation.
- 6. Regular maintenance shall be carried out on all plant and machinery to ensure that noise disturbance from such sources is kept to a minimum.
- 7. Regulated entertainment upon the terrace shall cease by 19.00 hrs.

The Protection of Children from Harm

- All amusement with prizes machines must be sited to ensure they are under direct supervision of the staff at all times.
- A management system shall be introduced to ensure that staff are aware of the legal requirements relating to underage sales and the prevention from use of AWP machines by those under eighteen.

Mr Michael JOHNSTON, Designated Premises Supervisor of Mambo/The Beach Hut

Mr Aaron MOORE, Owner of Forefront Security (who supply door stewards to Mambo/The Beach Hut), and myself.

At this meeting the representatives from Mambo/The Beach Hut were informed that the police were concerned regarding the high number of crimes linked to Mambo/The Beach Hut and that we wished to see a reduction in crimes and incidents at their premises over the forthcoming three month period, or further action would be considered.

At the meeting various discussions took place concerning crime reduction methods, drinks promotions, door stewards and I also suggested that the premises consider changing the layout of the first floor bar area, by removing the 'U' shaped bar and replacing with a suitable alternative and levelling out an area of the floor, together with removal of a banister, in order to assist in customer flow and supervision. At that time, Nathan TOWERSEY informed me that plans were already in progress to level out the floor area and remove the banister, but Julie EYRE stated that she did not wish to remove the 'U' shaped bar as this would alter the dynamics of the premises.

At the conclusion of this meeting, it was decided to monitor Mambo/The Beach Hut for a period of 3 months and compare the number of incidents and crimes with the same period the previous year to see if there had been any reduction and to hold a further meeting to again discuss the matter in March 2012. The notes and other documentation concerning this meeting are included within the Police Representation.

As a result of this meeting, on 24 January 2012 Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd submitted an application for a Minor Variation to level the floor area and remove the banister and this work has been completed. However, the 'U' shaped bar is still in situ.

Furthermore, on 21 February 2012 Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd submitted an application to Vary the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) in respect of Mambo/The Beach Hut, into the name of Mr Nathan TOWERSEY, the Area Manager, in a bid to improve management within the premises. Following discussions with Nathan TOWERSEY at this time, he also informed me that a new head doorman had been appointed, in an effort to improve door stewarding at the premises. In March 2012, Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd applied for a Premises Licence in respect of a premises

In March 2012, Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd applied for a Premises Licence in respect of a premises in Torquay known as Trents. The police objected to this application on the grounds that they did not feel the premises would be able to meet the Licensing Objective 'The Prevention of Crime and Disorder' and provided evidence at the hearing held on 15 March 2012 in relation to the problems being experienced at Mambo/The Beach Hut. However, the Licensing Committee were not satisfied with the police evidence and granted the Premises Licence in respect of Trents, also applying an additional condition on the licence that Nathan TOWERSEY had to be the DPS.

Following this decision, I had several telephone conversations with both Julie EYRE and Nathan TOWERSEY concerning the issue of Nathan being the DPS at two licensed premises within the CIA. I informed them that I was not happy with the situation, and expressed concerns regarding his ability to adequately manage Mambo/The Beach Hut, with which the police already had concerns, and a new late night premises. Both Julie EYRE and Nathan TOWERSEY shared my concerns and Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd subsequently decided not to pursue their business venture at Trents and surrendered the Premises Licence on 1 May 2012.

On 15 March 2012, the same day as the hearing in respect of Trents, Superintendent James NYE launched the start of Operation Ambassador within Torquay and the Herald Express printed an article outlining the aims of the operation, this being a high profile operation to run throughout the summer focussing on issues including underage drinking, disorder, overcrowding, serving drinks to people who are already intoxicated and any other licensing breaches, with particular emphasis being given to premises around the Torquay Harbourside area. A copy of the Herald Express article has been printed from their website and is included within the Police Representation.

In late March/early April 2012 there was a change of roles and responsibilities within the management structure at Torquay Police Station. Due to this, coupled with the steps taken by Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd, the decision of the Licensing Committee in respect of the Trents application, and the commencement of Operation Ambassador, a decision was made by myself in consultation with Inspector Dai ANTILL, to not hold the further meeting with Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd, but to

continue to monitor the premises under the auspices of Operation Ambassador and work with the premises in an effort to reduce crimes/disorder/incidents.

When Police Officers deal with incidents at, or have any information regarding the conduct of a licensed premise, a Form L10 Licensed Premises Report is completed and forwarded to myself for any action deemed necessary. I will now provide details of a few of the Forms L10 in my possession and the action I have taken in respect of the issues raised:

During the course of Operation Ambassador I have received several Form L10's relating to loud noise witnessed by police officers emanating from the premises. The details of these Form L10's have been passed to Mr Gareth FUDGE, Environmental Protection Officer for Torbay Council.

On Sunday 29 January 2012 at approximately 0220 hours four persons were arrested for affray (FT/12/2137 refers) in The Strand, outside of Mambo's, which occurred after a group of drunk persons had just left the premises. Three of these persons are due to appear at Torbay Magistrates Court on 9 August 2012 for trial. No action is being taken in respect of the fourth individual. On 28 February 2012 I discussed the details of this incident with Nathan TOWERSEY and warned him to ensure that persons are not served alcohol when drunk. (L10 of PC BIRCH 27&28/01/12 refers).

On 28 March 2012 at approximately 2315 hours, police were called to an incident at Mambo/The Beach Hut following a report of assault within the club (FT/12/2294, L10 of PC MORGAN 03/04/12 and statement of PC Paul NEWTON refer). The offender was detained by police and established to be 17 years old. On 2 April 2012 I discussed this incident with Acting Detective Inspector Chris YARWOOD, who is responsible for overseeing Operation Ambassador. At this time he stated that the offender had indicated to officers that he was not asked for identification when entering the premises or when purchasing alcohol.

Between 0040 and 0135 hours on Saturday 31 March 2012 officers deployed on Operation Ambassador visited Mambo/The Beach Hut and reported their findings by way of a Form L10 (L10 of PC JONES 31/03/12 and statement of PC Nigel JONES refer). They witnessed persons being ejected in a peaceful manner, ID checks being conducted, and heard a barmaid discouraging a customer from purchasing a double short – all positive comments. However, they also indicated that no counting of customers could be seen and no searches were witnessed. Furthermore, they witnessed a 22 year old male climbed over the railing of the first floor terrace and drop approximately 3 metres down a streetlamp on to the pavement below. The male was spoken to and admitted he had climbed across from the Mambo balcony to the Hoopers one and claimed he had done it for a laugh. He was limping as a result of his

drop/fall but refused medical assistance.

At approximately 0220 hours on 31 March 2012 a female reported that she had been assaulted within Mambo/The Beach Hut (FT/12/2378 refer, L10 of PC CHALKER 31/03/12 and statement of PC CHALKER refer). The victim could not remember the full details, apart from the fact that she had been assaulted, she was unsure whether or not doorstaff intervened and was very vague due to her level of intoxication. CCTV was not clear and did not show the offence. One independent witness came foward at the time of police attendance, but he was too intoxicated to provide a statement.

On 1 April 2012 at approximately 0100 hours two males were ejected from Mambo/The Beach Hut by doorstaff due to their behaviour inside the club. The males were threatening and aggressive to doorstaff and were subsequently arrested for being Drunk and Disorderly (FT/12/2385 and FT/12/2386 refer, together with L10's of PC CHALKER 01/04/12 and PC FREEBORN 01/04/12 and statements of PC CHALKER and PC FREEBORN). Both males were issued with Fixed Penalty Notices.

At 1400 hours on 3 April 2012 I arranged a meeting at Mambo with Nathan TOWERSEY and Julie EYRE to discuss several Forms L10 in my possession. On my attendance Julie EYRE was not present and I was surprised by this and made reference to this fact on several of my work control sheets. I discussed the incident concerning the 17 year old male with Nathan TOWERSEY and pointed out to him that there is a condition on the Premises Licence which states that no persons under the age of 18 years old should be in the premises after 2100 hours and warned him of the seriousness of the sale of alcohol to underage persons and that persistent sales can result in the Review and revocation of a Premises Licence. I also discussed with Nathan TOWERSEY the incident where the male climbed over the balcony and door stewarding matters. He assured me that counting of customers is undertaken by the door stewards and that searches do take place. Nathan TOWERSEY was not aware of the incident involving the male who climbed over the balcony but I read out the condition on the Premises Licence which states a door steward must be present on the first floor balcony and supervise the safety of persons. I asked whether a door steward was on the balcony and he said that there would have been. I asked why the door steward did not intervene, and he stated that it is possible that he didn't see the male climb over if it happened quickly. I stressed the importance of ensuring the condition regarding the supervision of the balcony is complied with.

I also discussed the incidents concering the drunk female alleging assault and the two males who were arrested for being drunk and disorderly with Nathan TOWERSEY and warned him re the sale of alcohol to persons who are drunk, and the consequences of allowing drunk persons into the premises.

During our discussions I also pointed out to Nathan TOWERSEY several positive comments that had been made by officers during their visits to the premises.

Follwing my visit to Mambo/The Beach Hut where I gave advice and verbal warnings re various matters to Nathan TOWERSEY, I discussed this further with Acting Detective Inspector YARWOOD, and as a result of those discussions, I sent letters (dated 4 April 2012) on behalf of Superintendent NYE to both the Premises Licence Holders and the DPS warning them regarding these matters and advising them that further action will be considered should further offences/licensing breaches come to light.

On 14 April 2012 between 0040 and 0115 hours officers deployed on Operation Ambassador attended Mambo/The Beach Hut and witnessed a male who clearly intoxicated (slurring his speech and unsteady of his feet) trying to enter Mambo. The door steward refused entry to this male and told him he was drunk. After arguing his case for a couple of minutes the male left the area but returned a couple of minutes later, eating a slice of pizza. Once he had finished this, he tried to enter Mambo/The Beach Hut and was allowed entry by the same door steward.

Whilst these officers were stood outside the premises they observed persons leaving the premises, several of whom were clearly very intoxicated. One male was witnessed constantly swearing at the door supervisor, saying "he was going to fucking kill" the door steward, who was stood several metres away and seemed to take no notice. This male was eventually calmed down by friends. On 24 May 2012 I discussed this matter with Nathan TOWERSEY, and warned him again re the sale of alcohol to persons who are drunk and allowing drunk persons in the premises. I also advised him that stewards need to take action when customers are outside swearing in the street by dealing with the individual calmly to diffuse the situation or call the police to have them moved on. This issue was also raised in the letter from Superintendent NYE dated 4 April 2012.

