There are some planned changes due to take place with the Dental helpline for Devon. The dental helpline is a service where local people can register centrally for assistance in finding an NHS dentist. This register is often referred to as a waiting list, but the data is not clinically validated and people no longer needing an NHS dentist may remain registered with the helpline. The list also includes patients who may already have a dentist but want to change, or those currently seeking an appointment with an NHS dentist. In addition to this not all patients who require an NHS dentist will be aware that there is a list. Therefore the register cannot be used to provide the number of people waiting for an NHS dentist in Torbay or how long the wait is.

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				NHS Devon is considering longer term options for people currently on the list.
				Patients are not registered with a dental practice the same way they are registered with a GP practice. Dental practices are contracted to deliver activity and are obliged to only deliver a course of treatment to an individual, regardless of where they live, and not to deliver ongoing regular care. Therefore, even if patients are allocated to a particular dental practice, there is no obligation for a practice to retain them.
				Our priority is to address access issues to enable patients to find a dentist – NHS Devon will continue to provide stakeholder briefings on this via our website.
				 The signposting advice for people who need support accessing a dentist will be: If you need urgent dental care, contact 111 To find an NHS dentist taking on new patients, visit the NHS webpage Find a Dentist Dental practices are independent businesses, often providing a combination of NHS and private dentistry. Patients are not registered with a dentist in the same way they are with a GP, and individuals can access services at a dental practice located in any area if the practice is accepting new patients.
