Framework:

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1. What we are trying to achieve

1.1 To review Torbay Council's Street Trading Policy, following a request from the Licensing Committee.

2. Recommendation(s) for decision

2.1 It is recommended that:

No alteration to Torbay Council's Street Trading Policy or Schedule is made at the present time.

3. Key points and reasons for recommendations

- 3.1 During 2008, a Member working party undertook a review of Street Trading in Torbay. Subsequent to this, a new Street Trading Policy was agreed by the full Licensing Committee on 2nd October 2008 and a new Schedule of street designations was agreed by the full Licensing Committee on 4th December 2008. In minute 459 on the 4th December 2008 the Licensing Committee requested "that the Street Trading Policy be reviewed in April 2010".
- 3.2 This review has been undertaken by Officers. The outcome of this review recommends that no changes are made to the existing Street Trading Policy for four reasons.
 - (i) There is no evidence to suggest that the new policy has hindered the

- development of markets away from Torquay Town centre,
- (ii) That area was always going to be subject to its own review once any Business Improvement District was agreed.
- (iii) That the broader interpretation of 'Street Trading', to include face painters, tattooists, and pedlars has broadly succeeded in removing these types of sellers from the streets and town centres of Torbay;
- (iv) That the Department of Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS), is undertaking a review of Street Trading and Pedlar legislation, which is due to be reported on later this year

Supporting information to Report 134/2010

A1. Introduction and history

- A1.1 During 2008 a Member working party undertook a review of the Street Trading in Torbay. Subsequent to this, a new Street Trading Policy was agreed by the full Licensing Committee on 2nd October 2008 and a new Schedule of street designations was agreed by the full Licensing Committee on 4th December 2008. In minute 459 on the 4th December 2008 the Licensing Committee requested "that the Street Trading Policy be reviewed in April 2010".
- A1.2 The Street Trading Policy has been reviewed by Officers and it is recommended that it remains unchanged at this time. The reasons are that:
 - (i) there is no evidence that it is at present providing an obstacle to the development of street markets away from Torquay Town Centre.
 - (ii) that the Town Centre Company will recommend any necessary changes to the Schedule of Designated streets within the Business Improvement District within the next 4 months and it would be sensible to wait for those recommendations,
 - (iii) that the broader interpretation of Street Trading, to include face painters, tattooists, and pedlars has broadly succeeded in removing these types of sellers from the streets and town centres of Torbay, and
 - (iv) The Department of Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS), is undertaking a review of Street Trading and Pedlar legislation, which is due to be reported on later this year.
- A1.3 As part of the Department of Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) review, they have already undertaken one consultation exercise. A further consultation exercise will take place later this year, before firm proposals are drawn up.
