DIRECTIONS

- 1. The floor in the kitchen at Monkey Heights is in need of repair in some areas making it very difficult to keep clean. As per 1.3c of the SSSMZP the whole floor area must be made impervious, hygienic and cleanable. (six months)
- 2. There were two enclosures without uv lights. Malayan box turtle and an off-show lizard cage. As per section 2 and A8.2.5 of the SSSMZP all herptile enclosures must have adequate UVB light. (immediate)
- 3. There is a hole in the roof of the kangaroo house which will let rain in. As per SSSMZP 2.1 this house must be made weather proof. (six months)
- 4. There is a loose cross bar on the fence in the Darwin rhea enclosure. In accordance with SSSMZP 2.3 this must be rectified. (immediate)
- 5. Although the zoo has a written protocol for escapes this does not completely comply with the categorisation of dangerous animals as in the SSSMZP. It must comply with this categorisation. This document requires review and some revision. Thus in accordance with 8.33, 8.34 and 8.36 of the SSSMZP there must be a revised written protocol detailing the response to the escape of an animal outside of its enclosure. This protocol must include information on access to emergency vehicle. The zoo must ensure that all staff are made familiar with this updated and amended protocol. This must be reviewed on a yearly basis and a copy provided to the LA. (2 months)

CONDITIONS

- The zoo must ensure a minimum of four animal escape drills are carried out annually, with at least two of these involving category one hazardous animals as per 8.38 of the SSSMZP. These must be recorded and regularly reviewed with any failings noted addressed in the written escape policy. Actual escapes are no longer considered as part of the escape drill tally. (commence immediately).
- 2. The prohibited area behind the Animal Encounters building must be signed clearly and appropriately in accordance with SSSMZP 8.46 (there is already a sign but it is faded). (immediate).
- 3. In accordance with SSSMZP 8.14 there are wires dangling within reach of the public in the rhino house and the reptile nursery. These must be removed or contained (two months)
- 4. As per A6.9 and A6.10 of the SSSMZP in areas where there is the potential for public to have contact with animals either directly or through contact with contaminated surfaces there must be suitable handwashing facilities available on leaving an enclosure/exhibit. There must be a minimum of warm running water, soap and hand drying facilities. (six months).
- 5. As per A6.9 and A6.10 of the SSSMZP suitable signage must be in place to prompt members of the public to follow good hygiene practice and to hand-washing facilities (six months).
- 6. As per A6.9 and A6.10 of the SSSMZP. A suitable and sufficient risk assessment must be in place to assess the hazards from animal contact and ensure suitable control measures are in place (immediate).
- 7. An ethical review process (as per SSSMZP A2) is in operation. However, the inspectors were concerned that some issues that should have been addressed and discussed by the ethics committee, (e.g. lechwe and tur management due to T.B. restrictions; management of some avian species in the desert house), had not been taken to the committee. In future the Ethics Committee must be used more robustly especially concerning issues as outlined in SSSMZP A2.4. (immediate).

ELEPHANTS – these have been added from the Elephant Report Ancillary Appendix 8.8 Elephants

- 8. As per SSSMZP A 8.8.18 'zoos must aim for all elephants to have access to both inside and outdoor enclosures over a 24 hour period'. This is not currently happening. The zoo must make the necessary alterations so that this is possible. (within four months).
- 9. As per SSSMZP A 8.8.21 the fan in the indoor enclosure must be repaired so that it can be used when required. (within three months).
- 10. As per SSSMZP A 8.8.24 there is access to areas of shelter and shade in the outdoor area, however, there is no customised outdoor shelter. It is probable that the trees provide sufficient shelter but this needs to be monitored to ensure that the animal is not using the indoor area due to insufficient shelter in the outdoor area. The use of the outdoor area must therefore be monitored in different weather conditions to determine use. Monitoring to commence immediately.
- 11. As per SSSMZP A 8.8.32 forage must be analysed at least once and preferable x2 per year. To be commenced immediately.
- 12. As per SSSMZP A 8.8.34 there is not a timed feeding regime for overnight feeding. Thus, although hay is available, all food can be finished soon after presentation. Food presentation must be made more unpredictable during night hours, and a timing delivery system must be introduced to facilitate this. To be completed within six months.
