The application will automatically go forward to the April round at which time it will again be reviewed along with other applications. The feedback was that some form of matched funding would assist the application. PC BARRETT stated that he had been in contact with the council parks department who were prepared to assist in this area and will produce a report outlining the assistance they will provide. 42.02/04	Youngs Park – Damage caused by storms Councillor CARTER had made the necessary enquiries and informed the meeting that since the last meeting a lot of work has been undertaken in the area. However, the Café and Boating Lake will not be open before Easter.	Discharged
44.01/04	Crime Figure Review PC BARRETT reported on the crime figures for the last 6 months. He informed the meeting that in some areas there had been successes but other areas required a degree of work. Theft from Motor vehicles and Theft of Motor vehicles had gone down slightly. Violent crime had remained static and Criminal Damage had shown a slight increase. The main areas where improvement was needed was for the offences of Burglary and Theft. Burglary in particular showed a significant increase since December time when we were experiencing problems similar to the Brixham area which had also shown a significant increase. It is important that we work as a community to get the right message across as several of those offences have been committed when persons are away from their properties and no security measures have been put in place.

05.01/05	Youngs Park – Water Issues Mr DRAKE and Mrs GILSON advised the meeting that there had been ongoing problems with water accountability in the area. There is one water meter covering the whole of the QuayWest site. There are sub meters for each of the units but it appears that Torbay Council has been paying the bill and not getting any money.

	<p>In addition at the North Sands area there is a supply coming off the water to an unknown user and no money is being received for this, with a similar problem in respect of the electricity. Councillor HURST stated he had been making enquiries about the issues and a search has been ongoing for over a month to try and resolve this.</p>	
05.02/05	<p>Youngs Park – Nature Reserve</p> <p>The representatives from the North Goodrington Action group raised concern about the amount of money spent of the nature reserve with what appeared to be little result for it. They stated that £10,000 had been donated by the Waste management conference but all that had been done was the boardwalk. Councillor BYE stated that this would be a bad PR exercise if that was the case especially as the money had been donated.
