



SCHOOL PLACE PLANNING STATEMENT 2023/24 Executive Summary

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Torbay Local Authority (LA) has a statutory duty to ensure all children of school age can access education. Pupil projections are prepared to determine the future school population for the area so that the LA can plan to ensure it has sufficient capacity. The projections are estimates based on historical trends; the assumption is that patterns and trends affecting current pupil numbers in the area will continue as they are. The projections are updated bi-annually to ensure they reflect current data and local intelligence.
- 2. This Executive Summary provides an overview of the current and projected pupil numbers for Torbay across the primary and secondary sectors. It is broken down into three Planning Areas: Torquay, Paignton and Brixham, providing an overview of the current projections, implications for school places and the LA's actions for managing future provision.

Proposed housing developments in Torquay with an anticipated pupil yield above historical level:

Edginswell	approx. 550 homes - mixture of starter and family homes
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OVERVIEW

- Current projections show there is sufficient capacity at primary level for the foreseeable future; however, the LA is considering how to manage the increasing levels of surplus.
- There is still potential growth from the Edginswell development.
- There is short-term pressure in the secondary sector as the LA manages large cohorts of pupils alongside the high levels of inward migration to the selective schools.

ACTIONS/PROJECTS

- The LA is continuing discussions with all partners to explore options for temporarily reducing primary capacity, including temporarily reducing planned admission numbers and re-utilising surplus accommodation for the delivery of other key services, including specialist provision.
- The LA is monitoring the proposed Edginswell development to understand likely timescales, delivery rates and impact on current surplus capacity.
- At secondary level, an agreement has been reached with St Cuthbert Maybe School to take a bulge class of 30 pupils in September 2025. The LA is supporting the school with a significant capital investment to ensure it has suitable accommodation; this work completes Autumn 2023. Discussions are underway to find a similar solution for 2026.

Inglewood	370 houses mixture of starter and family homes – planning approved
Collaton Area	335+ houses – pending decision/decision being appealed

OVERVIEW

- Paignton continues to be an area of significant economic investment and large housing developments; however, latest primary projections indicate that there is sufficient capacity to meet current and forecast demand.
- At secondary level, demand exceeds capacity in 2023 and 2025.
- Paignton Academy has been expanded to create an additional 300 secondary places in the area, however, unusually high transfer levels at Year 7 are placing significant pressure on secondary capacity and demand is forecast to exceed capacity in 2023 and 2025.

ACTION/PROJECTS

- The opening of St Michael's Academy provides sufficient primary capacity within the area for the immediate need and creates the required surplus to meet parental preference.
- The LA will monitor delivery of local housing developments, particularly in the Western Corridor, to evaluate their impact on in-migration and the possible need for a second new primary school.
- A site for a new primary school is included in the S106 agreement for Inglewood and the LA will seek to retain that site for as long as possible or until more certainty is known about the growth from new housing.
- The LA has brokered an agreement for Paignton Academy to admit a bulge class in September 2023.
- Options are still being explored for 2025; this could be a combined option to also address Brixham's shortfall.

OVERVIEW

- Brixham continues to face falling primary cohorts in line with the fall in birth rates. With no current or
 proposed housing developments above historical levels, this position is unlikely to change in the foreseeable
 future.
- Some schools have already elected to temporarily reduce their planned admission number to better manage their roll and budgets.
- Place planning at secondary level continues to be challenging due to the high level of inward migration to the Grammar School; the LA is currently projecting a shortfall of capacity in 2023 and 2025.

ACTIONS/PROJECTS

- The LA is continuing to explore options to reduce primary surplus including temporarily reducing planned admission numbers and re-purposing surplus accommodation for the delivery of other key services including specialist provision.
- The LA has brokered an agreement for Brixham College to go above PAN for 2023. This will ensure sufficient capacity for that year.
- Options need to be identified for 2025; this could be a combined option to also address Paignton's shortfall.
