REVIEW OF THE PROVISION OF GRANTS IN LIEU OF RENT

- 1. Report O SB/5/04 containing the recommendations arising from the review of the provision of grants in lieu of rentwas presented to the Executive at its meeting held on 30th March 2004. Consideration of the Reportwas defensed at that meeting and the O verview and Scruthy Board were requested to consider with ening the scope of the review to take account of the matters raised at the meeting.
- 2. In order to progress the Review, the Panelinvited the Executive Members for the Environment and Finance to meet with it to discuss the concerns of the Executive. A further meeting of the Panelwas then held in order for the Panel to determine how it would wish to progress the matter.
- 3. The Panelbelieve that it has met the request of the Executive to draw up a policy for determining the level of grant to be offered to organisations to offset the market rent of premises let to them by the Council. It therefore confirms its recommendations to the Executive as set out in Report OSB/5/04.
- 4. However, the Panelfeelix would be inappropriate at the present time to continue with the additional review agreed by the Overview and Scruthy Board of examining the processes and procedures in place to determ ine applications for grants across the Authority. Given this conclusion, the Panelwould like to draw to the attention of the Executive to a num berof points which were raised during the review but which were not included within the report as they fellouts de of the scope.
- 5. There is a need to raise awareness within the community of Torbay of the availability of grants from a wide range of non-Council sources. Awareness could be raised by holding an open day or sem in arforvoluntary and community organisations.
- 6. Further, if all councilgrants were to be administered from a single point within the Authority, this would enable a knowledge base to be established so that, if the Councilwas notable to offer a grant in particular circum stances, the applicant could be signposted to other possible sources of funding.
- 7. It is suggested that a lapplications for Council grants should be determ ined by a sub-group of the Executive. This would mean that consideration could be given to the num berof grants which organisations were receiving from the Council.
- 8. On a widerpoint, the Panelfeelthat when the Executive asks the Overview and Scrutiny Board to undertake policy development work on its behalf, it should be clearabout the objectives and the scope of the work.
