Assessment in RE

New guidance on assessment in RE for all schools in the Diocese of Exeter and Devon, Torbay and Plymouth schools has now been published. This can be found on the Exeter Diocese website and also on the RE pages of the Babcock/LDP website. There is a planning document which explains the 'how and why' of assessment. This is accompanied by a set of templates for summative assessment in RE. These templates can be downloaded and customised for use in schools, to be adapted to your own planning and teaching patterns.

by Catherine Barr tells the scientific account of how life on Earth began. It does this in a 'story' style that marries scientific facts with a great rhythm and quality of language. Children are taken on a journey from the Big Bang to the evolution of humans. A great book to read alongside religious creation stories at almost any age!

Why not read this story alongside Genesis and ask some big questions – are these stories asking different questions? Why might a believer read both? What would they reflect on in each story?