Towards the end of April 2012 I was contacted by Mr Neil STANLAKE, a former Police Licensing Officer and colleague of mine, who told me that he had been approached by Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd to carry out an independent review of their working practices to identify any issues and rectify them in order to alleviate the police concerns. I informed Neil that I was happy to work with him as far as possible, bearing in mind that he was no longer an employee of the Devon and Cornwall Constabulary, in an effort to resolve the issues at Mambo/The Beach Hut. Since that time I have had several conversations with Neil and we have discussed various matters, including drunkenness, underage and overcrowding.

On Friday 27 April 2012 I conducted a visit to the premises, in the company of Ms Mandy GUY, Senior

Licensing Officer for Torbay Council, at approximately 2325 hours. This was the first night of the Young Farmers weekend. On entry to the premises we went to the first floor area which was extremely busy and we had to push our way through the crowd to make our way out onto the first floor balcony. At this location a door steward was in attendance. Following discussions with the door steward it was apparent that he did not know the capacity for the balcony area and was not in possession of a clicker or other counting device and I asked him to do a head count. Following discussions with the Duty Manager he was then provided with a clicker. Ms GUY and myself then went to the second floor of the premises, which was busy but not overcrowded. A door steward was not visible in this area. We then carried out a quick visit to the third floor terrace, which was very quiet and persons were outside using the terrace area. On returning to the second floor, we met with Nathan TOWERSEY and a door steward. I asked the door steward how many persons were present on that floor and he stated 90. I asked how he knew and he told me that he keeps count in his head. Ms GUY and myself then discussed this matter with Nathan TOWERSEY. (L10 of Julie SMART 27/04/12 refers)

On Tuesday 1 May 2012 I met with Nathan TOWERSEY and discussed these matters with him. I warned him to ensure door stewards are aware of the capacity limits, in possession of and use clickers, and are aware of the conditions on the licence before they commence duty. I also raised concerns regarding how door stewards monitor and react to incidents on the first floor and recommended that glass collectors be more identifiable. I again raised the issue of the 'U' shaped bar and told him that it is my view that the layout of the first floor is creating a pinch-point for customers using that area and this is leading to conflict between customers and increasing the potential for crime and disorder. Nathan TOWERSEY acknowledged my concerns and he drew a diagram of the bar and explained that customers congregate on one side of the bar and do not move around to the other side. Nathan TOWERSEY said he would ask stewards to move customers around to the other side when necessary. Nathan TOWERSEY noted my comments and advised me that he would raise these issues with Julie EYRE.

During this meeting I also discussed CCTV issues with Nathan TOWERSEY. He informed me that he was aware that CCTV was not satisfactory as the premises had 3 separate systems and he stated that Lifestyle Enterprises(UK) Ltd were endeavouring to resolve this matter.

Due to the police concerns regarding overcrowding of this premises, at approximately 0900 hrs on Wednesday 16 May 2012 I hand delivered a letter dated 15 May 2012 to Mr Chris TWINE, a Fire Safety Officer, at Torquay Fire Station, and discussed with him the police concerns. A copy of the letter

is included within the Police Representation.

At approximately 0200 hours on Thursday 3 May 2012 a glassing incident occurred within Mambo and I was made aware of this incident during a telephone conversation with ADI YARWOOD, who informed me that a Form L10 would be submitted in due course (L10 of PC LAING 03/05/12 refers). During the morning of that day I received a telephone call from Julie EYRE regarding this incident. She told me that she was concerned as the CCTV hard drive was going to be replaced the following morning and there was a possibility that information contained on the drive could be deleted. Following receipt of this information I requested my colleague, Mr Peter COSBY, to attend the premises the following morning, together with a CID officer, in order to obtain CCTV footage. I was unable to attend myself as I am employed on a part time basis and do not work on a Friday. Throughout the early evening of Thursday 3 May 2012 and the following morning, Friday 4 May 2012, I had several telephone discussions with both Julie EYRE and Pete COSBY and was informed that due to technical issues with the hard drive, it had been seized by the police to secure any evidence. During our discussions Julie EYRE expressed concerns to me regarding the police seizure of her hard drive and a comment made by a police officer that the premises were not using toughened/strengthened glasses as per the condition on the Premises Licence, but I did receive a text from Julie EYRE later that day (Friday 4 May 2012) indicating that this issue had been resolved and she was feeling happier.

On 5 May 2012 Operation Ambassador officers witnessed two extremely drunk females enter Mambo/The Beach Hut without being stopped by door stewards, these females also appeared to be under the age of 21. (L10 of PC FREEBORN 05/05/12 together with his statement refer). They also witnessed overcrowding of the first floor area, the dancefloor merged with normal customers and they saw a few minor exchanges between customers due to drink spillages. (L10 of PC STOCK 05/05/12 together with his statement refer). I discussed this matter with Nathan TOWERSEY on 24 May 2012. During the week commencing Monday 14 May 2012, I cannot which remember exactly which day, I was informed by ADI YARWOOD that another glassing incident had occurred at Mambo/The Beach Hut during the early hours of Thursday 10 May 2012, and he expressed to me serious concerns regarding the way the premises had dealt with this matter, including the facts that the police had not been informed, the aggrieved had been cleaned up and sent home without medical assistance and the CCTV had not been operating at the time of the incident (L10 of ADI YARWOOD 10/05/12, and various other documents refer).

During our conversations ADI YARWOOD asked me not to discuss this matter with any person from

Mambo/The Beach Hut or Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd due to the on-going police enquiries. I can state that to date, despite having spoken to Nathan TOWERSEY on at least one occasion, he has not mentioned anything to do with this incident with me and I find this extremely surprising, bearing in mind that on 24 May 2012 we discussed various other matters and at that time CID officers had already established that the CCTV was not operating at the time of the glassing incident.

Since the 8 April 2012 Superintendent NYE has received several letters from Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd and he has passed these to me for any action deemed appropriate. As a result of one of these letters I arranged for the Police Crime Reduction Officer, Miss Nicola DUKES, to visit the premises and offer advice regarding thefts and CCTV. Following her visit on 17 May 2012 she emailed me concerning her findings, and a copy of the email is included within the Police Representation.

Since 8 December 2011, when Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd attended Torquay Police Station to discuss the number of crimes and incidents linked to Mambo/The Beach Hut, I have kept a log of all crimes and incidents occurring within Mambo/The Beach Hut. A copy of the document is contained within the Police Representation.

Although Nathan TOWERSEY and Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd have taken steps to reduce crime and disorder at the premises, the police have had concerns since December 2011 and I feel that any progress made has been extremely slow. Despite several verbal warnings regarding allowing drunks into the premises, the sale of alcohol to persons who are drunk, the sale of alcohol to underage persons, overcrowding of the premises and breach of conditions on the Premises Licence, together with a written warning on 4 April 2012, police officers have witnessed further incidents of this nature.

MEETING AT TORQUAY POLICE STATION RE MAMBO 8 DECEMBER 2011 AT 1500 HRS

Inspector LEISK outlined the reason why the above named had been requested to attend the meeting, due to the large number of crimes linked to the premises since April 2011. He said that an undercover police operation had taken place in early 2011 which had gone some way to alleviate the concerns of the police, but since that time crime levels had remained high. He also stated that in relation to licensed premises, Mambo had more crimes linked to them than any other licensed premises in the whole Devon and Cornwall Force area. He stated that due to financial cut backs, the police are not in a position to tolerate this number of crimes, and more responsibility by the premises to reduce this number is required. It was also pointed out that the police receive statistical data from Torbay Hospital concerning A & E attendances, and Mambo is frequently mentioned within this data.

Sgt BELL then gave an overview of the number and type of crimes that the police had been investigating. There are 10 allegations of assault/heavy-handed ejections by door stewards, 20 assaults (customer on customer) and 23 thefts, mainly of handbags or mobile phones.

It was acknowledged that Mambo is a very busy premises, which is open until the early hours every night of the week and therefore the police would expect a higher number of incidents than other premises. The layout of the premises was discussed and suggestions put forward to improve customer flow/supervision. Nathan indicated that the premises are hoping to level out the floor area and remove a banister on the first floor, sometime at the beginning of 2012.

Lengthy discussions followed re crime prevention/reduction matters and drink promotions. Mandy GUY raised concerns re noise issues and information she had received regarding staff receiving bonuses or pay cuts based on volume of sales – this was denied by Julie EYRE.

Julie SMART will provide Julie EYRE with a breakdown of all crimes in due course, particularly in relation to the allegations against doorstaff, in order that she can liaise with Aaron MOORE concerning this. Aaron indicated that he will not tolerate the misuse of force by door stewards and will take any action necessary.

Inspector LEISK said that he wished to review the situation with Mambo in 3 months, when he will compare the number of crimes (December 2011 to March 2012) to that covering the same period last year (December 2010 to March 2011).

Inspector LEISK concluded the meeting by stating that this was an opportunity for Mambo to examine their operation and assist the police in improving the situation. Julie EYRE indicated that she is concerned that her premises are causing concern for the police and that she and her staff will endeavour to improve the situation.

POLICE have launched a major operation to keep Torbay safe after dark.

The high-profile Operation Ambassador aims to keep Torquay's prestigious Purple Flag status during the busy Jubilee and Olympic summer rush.





And police warn that pubs and clubs might lose their licences if they fail to keep high standards.

The head of the Bay's police Supt Jim Nye (pictured) said the operation will range across all three towns, but Torquay's night time economy around the harbourside

Supt Nye said: "Operation Ambassador will run right through the summer to build on the success of the Purple Flag award.

"I don't think people know that Torquay is the only town in Devon and Cornwall to have been awarded a Purple Flag, and one of only a handful of places in the South

"The Purple Flag is independently assessed and it is a good reflection of the work that has gone on to make this a safe place.

"We should be patting ourselves on the back as a community. Many people aren't really aware how important this Purple Flag is and it's a missed opportunity,"

He said the operation was important because of Torbay's high profile during Olympic year.

"The year 2012 will be an extremely busy year," Supt Nye said.

"Apart from the normal influx of summer visitors, we will have the Queen's Golden Jubilee and the Olympic Torch relay which will bring international media into the

"There's a lot going on and when the three Torbay towns are full of people we want to keep our reputation for Torbay as a great night out and a popular tourist destination.

"The police have good relationships with the council, the fire service and the licensees and together this operation will look at issues including underage drinking, disorder, overcrowding, serving drinks to people who are already intoxicated - or any other licensing breach.

"it's not Big Brother. It's about ensuring we have a safe night time economy as already recognised that benefits Torbay.

