The SEND Strategy action plan was re-launched in May 18 with the purpose of delivering the key priorities outlined in the <u>Torbay SEND Strategy 2016-20</u>. The SEND Operational Leads group is responsible for the delivery of the SEND Strategy Action plan.

#### **Evidencing Progress**

A SEND Ops lead has been allocated to each area of work with responsibility for providing a highlight report in advance of the 6 weekly SEND Operational Leads' meetings. The report details recent progress, actions planned for the next period and any barriers to progress that need to be addressed (risk / issues). The SEND project manager collates this information, and provides additional support to leads where required. The reporting structure for the SEND Action Plan and other SEND improvement work is detailed below:

The SEND Operational Leads group will escalate any issues / risks to the Children's Partnership Board with eventual accountability to the Health & Wellbeing Board.
