QUESTION 2A

I cannot walk all the way to Palace Avenue, as I am old. Nearer the post office would be better for my bus.

I got a ticket for parking, but there are not enough spaces round here. I only popped in for a minute! I have a wheelchair and it is very difficult to get to top of Palace Avenue.

I have to struggle with all my shopping up to your office, then back again to get the bus.

I walk everywhere, so not much difference to me.

I walk with sticks and your office is out of the way for me. I find it very difficult to walk up the hill and back to town.

I would like a 'one-stop' shop advice hub, located centrally in Torbay, say, in the Victoria Square area. It is not a very spacious room if you have children quite a small building.

It is nowhere near the bus station or any stops. I struggle to walk all the way to the current office.

It is on a hill - no buses.

It is out of the way of all the other shops I use. I am getting too old to walk long distances!

It took me ages to find the Connections office to view plans. No signs! Office is too tucked away and hidden.

It would be great for Age Concern and Connections to be next door to each other. Most convenient.

It would be helpful to have signposting from Palace Avenue, as the location is not on a main street - location itself is fine. CAB

It's a bit out of the way, would be better if more centrally located. Info area seems a bit cramped.

It's too out of the way.

Location & nowhere to park

Location not ideal for disabled persons, not adjacent to bus route, narrow stairway is a huge obstacle to overcome. Disparate organisation, no information sharing on my immediate level.