"This is not picking on the licensing trade because the majority do a great job and generally there is a good atmosphere that's why we have won the Purple Flag.

"The licensees play their part by making sure that they do not serve those people who are underage or already intoxicated.

"But I will be taking this opportunity to review the licences of any premises that falls short of the standards.

"This will be a high-visibility operation involving neighbourhood police officers, the response units and CID, as well as the licensing officers,

"If we come across any premises which do not meet those standards, licences will be revoked. I've only been in Torbay for two years, but I understand that at one time it used to be like the wild west down there sometimes.

The male waits in the bar with a doorman until the manager arrives and then seems to lunge towards the manager resulting in the doorman taking him to the floor where he is restrained after a short struggle. No evidence of excessive use of force is shown on the CCTV. Crime finalised as undetected with no further action being taken against any door staff. My concern in this case was the use of the closed bar on the ground floor that is badly lit and only partially covered by CCTV being used as an area to detain people. I write to you in your capacity as Designated Premises Supervisor, of the above named premises, following incidents at your premises between 28th March 2012 and 1st April 2012, as outlined below.

At approximately 2315 hours on Wednesday 28 March 2012 an assault occurred within Mambo's. The suspect was arrested and identified as a 17 year old male. This male has indicated to the police that he was not asked for ID when entering or purchasing alcohol within your premises.

On Saturday 31 March 2012 a plain clothed police officer witnessed a 22 year old male climb over the railing from the first floor terrace area of Mambo, onto the roof of Hoopers, and then drop/fall to the pavement below. The male was spoken to and stated he had done it for a 'laugh'. The male was limping as a result of his drop/fall, but refused medical assistance.

Again on Saturday 31 March 2012, a female complained to the police of being assaulted in your premises, however she could not recount the full details of the assault due to her level of intoxication. At this time a witness came forward to assist with enquiries, but he was too intoxicated to provide a statement.

On Sunday 1 April 2012, a group of males were ejected from your premises due to their behaviour inside. One of these males was verbally aggressive, swearing in the street and inciting violence towards the police officers and was subsequently arrested for being drunk and disorderly. A second male threatened and was aggressive to door staff, and he too was arrested for being drunk and disorderly. Although these males were arrested in the street immediately outside of Mambo, licensed premises are responsible for the immediate vicinity of the premises and have a duty to ensure that their patrons leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

At 1400 hours on Tuesday 3 April 2012 my Licensing Officer, Mrs Julie Smart, attended your premises and discussed these matters with you. At this time you accepted that the female customer who alleged she had been assaulted was drunk and had been served alcohol within



your premises. You also indicated that the member of staff who had served her, has been disciplined/dismissed due to this incident.

I would remind you of certain conditions contained in your Premises Licence (No PL0652), issued by Torbay Council, as follows:

- 1. When standing is permitted on the First Floor Balcony, an SIA steward must be in attendance on the balcony for the purpose of supervising public safety and preventing crime and disorder.
- 2. No under 18's shall be permitted after 2100 hrs.

I must warn you that failure to comply with the conditions of the Premises Licence constitutes an offence under Section 136(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 as follows:

- 1) A person commits an offence if
 - a. He carries on or attempts to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation, or
 - b. He knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on.

Subsection 4 of Section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, also states:

"A person guilty of an offence under this section is liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding £20,000, or to both."

I would further point out to you that the sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk, or allowing alcohol to be sold to such a person, is an offence under Section 141 of the Licensing Act 2003, and a person guilty of such an offence is liable to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale, ie £1000.

The incident involving the 17 year old is still being investigated by my officers, but I would take this opportunity to remind you that the sale of alcohol to children and allowing the sale of alcohol to children are offences under Sections 146 and 147 of the Licensing Act 2003, punishable by way of a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale, ie £5000.

With regards to the male climbing over the railing on the 1st floor, I would ask that you immediately investigate this incident and, if necessary, put satisfactory measures into place to ensure this does not occur again. It is imperative that a door steward is in attendance on the balcony as stipulated in the relevant condition, and that he/she fully understands his/her responsibilities in regard to ensuring the personal safety of your patrons and persons using the public highway.

As Designated Premises Supervisor I would remind you that it is your responsibility to ensure that your premises are run in accordance with the conditions of your Premises Licence, in a manner that promotes the Licensing Objectives and within the confines of the law at all times.

I must advise you that my officers will continue to monitor your premises and if the circumstances warrant it, I will not hesitate in applying for a Review of your Premises Licence

and/or seeking a prosecution for any offences committed. I do hope that you will address the concerns raised and that this course of action will not be necessary. However, should it be necessary to apply for a Review, this letter will be used as part of our evidence.

A copy of this letter has been sent the Premises Licence Holders, Lifestyle Enterprises (UK) Ltd, and to the Torbay Council Licensing Department for their information.

Thank you for your letter dated the 4th of April 2012. I am writing to respond to the concerns over the incidents mentioned in your letter and also to assist the police in any way possible.

I refer to the incident on Wednesday the 28th of March where a young man assaulted another customer inside our premises. I was made aware by Julie Smart in the meeting held on Tuesday the 3rd of April that the young man was only 17 years old. I mentioned at the time that I was confident the male would have been asked for ID and Mrs Smart said that he was found in possession of his brothers ID, (which I assume was a driving license or passport).

I have since held an investigation in to this matter and I have found out that the male was asked for ID by my Head Door Supervisor. I would be able to provide statements and CCTV in evidence of this fraudulent use of identification if it would help any possible prosecution. I have also held a meeting with my Head Door Supervisor and asked him to be extra vigilant when verifying any identification and asked him to make sure the security staff do the same.

I also held a staff meeting on Thursday the 5th of April which every member of staff who is authorised to sell alcohol attended. In this meeting I held a training session which included the 'Challenge 25' policy we operate, the valid forms of ID we accept and the possible fraudulent use of ID.

In respect of the incident on the 31st of March where a plain closed police officer witnessed a 22 year old male climb over the railings of the 1st floor balcony and drop on the pavement below. I have investigated this incident and no member of my security team or management team were aware of this incident at the time. I can confirm an SIA steward was in attendance on the balcony at the time of the alleged incident (as proven by CCTV) but it is unclear on the CCTV exactly when and where this incident took place.

I was told by Mrs Smart that it took place between 00.30 and 01.30 but our CCTV does not show any such incident. I would be grateful if the plain clothes officer would be able to give a more specific time and a brief description of the male to help my investigation. At the meeting with the head of my security team I asked that the member of the security staff who is situated on the balcony be aware of this incident and make sure it does not happen again. I asked that he should be given more assistance from the rest of the team when the balcony is busy and I have also employed an extra member of staff to help co-ordinate the customers on the balcony. I would be grateful if you could give me the name of the male so I can bar him from all Lifestyle premises in the bay, (I assume the plain clothes officer took a note of his name seeing as he knew his age.)

In respect of the incident on the 31st of March where a female complained to police of being assaulted. In the meeting with Julie Smart on the 3rd of April I mentioned that I was aware of this incident and had noticed that the lady involved had been drinking alcohol. I do not recall saying she was drunk although I did say she was served several drinks by her daughter who was working on the bar. I have since terminated her daughter's employment with the company for poor time keeping and the possibility that her judgement on whether she should have served her mother more alcohol may have been clouded due to the family tie.

Although I admit the lady had been drinking alcohol my staff said she did not seem overly intoxicated. At the time of the incident she recounted the full details to my security staff including the time of the incident, the location, how it materialised, how she sustained her injuries and the other people involved (who we detained on site until the police arrived).

The lady then came back at closing time, extremely irate and proceeded to explain the incident again to my assistant manager who told her the police were dealing with the situation now. We still have most of the details given to us by the lady in incident reports which my security team filled out, and the CCTV which was offered to the attending officer but not required at the time.

In respect of the incident on Sunday the 1st of April where two males were ejected from our premises. I noticed the two males enter the building and shortly after they walked past me with a drink each. Shortly after that, I saw members of my security team conducting a resisted ejection of the males from our premises. I was told that the two males had been spotted by security staff regularly going to the toilets together. The security staff thought this was strange as the males had only been in the building for a short time. The security staff also noticed the two males showing signs of being on drugs, so they were asked to be searched. The males refused to be searched and were asked to leave. They refused to leave and became physically aggressive and had to be physically removed by the security staff. Outside the males were still extremely aggressive at which point the police officers who were walking past and intervened.

One male was restrained and arrested, as he was restrained I told the arresting officers that we had asked him to leave because we suspected him of doing drugs inside our venue. The second male was still outside and aggressive, he was complaining that he had lost his shoe inside the building when being ejected by the door staff. To try and ensure this male left the vicinity of the premises in an orderly fashion I went in to the building to find his shoe. When I returned he was speaking to a police officer about his shoe, I then gave him his shoe at which point he calmed down slightly, thanked me and went to shake my hand.

At the meeting with Mrs Smart I addressed the issue that these males were not asked to leave because of bad behaviour or drunkenness but that it was due to suspicion of the males taking drugs inside the premises. Mrs Smart then said she would look in to back ground checks on the males. I have since investigated the incident and have found out that the two males did not seem intoxicated when entering the venue and that they only seemed to have purchased one drink each whilst being inside the premises a short time. I do not deny their 'disorderly' behaviour but I reiterate that they were asked to leave on suspicion of drug use. These two males are now barred for life from all of our premises as are the other people involved in the other incidents.

In dealing with these concerns I have held a meeting addressing these issues with the head of my security team and the owner of the security firm. This was on the 4th of April 2012. I also held a staff meeting on the 5th of April which involved all members of staff authorised to sell alcohol. This meeting involved staff training on responsible alcohol retailing and licensing laws. I have also recently employed another personal license holder, taking the total number of personal license holders employed at Cafe Mambo to six.

On a separate note, and in confidence at this point, I would like to confirm that my company and I have decided not to proceed to open Trents. As you will be aware, there was a license condition applied that I was to be the Designated Premises Supervisor. My company and I have agreed that it would be irresponsible to make me DPS of both sites and that it is essential I remain the DPS of Mambo whilst your officers continue to monitor/have concerns over Mambo. I hope this goes someway to confirming our ongoing commitment to working with the police in reducing crime and disorder.

Julie Smart mentioned that it might be possible for us to surrender the license and I will discuss this with the owners of Lifestyle Enterprises when they return from holiday. Until then, I would respectfully ask that this information is not divulged to any other party.

is a small bar area. Stairs lead up from the main entrance to the first floor which has a large central bar area, a dance floor and several cubicle style seating areas tables. There is also access to a large balcony area from the first floor bar/dance floor. This balcony area is covered and contains many tables and chairs. It is used both as a social drinking area and as a smoking area.

