Mr Bennett

I have received a copy of your application for the grant of a premises licence in respect of the above premises. Having considered the matter and visited your premise where I discussed the application with a member of your staff, I am contacting you to advise you that the police will be requesting the Licensing Authority to impose the below conditions on your licence:

1. The consumption of alcohol shall be restricted to persons who are seated.
2. No alcohol shall be sold in glass bottles from which it is intended or likely that a person shall drink.
3. All drinks shall be served in toughened, strengthened, polycarbonate or plastic glasses.
4. The top half of the kiosk door shall be secured in the open position at all times that alcohol is sold from the premise to ensure adequate supervision of customers in the seating area.

Please note that conditions 1 and 2 above are standard conditions contained within your Pavement Cafe Permit and therefore even if they were not included on your premises licence you will still need to ensure that these conditions are complied with. Your permit also includes a condition that drinking vessels shall be of strengthened glass, but you may wish to use plastic or polycarbonate vessels.

As the seating area is to the side of your kiosk and a view is not afforded of this area from the main service hatch, condition 4 will ensure that your staff are able to monitor your customers whilst they are consuming alcohol.

In case you are not already aware, your premises are situated within the Torbay Council Cumulative Impact Area and therefore unless you can demonstrate within your application that your premises will not add to crime, disorder or public nuisance in the area, your application could be refused by the Licensing Committee. The police consider that by adding the above conditions to your licence, this will strengthen your application and demonstrate that your premise is not likely to add to the existing problems in the area.

If you are in agreement with the above conditions, please can you email back to this effect. If you do not agree with the above, the police will make representation and the matter will be considered by the Licensing Committee in due course.
