Decision

- (i) that the Youth Justice Plan 2016/17, as set out in Appendix 2 to the submitted Report, be approved; and
- (ii) that the Director of Children's Services, in consultation with the Mayor, Executive Lead for Adults and Children and statutory partners, be authorised to make any final changes to the Plan.

Reason for the Decision

To meet the Council's statutory requirement.

Implementation

This decision will come into force and may be implemented on Tuesday, 1 November 2016 unless the call-in procedure is triggered (as set out in the Standing Orders in relation to Overview and Scrutiny).

Information

Torbay Youth Offending Service is performing well with low levels of re-offending and use of custody. Re-offending rates are the third lowest nationally and the fourteenth lowest for the rate of offences per offender. First time entrants have reduced further from 66 (2014/15) to 52 (2015/16) but remains close above the rate for the south west region and statistical comparators. One of the priorities for the 2016/17 plan is to sustain the downward trend.

The number of young offenders in Torbay reduced from 107 (2014/15) to 80 (2015/16) although the level of complexity and vulnerability increased. Essentially the service in working with a smaller cohort of young people who are more entrenched in their offending behaviour, which is often of a more serious nature. The area for action for 2016/17acknowledges this change.

Funding for the service is provided by partner agencies, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) and a central grant from the Youth Justice Board (YJB). There have been reductions in both local contributions and YJB grant for 2016/17 which has been offset to an extent by the use of slippage and an increase in the OPCC contribution. Work is underway with local partners to find a sustainable solution for 2017/18 onwards taking account of the outcome of a Ministry of Justice review of youth justice which will be known before the end of the year.

Alternative Options considered and rejected at the time of the decision

None – There is a statutory requirement placed on the Local Authority by the Crime and Disorder Act 1998.