A further set of stairs lead from the first floor up to the second floor of the establishment. The second floor contains a further bar area and dance. There is another set of stairs which lead from the second floor to the roof terrace.

When we entered the premises there was only one door supervisor present at the front door. This door supervisor was not using any kind of counting device to keep track of how many people were inside the establishment from what I could see. Inside the premises was quite busy in terms of customers. Door supervisors were present at various points inside the establishment including the first floor bar area, the second floor bar area and the entrance to the roof terrace. When leaving the establishment at approximately 0115hrs there were two door supervisors present at the main front entrance. At this time one door supervisor was using a counter. At the time of leaving I saw one male who was clearly intoxicated (slurring his speech and being unsteady on his feet) was trying to enter CAFE MAMBO. The male was prevented from entering by door staff who told him he was drunk. After arguing his case for a couple of minutes the male reluctantly left. He returned a couple of minutes later, eating a slice of pizza. Once he had finished this he tried to enter CAFE MAMBO again at which point he was allowed to enter by the same door supervisor who had previously stopped him from entering.

Observations were also made outside CAFE MAMBO at approximately 0220hrs for several minutes. By this time people were leaving the esatiblishement. Several of the leaving customers were clearly very intoxicated - their speech was slurred and they were unsteady on their feet. One male in particular wearing a white t-shirt was constantly swearing loudly in the direction of the door supervisor saying that he was "going to fucking kill" the door supervisor who was stood several metres away and seemed to take no notice. This male removed his t-shirt and kicked the bin outside the main entrance during his disorderly rant. The male was calmed down by a group of his friends present outside the establishment.



I again attended CAFE MAMBO with DC SHARDLOW between 0000hrs and 0045hrs on SUNDAY 15th APRIL 2012. Two door supervisonrs were present at the front door of CAFE MAMBO and were actively checking the ID of people who looked underage and were seen to refuse people entry who did not have appropriate ID. Neither door supervisor could be seen to use a counter to record how many people were inside the premises. The establishment was very busy inside; to such an extent that it was difficult to move around inside the premises. In my opinion I would say if there was a fire inside the property it would have been very difficult if not impossible to safely evacuate everyone from inside the premises. It would also be very difficult for any of the door supervisors to effectively monitor anything happening inside the establishment more than a few feet away from them due to the numbers of people inside. One door supervisor was present on the first floor balcony and was controlling people moving onto the balcony and back into the premises in an effective manner. Door supervisors inside the premises did appear to be actively checking areas of the dance floor and bar areas as best they could to make sure everything was in order.



Hi Julie,

I have just been to see Nathan the DPS and Mambo's and one of his staff (Emily) regarding the issues at the premises.

I have had a long chat with them about things and the steps they can take to try and reduce/prevent incidents from occurring. They had a few concerns and I have said that I would pass these back to you.

- They are happy to have a follow up visit regarding the quality of their CCTV once they have spoken to their boss and looked to replace the existing recording devices.
- They have said they feel they do not know what to do for the best when they catch people stealing or have people that have had too much to drink, as if they call us, especially if they catch someone stealing the police are not interested. They also said that they do not think there are any police about at their busiest times (Wednesday nights are now a very busy night). They would ideally like some patrols around on a wed night they do understand the pressure the police are under. Basically they seem to have a good reputation with the police when the NET Team were around but they see a different officer everytime and feel that we aren't interested in doing anything if they catch people and it almost goes against them if they phone us.
- Pubwatch they said this hasn't really go off the ground and wondered what was going on
 with this I didn't know so said I would check with you. basically they were hoping that it
 would mean they could have some photo's of banned people/known handbag thieves and
 they would be banned from all the licensed premises but it doesn't seem to be working that
 way.
- They wanted to know if there was any pattern to the thefts as they said that previously
 when they had met with the police certain days/times were worse so they could review their
 CCTV and see if any particular people were attending the premises etc. They feel that
 since December it has decreased. Also they wanted to know whether it was coats too as
 people usually keep bags/phones with them.

I have discussed the CCTV at the premises with them and explained that they need to review their system and try and get all the camera's operating off of one recording device – this will require their existing devices to be upgraded. They currently have 3 hard drives and two monitors. I have stressed that they need to ensure that the quality of the CCTV is good when it is recorded too. It seems this is not currently the case. I have also told them to consider some infra red camera's for the areas of the premises that are not as well lit.

I have discussed a cloakroom with them, and they are happy to give this a go – we did discuss ways to encourage people to use this, such as not making it to costly and perhaps even a voucher for money off food/drink if people use it (not sure how this would sit with their license but just need to get people to use it rather than leave their stuff around). They did say that people don't tend to use these thing in the summer so they weren't sure how successful it would be. They would also like to get a camera to cover this area before they start so as to protect customers belongings and the member of staff manning it.

I have also recommended that they try to block up the DJ booth where people are hanging coats with some clear toughened panels. This will remove the opportunity for people to leave belongings

here and hopefully encourage them to use the cloakroom. If the panel are clear they can display posters etc here and it also still provides a view for management/DJ/Doorstaff.

I have left them some posters about not leaving valuables unattended and also some handbag cards for the tables/bar area which they will put up. I have also asked them to get the doorstaff to tell people not to leave bags/phones unattended when they come in.

I reviewed the crimes that have been occurring and the latest thefts were all from unattended phones/wallets/bags either left on chairs of on the bar area. A couple of the phones were from back pockets (but these could have been lost rather than stolen). It's a difficult one as we cannot make customers take responsibility for their belongings – just try and encourage it.

I am happy to pop over and have a chat to you about this and do a follow up joint visit if you want, as they have been talking about maybe us doing some training with their staff? – just let me know.

Unfortunately I won't be able to attend with you due to work commitments/rest days. I do not know whether there is a pattern to these thefts, it's just the huge number of them taking place. Apparently people were leaving their belongings on the floor by DJ booth and they have been told to put signs up asking customers not to do this. Back at the beginning of the year they were looking at installing lockers for customers to use, but this plan is not now going ahead, but Julie Eyre did tell me a few weeks ago they are thinking of opening up a cloakroom.

I think the CCTV at the premises is poor. The building is currently covered by 3 separate systems, and the hard drive on one of these has recently been changed, but DS Yarwood told me yesterday that they are unable to provide CCTV for a glassing incident that occurred there on 9 May 2012, which is a breach of the condition on their licence, and a matter that I will be dealing with. I have also been informed that the quality of CCTV recordings is also very poor. Additionally, I have been told that there is only one monitor which is in a locked room. Would it assist if they had monitors behind each bar in order that staff can see exactly what is going on as I think this may assist in the prevention of crime and disorder? This is an area that I am hoping to get them to tighten up on, but I admit that I don't know much about CCTV so would also be grateful for any advice you can give on this.



The first floor area was extremely busy and felt unsafe due to the crowding. It was nearly impossible to move across the bar area from one side to the other. The dance floor area merged with bar customers and I witnessed a number of very minor exchanges between customers due to accidental drink spillages caused by the overcrowding.

This was a clear concern for me as without easy movement an emergency situation would be very difficult to control safely. When moving to the second floor bar and dance area this was virtually empty (less than fifteen customers) which seemed to be a poor distribution of persons present, considering the bar was working a one in/one out system, indicating capacity had been reached. Door stewards were polite and visible throughout the bar areas. In the men's toilets on the first floor there was an IC3 male working in the toilets offering aftershave sprays and hand tissues in exchange for payment/donations. The upper floor bar/club area was checked and they did not allow us to take drinks from the second floor area upstairs. This upper area was not particularly busy and appeared well staffed.

I also saw flyers on the pavement outside of MAMBO's and I saw a number of flyer distributors handing out leaflets to members of the public. A number of these were discarded immediately, some on to the pavement.

Continued) created. Police visited the club and found entries in the incident book relating to 0140hrs 10/5/12. They requested CCTV but discovered that the facility had been switched of at 10.33pm on the 9th of May 2012, thus the majority of cameras were switched off. What remains is still being extracted to assist the investigation. The switching off was covered by a technician who stated he could not train all staff in its use quickly enough and as a result staff had inadvertently disabled the machine. A fact to which they were still oblivious over 24 hours later.

It was also discovered that the staff had thrown away the T shirt they seized from Mr and this cannot be recovered so any forensic evidence is lost.

Two entries appear in the club accident report book

- 1. Nathan Towsey Area Manager, states he was made aware of a man who had been hit. I administered First Aid with sanitised wipes then plasters. Advised the may need further attention. Found the male who assaulted him and asked if he wanted to call the police. States that he told the prize friend he may need medical attention.
- 2. Chris Phillips
 Who stated that he found who stated a man had Glassed Him, first aid as above, and finishes male left "no further action required by door staff.

The police were never informed despite crime number FT/12/3227 a GBH glassing in the club on the 3rd of May 2012 7 days prior to this glassing, and the 14th serious assault in mambos this year.

On this occasion the staff had called an ambulance and carried out essential first aid until the arrival of police and ambulance. Clearly the correct procedure was known to Mr Towsey and Mr Phillips but they chose not to inform either authority on this occasion and I speculate that this was a deliberate cover up in order to try to protect their licence.

a) The Reduction of Crime and Disorder.

The staff are required to assist police to reduce crime and disorder at every opportunity. I suggest they have at best failed to do so and at worst deliberately concealed a GBH/ Glassing from the authorities. The log entries above minimise the serious nature of this assalt. Mr Towsev does not even mention a glass even though he administered first aid, and there was glass. (later removed by the hospital staff) sticking out of the large cuts to Mr He advised Mr he MAY need further treatment but failed to call or cause to be called, an Ambulance. Mr Towsey and Mr Phillips destroyed forensic evidence either by design or through ignorance, by clearing up the glass and disposing of the T shirt worn by Mr . They then placed the suspect in front of the witness, in a completely inappropriate fashion and asked the dazed and intimidated victim to make a charging decision. On Mr declining, they then released the suspect, presumably so he could dispose of any other forensic material they had missed at the club. As a consequence of their bodging the CCTV, and failing to record the name of the suspect on either Incident form (even though the name was known to them),

police had to make repeated calls to the managers and waste even more time to obtain the name, and still have no image of the named suspect.

This is a disgrace, and exposes both serious shortfalls in training, of doorstaff and managers, and their management of serious crime, but demonstrates why exactly THIS club above all others has such a poor record in terms of disorder and theft on their premises.

B) Public Safety

Their behaviour in this area is a disgrace and should this become the focus of the local media I believe Police and Local Authority alike will be criticised for not bringing the premises swiftly to book and either closing them on public safety grounds, or achieving immediate swathing constraints on their business hours, and the policing of the premises. The staff have deliberately minimised the seriousness of this attack in the hope that the police would never find out that it had happened. Evidence of this is on their own incident reports, slapdash, inaccurate, missing information, misleading completely lacking in care. They have been incredibly lucky in terms of the injuries to this Lukemia sufferer. They have no hesitation in assuming the role of Law enforcement, Health service, Courts to protect their interests and this has demonstrably happened here. The police service cannot take the risk that in the coming weeks, with the Olympics, Purple Flag, Summer tourism, this will not happen again with serious consequences for Health and Safety. Based on our own statistics another serious assault WILL take place in this period, but whether we will be informed is another matter. Cafe Mambo are aware of the situation having been officially warned by Licencing officer Julie Smart, and yet I have seen no evidence either from crime statistics or from Intelligence submitted by Local Officers that there is any improvement in their behaviour in fact guite the contrary.

On these grounds an expedited review should be required to address the immediate risk to Public Safety and escalation of Crime and Disorder in these premises.

Officers will carry identification and will disclose that they are police officers if challenged or in the interest of safety. They will be in contact with LPST officers on the harbour side, and are able to secure assistance from those officers, or offer assistance if circumstances dictate it is safe to do so.
Human Rights.
The rights of the public particular to a private life and to a fair trial have been considered and are covered in this briefing document. Collateral Intrusion is minimised as officers are restricted to movements which are available to all members of the public.
The above is an example and there have been additional deployments, for example during the Young Farmers' weekend a Passive Drugs Dog was used on the Harbourside to check those queuing to enter premises in order to gather intelligence on whether "Class A" drugs may be being trafficked. Where appropriate, the intelligence found on these occasions was submitted via the form L10 which were then passed to the Licensing Officer, Julie Smart, for action.
There have been sixteen officer deployments since the 30 th of March 2012. The deployments have been at the following premises: Green Ginger, JD's, Cafe Mambo, Bohemia, The Venue, Park Lane, The Yacht, and the Apple and Parrot. Two written warning have been issued by Julie Smart as a result of the observations of officers: one to the Yacht on the 28 th of April 2012, and one to Cafe Mambo earlier in the year on the 4 th of April 2012. The work is ongoing and an intelligence picture continues to be built on crime and disorder.
At the end of April 2012 I met with intelligence officers and officers from the Covert Authorities Unit to ensure that the tactics used in Operation Ambassador were lawful, proportionate, necessary, and complied with precedents set on previous similar police operations into the night time economy in the City of Plymouth and town of Newquay. A review was also carried out into reported crime inside the clubs being visited and work was carried out by Force Analyst Mrs Hilton.
Throughout the period of deployments to licensed premises Cafe Mambo stood out from all the others for their record on Violent Crime, and Theft. On violent crime Cafe Mambo has been the location of seven offences of Assault occasioning Actual Bodily Harm, five offences of Causing Grievous Bodily Harm (s.20 Offences Against the Persons Act (Wounding)), and three offences of causing Grievous Bodily Harm With Intent (s.18 Offences Against the Persons Act). These are offences which cause serious harm and can result in permanent scarring. They are potentially life threatening and are in the main the result of glassings. The number of offences which have been recorded this year (since January 2012) already exceeds the reported incidents for the same period in 2011. In addition, there have been twenty eight thefts reported on the premises in 2012.

Cafe Mambo has a poor track record in comparison with other licensed premises, for example Green Ginger has had one minor assault this year and no reported thefts. There have been no reported thefts from Bohemia, or Venue. Yacht has had a single incident of indecent assault on the premises. In my opinion all of these establishments are comparable with Cafe Mambo.

It may be significant that Cafe Mambo has no cloakroom facilities. The thefts may, therefore, be due to the restricted vision of staff on the three floors, and the fact that people leave their valuables on tables, and chairs whilst dancing. The number of people on the premises is in my view significant. A number of officers have reported that the premises are often crowded—in particular the area of the the first floor bar. The crowding of this and other areas results in people banging in to each other which in turn leads to assaults taking place. Allowing drunks to enter (as evidenced below) as well as persons under the age of 18 (again evidenced below) is also in my opinion a cause in Cafe Mambo's statistics for violence and theft being higher than elsewhere.

I am in possession of a number of statements from officers deployed into Cafe Mambo during Operation Ambassador and the observations of the officers support my comments above. For example, on 13th April 2012 DC SHARDLOW was deployed and at 0040hrs entered cafe mambo. He noted that there was one doorman and lots of people were entering unchecked -i.e. there were no identification checks. The door staff did not count how many people were entering or leaving. The bar was busy and it was difficult to understand how the security could watch what was going on due to the number of people. As he left the bar a drunk, argumentative male tried to gain entry and was told to go and get some food and sober up. This male was seen to leave (somewhat reluctantly) and come back three minutes later with some Pizza which he ate it in front of the door staff who then allowed him entry. The male was still in an intoxicated state. This was corroborated by DC Vallins.

On the same night observations were again carried out outside the premises at 0220hrs. Officers noted heavily intoxicated persons leaving the club with one male swearing loudly that he was going to "fucking kill" the door staff. This male removed his shirt and kicked the bin outside the club before being removed by a group of others.

On the 20th of April 2012, DC Stabb records at 2345hrs when he entered Cafe Mambo no counter was used by the door staff except on the top floor where a female was counting people in and out. This was corroborated by PC Brett who states that the first floor bar was very busy and difficult to pass. He observed that as they went to leave he could see a male in front of him swigging from a bottle of red wine but this was taken from him before he left the premises.

On the fifth of May 2012 PC Freeborn observed two females staggering along the pavement. He noted they were extremely drunk. As they walked past Cafe Mambo they were handed a flyer leaflet advertising Mambos. They took the leaflet and walked straight past the two male members of door staff who were stood on the front door. They were not stopped or asked for any form of I.D. PC Freeborn spoke to the door staff and told them the females were too drunk to be allowed into the premises. The doorman stated that he was unaware they had walked past and had not seen them enter the premises. The doorman then located the females and asked them to leave.

In relation to allowing persons under the age of 18 years on the premises (thus breaching the license conditions) this is historically a difficult area to evidence. There have been two recent events, however,



which prove beyond doubt that Cafe Mambo are allowing underage persons onto their premises, meaning that they have failed to check identification. It is also clear that those persons are either drunk, when they enter, or drinking on the premises.

The first of the two incidents occurred on the 28th of March 2012 between 23.15hrs and 23.45hrs on the dance floor. A 17yr old reported that he had been drinking (confirmed by the investigating officer) and that when on the dance floor an unknown male had assaulted him by coming up and head butting him in an unprovoked assault. He reported that he had examined his nose which was bleeding and had complained to door staff who detained his assailant. The suspect, also 17 years old, was arrested in the club by PC Newton at 0200hrs. PC Newton's statement records "I formed the opinion that he was drunk. His eyes were glazed, he was unsteady on his feet, and his breath smelt of intoxicating liquor." He stated that the suspect had a driving licence in his possession belonging to his older brother who looked nothing like him. When interviewed in connection with a Fraud Act Offence (fake ID), and ABH the suspect stated he had not used the ID to enter the club. The CCTV did not assist and so in the absence of independent witnesses the case was finalised.

These individuals were unknown to each other so on this night at least two people under the age of 18 were in Cafe Mambo. Both had been drinking, one was drunk, and as a result there was a fight resulting in injury.

On the 3rd of May 2012 a GBH glassing occurred in the premises on the dance floor. Both parties were known to each other, both were adults, and as a result a suspect was arrested and is currently on bail pending completion of enquiries and a charging decision. In this incident police were called by Ambulance staff with the log reading "male has been glassed aged 22yrs offender has run off." The investigation has, however, been hampered by poor CCTV necessitating the seizure of the hard drive on that occasion. It should be noted that the investigation of another allegation of assault (crime reference FT/12/2628 (GBH) dated 9th of April 2012) has been hampered by the inadequacies of the coverage of the CCTV system.

I now turn to crime FT/12/3227, a serious incident of violence which has resulted in this application for summary review of the premises license and the certificate from Superintenant Nye that in his opinion the premises are associated with serious crime and serious disorder.

On Thursday the 10th May 2012 an incident occurred where a 19 year old male was the subject of an offence of s.18 wounding (causing Grievous Bodily Harm With Intent). At about 0140 hrs, the victim, was with friends in the 2nd floor dance area, dancing with a girl. Mr observed an argument between a group of females who were close by and shortly afterwards an unknown male smashed a glass over Mr observed. Mr observed and walked over to his friends who told him his head was bleeding. He noticed a large amount of blood on his orange polo shirt and he approached door staff. The "bouncer" called Chris (later named as Chris Phillips door staff) took him to a staff area and the "manager" (later named as Nathan Towersey) cleaned his wounds with antiseptic wipes. After cleaning the cuts Towersey told that they were "not too bad". They took Mr observed and Mr observed and been told that the wounds were not too bad. The "manager" said this made it easier for them because they have less paperwork.

Chris, at some point said "its fair enough people hitting each other but no one should be glassed". Mr left the club and then called his mum who, seeing the wounds, took him to hospital at around 0230hrs. His head was X rayed, two dissolvable stitches, and a further 11 stitches, were inserted into his head, bruising was noted on his left shoulder along with a small cut. On Tuesday the 14 th of May 2012 Mrather peorted the matter to police some four days after the original incident. There had been no report of disorder from Cafe mambo and thus was no police log created relating to 0140hrs 10/5/12.
The investigating officers requested CCTV but were told that the Club had discovered that the facility had been switched off at 10.33pm on the 9 th of May 2012, thus the majority of cameras were switched off. What remains is still being extracted to assist the investigation but as a result the Police have to

What remains is still being extracted to assist the investigation but as a result the Police have to invest unnecessary time and resources in an attempt to recover evidence from Mambo's CCTV which should be easily available and accessible. The switching off was explained by a technician who stated via e-mail that he could not train all staff in its use quickly enough and as a result staff had inadvertently disabled the machine a fact to which they were still oblivious over 12 hours later. It was also discovered that the staff had thrown away the T shirt they seized from Mr. The throwing away of the t-shirt and broken glass means that any forensic evidence is lost.

Two entries appear in the club accident report book

- 1. Nathan Towersley Area Manager, states he was made aware of a manual who had been hit. I administered First Aid with sanitised wipes then plasters. Advised he may need further attention. Found the male who assaulted him and asked if he wanted to call the police. States that he told friend he may need medical attention. Then left.
- 2. Chris Phillips states that he found who stated a man had glassed him, first aid as above, and finishes male left "no further action required by door staff.

Cafe Mambo is required to assist police to reduce crime and disorder at every opportunity. It appears to me that they have failed to do so at best and at worst have deliberately concealed a GBH/Glassing from the authorities. The log entries set out above minimise the serious nature of this assault since Mr Towersley does not even mention a glass even though he administered first aid, and there was glass, (later removed by the hospital staff) sticking out of the large cuts to Manage Whilst he advised that he may need further treatment, Mr Towersley failed to call an Ambulance or have one called. Whether through ignorance or design Mr Towersley and Mr Phillips then destroyed forensic evidence by clearing up the glass and disposing of the T shirt worn by Mr

It simply beggars belief that they placed the suspect in front of the dazed and intimidated victim who had sustained a head injury and asked that victim if he wanted the police. To have then released the suspect without recording his name in the Club's accident report book (even though he was known to them) and thus destroying any chance of police recovering forensic material from him, is of gave concern. This concern is compounded by the Club not then reporting the incident. The police only became aware of the assault when, five days later, the victim attended the police station and made a complaint. Only then were the police able to investigate the crime and as described below the police have had to make repeated calls to the managers and waste further time to obtain the suspect's name.

Initially police spoke to Sharon Rogers a company manager, and asked for co operation in supplying the name of the offender. Police then spoke to Nathan Towersley, the Designated Premises Supervisor who stated he would make enquiries of his staff. A few days later he informed police that Mr Phillips had recorded the name and supplied the name of a suspect who was not known on police indices. Enquires continued to locate the male and during the evening of the 19th of May police attended Mambo's intending to speak to Mr Phillips. They spoke to a Mr Spence (door staff) who stated that he was present when the incident took place, and had recorded the details of the suspect who had been on a works night out with friends when the glassing took place. Details of the suspect were then supplied including a place of work where the suspect could be located—another licensed premises.

On finally being able to make checks on the Suspect, it was revealed that his date of birth is 20th August 1994 making him 17 years old. Officers have made efforts to arrest him and enquiries continue. The fact that the suspect is under age and in the club, in breach of Mambo's licence conditions has, I believe, clouded the judgement of their staff. In my opinion it is because the Suspect was 17 that no ambulance was called, no report filed with the police, that the suspect was not detained and no forensic evidence preserved. This behaviour borders on Perverting the Course of Justice and I have asked my staff to investigate this, such has been the damage caused to enquiries into a serious assault. Whether gross incompetence, or a deliberate cover up, the actions of the the staff at Cafe Mambo when dealing with was, in my view, disgraceful.

It is this particular incident, taken with the other matters outlined above which has informed the decision to seek summary review of the premises license. This is the second incident of glassing at the same premises within a week and it follows other similar incidents of violence which are compounded by the concerns outlined above. If staff at Cafe Mambo were prepared to act as they did with a vulnerable 19 year old who was the victim of a glassing, there is very real concern as to whether other incidents have gone unreported and whether future incidents will be brought to the attention of the Police.

The coming weeks and months are likely to be very busy with celebrations to mark HM The Queen's Diamond Jubilee, as well as the Olympics. Torquay and the Harbourside is a popular tourist and 'clubbing' destination and achieving The Purple Flag and maintaining that status in my opinion means that action needs to be taken to prevent further serious crime and serious disorder which, sadly, is associated with Cafe Mambo. In my opinion the licence should be suspended until such time that the threat of serious crime and serious disorder is sufficiently reduced. I appreciate that this will impact upon the club at a busy time but my responsibility is to protecting the public and that cannot be achieved without significant changes.

I believe that the minimum requirmements to reduce the risk posed include installing a CCTV recording system which covers not only all of the club but which also provides good quality images and is easy to use. I also believe that there needs to be a requiremement to use plastic or similar type of drinking vessel (i.e. non-glass), comprehensive training to staff on the law (i.e. not allowing under 18's into the premises and challenging them for ID) as well as crime recording and prevention (i.e. reporting matters to the police and how to preserve a crime scene). I also believe that cloak rooms need to be installed as this will reduce the high levels of theft. A fixed capacity limit set and effective management of the numbers of customers on each floor would also reduce the frequency with which patrons bump into each other and end up either as the victim or perpetrator of an assault.

I decided at some point that I would dance on the pole that is situated on the dancefloor on the top floor and is often used by people whilst dancing.

I became aware of suddenly being hit by liquid as if someone had thrown a drink over me. I then heard the girl I had been dancing with arguing with another female who I would describe as smaller than me, skinny build with longish hair down to her neck. I can't remember what they were arguing about or what was being said. A guy then became involved in this argument, again I don't recall what was being said. I remember him coming towards me. Over the past month, police officers have been carrying out an operation in Torquay focussing on all licensed premises in the harbourside/town centre area.

During the course of this operation, several police officers have carried out visits to the above named premises to view their operation and provide feedback to me on various licensing matters. As a result of this, I am now in possession of two separate reports where officers have raised concerns regarding the number of persons present on the first floor of the premises, causing serious overcrowding.

In addition to this, I was working during the evening of Friday 27 April 2012, in the company of Mrs Mandy Guy, Senior Licensing Officer for Torbay Council, and had cause to visit Mambo at approximately 11.00 pm. At this time we also witnessed that the first floor bar of Mambo was extremely busy, to the extent that we had to push through crowds of people in order to pass the bar and reach the outside balcony. Furthermore, I consider that this level of overcrowding may pose a potential for risk to life should a serious incident or fire occur within the premises, requiring immediate evacuation.

Despite leaving several telephone messages with various members of staff at the fire station, I have not received any contact from yourselves, and am therefore writing to you to draw your attention to these concerns.

Having discussed this matter at length with Detective Sergeant Chris Yarwood, of Torquay CID, who is responsible for the operation, he would be delighted if one of your officers could accompany his staff on a visit to the premises, during a Friday or Saturday evening, in order to view the situation first hand. DS Yarwood is contactable

This department has received a number of complaints in respect of noise in relation to the above premises.

Café Mambo is a four storey premises on the Strand Torquay. On the first floor, the premises a bar area with a large balcony that extends out over the pavement. This area has large umbrellas over it. The area is used throughout the day and night whilst the premises is open. Access to the area is provided by a single door from the first floor where music is played as entertainment. As a result, if this door is left open there is the potential for a significant amount of noise breakout from the premises. Furthermore, the first floor balcony area is used by patrons to sit, drink and smoke outside until 03:00 am.

A number of complaints have been received over the last 12 months in relation to noise from the premises. The complaints relate to noise from music breakout and noise associated with patrons using the balcony.

Over the years, there have been a number of incidents involving patrons of the premises either jumping off the balcony or climbing on to the neighbouring roof of Hoopers Department Store and falling off. I am aware of an incident when the premises was under the control of the previous operator and to my knowledge there have been two incidents under the current ownership. One incident occurred recently on the 24th of October 2011 where a patron climbed on to the roof of Hoopers Department Store fell and broke his leg. Another incident occurred on the 31st March 2012 where police officer witnessed a patron climb off the balcony on the roof of Hoopers and then jump on to a lamp post.

I have been in correspondence with the operators on a number of occasions however the complaints have continued. Details of the correspondence is contained in appendix 1. I have written to them on the 24th of February 2011, the 15th of November 2011, the 13th of January 2012 and have emailed them in respect of complaints on the 6th of February 2012, the 13th of March 2012 and the 4th of April 2012. I would draw the attention of the committee to the fact that complaints have continued.

I have received reports from an officer of my department who were in the vicinity of the Regina Hotel at Beacon Quay on the 11th of January 2012 and who was surprised how loud the music from Mambo was at midnight.

I have received reports from police officers on the 6th of April 2012, 8th of April 2012 and the 9th of April 2012 regarding the doors to the balcony being left open and the amplified music being too loud. Copies of the reports submitted to me are contained in appendix 2.

Frequent complaints of noise have also been received from residents in Queens Quay Torquay and those on Victoria Parade advising that noise from Mambo has been disturbing them.

Complaints have also been made by residents in Victoria Parade and by guests at the Regina Hotel, however, neither party has decided to pursue their complaint.

The residents of Queens Quay identify that bass breakout that wakes them up and that this is regularly attributed to Café mambo. Complaints are also frequently received in respect of noise arising from the patrons on the balcony.

It is more difficult to quantify the effect of patron noise, there are a number of other premises in the area which attract people and there is associated noise in the street. However, there are long periods of time during the evening when the streets are quiet as all the revellers are in venues. I have witnessed occasions when noise arising from patrons on the balcony has been clearly audible in the flats at Queens Quay. One such incident was April 3rd 2012. At the time of my visit, which finished at around 02:00, the town centre was relatively quiet but noise from the balcony area of Mambos, shouting and laughing was audible with the windows ajar. This does support the complaints made.

Table 1 shows the list of noise complaints received in respect of the premises. Note these complaints are complaints by members of the public, mainly a resident in Queens Quay. These are unverified in that an officer has not witnessed noise on these occasions.

I am advised by one of the main complainants that they have not been living in their premises in Queens Quay since early May due to family issues.

In the light of this level of complaint, there is a significant body of anecdotal evidence indicating that a public nuisance is being caused by the activity at Café Mambo.

As the Licensing Committee will be aware, the licensing process is an administrative process not a criminal one. The Committee may consider all evidence and use it whilst giving it appropriate weight to make an appropriate decision as set out by the case R v Deputy Industrial Injuries Commissioner 1965.

As I am satisfied a degree of public nuisance exists, I consider that the following conditions to control noise would be appropriate to promote the licensing objective of preventing public nuisance. I am further concerned that the level of supervision of the balcony is inadequate and I am concerned to note that this is leading to complaints in respect of noise and I am gravely concerned that the lack of supervision is leading to a serious risk to public safety, particularly the risk of a patron falling off the balcony or dropping a glass or other item off it.

I therefore propose to the committee the following conditions that are both appropriate and proportionate in support of the public safety licensing objective and the prevention of public nuisance.

- At all times the balcony is open after 22:00 the area shall be directly supervised by SIA qualified staff. Staff shall make all reasonable attempts to ensure patrons do not make excessive noise such as singing football songs and shouting. SIA staff must also be on the balcony to ensure that patrons make no attempt to climb or lean on the balustrades.
- Within three months of this hearing the door to the first floor balcony shall have an
 acoustic lobby constructed to the satisfaction of the responsible authority for public
 nuisance. The lobby doors shall be constructed and operated to ensure that at all
 times, that regulated entertainment is being played, at least one door is kept closed
 to prevent noise breakout.
- A noise limiter shall be fitted to the premises Public Address system. All music shall be played through the limited system.

- The limiter shall be set at a level agreed with the local responsible authority for public nuisance. The limiter shall be sealed in a tamper proof box and adjustments shall only be made with the express permission of the responsible authority for public nuisance.
- The limiter shall be independently calibrated to the level agreed with the responsible authority on an annual basis and a copy of the report shall be forwarded to the responsible authority.
- No changes shall be made to the Public Address system without the permission of the responsible authority for public nuisance.

However, I do note that there are currently conditions on the licence relating to noise and there is anecdotal evidence that the premises has not complied with these conditions in a manner that might be expected.

Just to confirm about Fast Eddie's over the weekend, I have been running shift down there from 11pm onwards Fri and Sat due to Craig being away. Friday we were open 6pm until midnight and the music was at a level where you could have a conversation without shouting. Saturday night we were open 6pm until 12.45am and extremely quiet. At midnight I had 3 customers, again the music was no louder as I am very conscious of the above residents even though the restaurant is in- between. Standing outside at the top door you cannot hear the music from inside. The base levels are also off so not to cause any vibration etc. All back of house doors to the cellar etc are closed during trading hours.

I cannot understand why we would have noise complaints, people leaving the premises are never drunk or rowdy and most weekends we are never opened past 1.30/2am. (Abby)

I am awaiting reports from door staff, duty manager & a CCTV review regarding the balcony noise and will come back to you with the results.

I have received further complaints about noise break out from your premises affecting nearby residents.

Complaints relate to noise arising from bass breakout from the premises during the course of the evening. However, I am advised that the noise becomes particularly bad during the last hour of operation and during closing time when doors are all opened for your customers to leave the premises.

As you are no doubt aware, there are conditions on your licence requiring you to control noise so that it does not disturb residents. For your information the conditions are listed below.

- Noise from the premises shall not be audible within any dwelling with windows open for normal ventilation especially after 11pm. This shall be assessed from the boundary to the nearest residential properties, on all sides of the licensed premises. The criteria that shall be applied are;
- (i) Before 11pm Noise emanating from the premises shall not be clearly distinguishable above other noise.
- (ii) After 11pm Noise emanating from the premises shall not be distinguishable above background levels of noise.

- 3. Entrances shall be provided with lobbies with automatic door-closers. The lobbies shall be in use throughout the time of entertainment.

- 5. Provision of mechanical ventilation and air conditioning system shall not allow noise breakout from the premises or cause a nuisance by its operation.
- 6. Regular maintenance shall be carried out on all plant and machinery to ensure that noise disturbance from such sources is kept to a minimum.

I am also advised that your staircase to the roof-top bar is missing. A flight of stairs greater than 3 stairs must have a hand rail at a height of 900 mm.

Re: Licensing Act 2003 Café Mambo Environmental Protection Act 1990 - Alleged Statutory Noise Nuisance arising from the playing of amplified music played at Mambos

I have received a complaint from a nearby resident alleging that the playing of amplified music at the above premises is causing a noise nuisance to them. They are alleging that they are disturbed by noise breakout from your building and by noise from your patrons singing along to songs on your balcony area.

I remind you that the following conditions on your licence apply to the playing of amplified music on your licence. I would remind you that there are various conditions on your licence covering the playing of amplified music on your premises.

Of particular importance are conditions contained in annex 3 that require that music from the premises should not be audible above the background noise. On several occasions when I have passed the area, noise from your club is audible some distance away. You are therefore currently operating in breach of your licence. If you would like help in setting the levels of amplified music in your premises please contact me to arrange a time to visit.

- 1. On every day when the premises are open, the following conditions will apply:
 - a. The volume of all amplified music shall be at a level to be set and agreed to the satisfaction of the council. The settings shall be secured in a locked area and capable of amendment only by the manager or licensees following appropriate application to and consultation with the council.
 - b. All windows and doors shall be kept closed from 11pm each night. Entry to and exit from the premises shall be by way of the Strand entrance only. This condition will be in force in all circumstances except when an emergency evacuation of the premises is necessary.

Annex 3

1. Noise from the premises shall not be audible within any dwelling with windows open for normal ventilation especially after 11pm. This shall be assessed from the boundary to the nearest residential properties, on all sides of the licensed premises. The criteria that shall

- (i) Before 11pm Noise emanating from the premises shall not be clearly distinguishable above other noise.
- (ii) After 11pm Noise emanating from the premises shall not be distinguishable above background levels of noise.
- (iii) The local authority shall reserve the right in cases of tonal noise and where premises are attached to others, to make further assessments from within the residential property.
- 2. Doors and windows shall be kept shut during entertainment to reduce noise breakout. A management scheme shall be in place to ensure this situation remains.
- 3. Entrances shall be provided with lobbies with automatic door-closers. The lobbies shall be in use throughout the time of entertainment.
- 4. A senior member of staff (manager) shall assess the impact of any noisy activities on neighbouring residential premises at the start of the activity/entertainment and periodically throughout the activity/entertainment to ensure levels of noise have not increased.
- 5. Provision of mechanical ventilation and air conditioning system shall not allow noise breakout from the premises or cause a nuisance by its operation.
- 6. Regular maintenance shall be carried out on all plant and machinery to ensure that noise disturbance from such sources is kept to a minimum.
- 7. Regulated entertainment upon the terrace shall cease by 19.00 hrs.

I have also received a compliant relating to an incident in October 2010 where a member of the public was hit with a bottle, the complaint relates to the level of first aid treatment that the injured party received. They allege that they received very little help from the staff on duty at the time and that they attempted to staunch the blood flow with a bar towel prior to the arrival of the ambulance service. I visited the premises on the 31st of January 2011 to discuss the incident and inspect the first aid provision, I spoke with Kelly Postlethwaite the duty manager. I noted during my inspection, that your first aid box contained one sterile dressing. I recommend that you have a system in place to ensure that appropriate first aid provision is always available for both staff and members of the public who suffer an injury.

I write in my capacity as the designated officer authorised to execute the statutory duties of the Torbay Local Safeguarding Children Board under the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 in respect of the protection of children from harm.

I am aware that the above named premises had their license suspended on the 31st May 2012 following a number of incidents relating to serious crime / disorder involving under 18's, including the sale of alcohol.

Young people are less well equipped than adults to cope with the effects of alcohol, physically and emotionally. The same amount of alcohol will have a much greater effect on the body of a child or young person than on an adult, because their bodies are still growing and developing. Also, a young person does not have the experience needed to deal with the effects of alcohol on judgement and perception.

In the short-term, drinking and getting drunk can be dangerous for young people. They may do or say something they regret later, and they are much more likely to have an accident or get into trouble such as a fight.

As a board we expect to see adequate conditions in place to safeguard children and young people. In this instance it is of particular concern that the premises have failed to adhere to their existing licensing conditions in respect of the protection of children from harm. In view of the serious nature of the incidents leading up to the suspension, if the license were to be re-instated the board would want to see the following additional conditions imposed:

- Adequate CCTV recording system which covers all of the building and meets police standards
- A limitation on the number of people allowed to be on the premises at any given time
- A proof of age policy of 25 with training for all staff with regard to application

Agenda Item 6 Dear Licensing Committee.

I understand that tomorrow the 15th June a review is taking place on Cafe Mambo following recent events.

I have lived in Queens Quay for some 20 months, and have reported numerous issues to environmental health and the police a number of disturbances and concerns regarding this venue and others. Other venues have taken action to deal with the complaints, however this venue continues to blight my right of peaceful enjoyment of my home, until the early hours of the morning.

I have given permission for Gareth Fudge to share noise diaries regarding this venue with the last complaint being made on the 13/5. (We are loading these up onto a public website). No complaints have been made since this date as my father has been ill, and I have been away.

Over this period the venue has been granted new licences (ie roof terrace), yet in my opinion breaches its licence and planning conditions, it also apparently has a long history of crimes, as well as statistical data from A and E citing Mambo.

I guess the level of crimes is increasing as none of this was raised wrt licencing the new roof terrace.

Regularly, the venue emits heavy bass, which is audible from Queens Quay, has no control over the drunken behaviour on its terrace with shouting, screaming, music until early hours, has noisy patrons upon arrival, and departure, intoxicated people running from the premises onto the road. The 1st floor terrace at times appears full of large numbers of people standing and drinking.


A lot of aggressive behaviour, shouting etc from patrons, and we have to wonder whether the broken windows, smashed doors at queens quay has any relationship to the crimes

It is also apparent, when walking around the harbour people have been seen drinking on the terrace at midnight, and this only has planning permission until 11pm.

As a concerned resident, I wish to lodge how can a premises operate, with such a high incident rate, against virtually free incident rate from other premises, and continue to ignore all the licence objectives.

I believe my concerns, above, as a resident raised for over 18 months, have now been documented this May by the police and verifies what I see and hear every night.

I am very concerned by the apparent attempts by the venue to cover up the issues, and that it cannot manage its venue. So I am hopeful the licence gets reviewed, and if re-instated, gets put back to a reasonable time such as midnight.



Dear Licensing committee,

This email is in regard to the Application for the review of a premises license under section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 (premises associated with serious crime and disorder).

I am the joint owner of flat Queens Quay and am also writing on behalf of the owners of flat and flat . Queens

Quay also has many older citizens who have purchased flats and want to enjoy their homes. We have been working with

Steve Cox and his team for the last few years and the problems encountered at Cafe Mambo come as no surprise.

The area is saturated with pubs and licensed clubs that operate until the early hours. Patrons move between the

venues, congregate on the streets and have generally given Torquay a reputation for drunken and disorderly

behaviour - the centre for stag and hen nights. The harbour side is a mixed use area with residential properties on the waterfront.

Noise diaries have been submitted on a regular basis by the owner of flat Queens Quay. Cafe Mambo

has featured on a regular basis with noise breakout in breach of their license, lack of control of arriving and

departing patrons (often drunk) and a breach of planning permissions regarding their terrace. Our property have

also been used by Gareth Fudge to witness and record this behaviour.

I understand that there has been a history of environmental health issues with this establishment. This review offers the council a chance to set an example and at the same time start regenerating the harbour so that families can once again stroll the streets in the evening and get a reasonable nights sleep. The council policy is for the return of waterfront cafes and restaurants.

If this license is reinstated, there should be stringent conditions with regard noise breakout after 11pm with no access to the outdoor terraces after 11pm. The club should be closed by midnight so that residents can enjoy the rights of quiet enjoyment of their homes, a pledge made by the council

In relation to Review Proceedings against Mambo/the Beach Hut

1. This document is prepared on behalf of the Premises Licence Holder (PLH) for the purposes of dealing with the Review proceedings due to be held on 22nd June 2012. They are not meant to be exhaustive but in particular should be considered alongside the verbal submissions and amplifications made as well as a document supplied entitled 'Code of Conduct for Responsible Retailing'

Background

- 2. On 31st May 2012 as of a result of an Application for an expedited review having been made by Devon and Cornwall Constabulary (the Police) the Licensing sub Committee (the Committee) suspended the Premises Licence pending a full review hearing.
- 3. The sub Committee will no doubt have the decision that was communicated in writing to the Parties.
- 4. Inter alia it was considered relevant that the expedited process had not enabled the PLH to put adequate measures in place prior to the interim steps hearing in order to deal with the concerns raised.

- 5. DCMS Guidance (2007) produced to assist in dealing with interim steps indeed states (3.7) 'that in some circumstances, it might be better to seek suspension of the licence pending a full review, rather than imposing a range of costly conditions or permanent adjustments'.
- 6. It was accepted by the PLH that, having distilled the mischief highlighted by the Police, in order for the licensing objectives to be upheld, changes were needed to the operating procedures and checks and balances within the management of the Premises. Further it had been apparent that the CCTV coverage and systems needed upgrading.
- 7. The Application was made specifically in response to two incidents, however, prior to these it is common knowledge as between the Police and the PLH that the PLH was undertaking a wholesale review of the premises (with Police involvement) operating procedures in order to reinforce their commitment to the Licensing objectives. The Police indicated that the two incidents left them no option but to instigate a review themselves as the nature of the problems that arose could not wait for the PLH to act unilaterally.
- 8. These proceedings have had the effect of accelerating the consideration the PLH was giving to their own procedures and given them the opportunity to meet the challenges highlighted by the Polices concerns.
- 9. The Document attached 'Code of Practice for Responsible Retailing' will be effective immediately should the Committee decide not to further suspend or revoke the licence. In this vein, without wishing to prejudge the outcome, all staff and subcontractors will have been inducted as to its contents and their obligations prior to the Review hearing.
- 10. Attached to these representations, that are submitted by the PLH of whom Mrs J Eyres will speak on behalf of at the hearing are numerous documents:

- The enhanced Code of Conduct
- Comments by the DPS at the time relating to incidents outlined by the Police
- Press coverage 22/03/11 outlining the spirit in which the PLH conduct themselves.
- Minutes of meetings held with the Police March 2011 to date
- Correspondence between the Police and the DPS/PLH including telephone notes and e mails
- Correspondence and confirmation of CCTV system
- Correspondence since the initial interim steps hearing
- Invoice confirmation of plastic glasses
- CV of proposed DPS

They are not indexed as it is anticipated that the Committee will be given a joint bundle with a singular index.

The mischief

- 11. The Committee were of the view that they shared the concerns of the Police in that 3 of the licensing objectives had been undermined by evidence of the recent operation of the premises. This Review will consider any wider issues and the PLHs' response to them.
- 12. Crime and disorder was engaged, in particular, by two incidents on 3rd May and 10th May 2012. There is also evidence of the club being a target for thieves.
- 13. Protection of children from harm was engaged by evidence of underage customers and an irresistible inference that they had been drinking.

- 14. Public safety had been undermined by the acts/omissions by the DPS in response to the two incidents and issues concerning perceived overcrowding.
- 15. Inadequate CCTV coverage and Door staff not fulfilling expected standards of behaviour undermined all three licensing objectives. A failure to keep adequate records and contact the emergency services when appropriate had undermined the Licensing objectives too.
- 16. The schedule of incidents provided in support of the Application are commented on by the DPS at the time in an attached document.

The Police evidence

- 17. The documents attached to these representations, in particular minutes of meetings and correspondence including that from third parties, show that, we submit, although there may be issues that need remedy the Committee are dealing with a proactive, sincere and responsible PLH.
- 18. ADC Yarwood opines that significant changes need to be made. This is an opinion he is entitled to hold, and we accept this.
- 19. His view that the failure by the DPS to act was 'disgraceful' and 'bordering on perverting the course of justice' is not, however, a balanced one. He holds this opinion without having undertaken investigation as to the reasons or motives behind the failure. No staff have been interviewed or had statements taken from them in relation to the investigation of either of the incidents even though it is some 7 weeks since they occurred. Without investigation such conclusions or opinions are, we submit premature and of little or no weight for the purposes of this hearing.

- 20. Nathan Towersey, the DPS, made it quite clear to the Committee as to the reasons for his failure to call the Police or Ambulance. Attached are his comments in detail. He made a mistake, it was a serious error of judgement. It is capable of remedy so as to ensure it is not repeated. The PLH, however, are of the view that in order to uphold the licensing objectives Mr Towersey can no longer remain as DPS.
- 21. The chronology outlines numerous incidents, some minor others that need proper consideration as to how they impact upon the licensing objectives and what can be done to prevent them from reoccurring.

The issues

22. Although it is tempting to apportion blame we submit that the appropriate way of considering the evidence is to do so only in so far as to assess how the licensing objectives have been undermined (as we agree above), and consider if the Code of Practice and any conditions that can be added to the licence adequately deals with the issues raised? It is only in this way that the Committee can ensure that its decision is proportionate and necessary (albeit in so far as conditions are imposed appropriate). These proceedings are not punitive. Nor should can any decision be lawfully so.

The remedy

23. We submit that there is action that can and should be taken in order to uphold the licensing objectives. Some action can only be taken by the Committee by way of removal of DPS and modification of conditions, other actions properly taken by the PLH. We submit that action falling short of further suspension or revocation is appropriate as the systems, personnel and changes are able to be implemented immediately.

Removal of DPS and replacement with Clare Greensmith (CV enclosed)

The failure to call the Police and the Ambulance Service is so serious as to make the present DPS untenable. Whatever the explanation, and accepting this as an error of judgement, the fact remains that the Police and the PLH (and no doubt the Committee) cannot have confidence in him to remain in post at this time. His failure to ensure that under age people were not being let in by door staff and served at the bar cannot be remedied by retraining alone. Only a new, experienced DPS can deal with this, Clare Greensmith will attend the hearing and be available to answer any questions the Committee may have of her.

Wholesale upgrade of CCTV system

Failure to have a system that provides the best recordable and retrievable coverage can only be remedied by upgrade. This has been done. The Police have been invited to assess it. The CCTV system is now of the highest specification available in all aspects. Documentation is attached outlining this and importantly the steps that had been taken prior to this Review in order to ensure that the system was 'fit for purpose'. Mr Carpenter will attend the hearing to explain the specifications of the new system.

Use of plastic glasses Wed; Thurs; Fri; Sat; Sun and on Bank Holidays.

Despite best efforts of all involved incidents will occur. By using plastic glasses throughout the premises after 11pm save as for in the Rooftop bar will eliminate violence from having more serious consequences. The Rooftop bar is a different type

of venue within a venue. Door staff will be permanently stationed at its entrance after 11pm to prevent glassware being taken to other parts of the premises

Change of Door staff Company

Failings by the Door staff to prevent the entry of under age customers as well as concerns over the manner of their conduct have led to the PLH changing the Company employed to provide this service. Since the initial hearing a number of providers have been interviewed by the prospective DPS to ascertain the best candidate to provide the service and prevent the reoccurrence of the issues outlined by the Police, missed by the DPS but is acknowledged as unacceptable by the PLH. Further details will be given at hearing

Enhancement and implementation of Code of Practice

Will be effective immediately, disciplinary sanction for non compliance. It details training, procedures, ethos for all staff and subcontractors. In particular it deals with capacity issues and relations with other bodies such as how to react to an incident taking place. It puts in place a number of policies that will apply to the premises. Formerly, Company policies had been inconsistently applied unbeknown to the PLH and by virtue of the issues that have arisen there can be no doubt that a total revamp was necessary. The document attached and the assorted policies to which it refers have been produced as of a result of the criticisms of the Police, the observations of the Committee and amongst other input, the review commissioned

independently by the PLH undertaken by Neil Stanlake. Mr Stanlake will be attending the hearing to comment upon the Code and assist the Committee.

Under age sales.

If in the unlikely event the new proposed challenge 25 and Door staff allow under age people on the premises the Company has reconfigured its tills to have a further check of age at point of sale.

Thefts

All will be reported through the '101' system or nitenet if appropriate 999 will be called. Previous history shows that certain areas have been targeted. In particular an area near the DJ booth on the first floor has been identified. This has now been cordoned off, signage improved throughout the premises and a cloakroom facility has been established on the premises.

Structural /capacity issues

Changes as of a result of the issue of petty theft are outlined above. In addition the Committee will note the changes to the monitoring of capacity that are outlined in the Code. The Police referred to an issue of 'pinch point' on the first floor. This has been rectified with stairs altered to create a better thoroughfare and easier access and egress. A balustrade has been built to add to the earlier changes made after discussions with the Police. A complete fire risk assessment was conducted prior to the Review to deal with amongst other issues capacity. This has been reported upon and confirmation of the same is within the documents attached.

I write following receipt of the representations/documentation received at 16.22hrs today in respect of the above hearing and thank you for your prompt dissemination of the same.

In particular, I refer to the Public Protection representations submitted by Gareth Fudge, Senior Environmental Health Officer, to which I have had no previous indication of in respect of this matter.

We have, however, been in pro-active dialogue and activity with both Mr Fudge and Mr Steve Cox, Environmental Health Manager (Commercial), regarding any and all issues raised in respect of any of our numerous business premises in Torquay, including seeking independent expert advice where appropriate. This dialogue is ongoing and indeed I was told, yesterday, by a representative of the Council that after the hearing scheduled next Friday we would continue to seek an acceptable solution to all concerns, due in part to the fact that no one premises was worthy of being singled out.

Unfortunately, at the point of receiving Mr Fudge's representations, I do not have access to documents which I would rely upon in our defence of and/or to demonstrate our pro-active engagement in the issues Mr Fudge refers to. Unfortunately the representations of Mr Fudge are incomplete and do not portray an accurate picture of the present situation.

Therefore, I would respectfully ask the Committee for the opportunity to present evidence of correspondence and communications to ensure that the Committee has the complete set of documentation and notes of the dialogue in relation to this aspect of the review.
