7. Background

7.1 With the introduction of the Cultural Services Business Plan and the proposed new Seaside Award criteria and also the adoption of the ENCAM's (formerly the "Tidy Britain Group") Beach Management Programme, it is necessary to have a Beach Strategy in place.

- 7.2 As a result of the Comprehensive Performance Inspection in 2002, a review of all the Council's Coastal Strategies was highlighted as an improvement action.
- 7.3 Within the Beach Strategy a number of development issues have been highlighted including proposals for the development of Goodrington Beach and Young's Park also to develop Quay West as a family destination.
- 7.4 The Strategy includes Disability Discrimination Act issues, which need to be considered as future development items.
- 7.5 The Beach Strategy recognises the Torbay Coast and Countryside Trust's Biodiversity Plan and natural environment issues and is written in compliment these documents.
- 7.6 The development of the Beach Strategy addressed customer expectation through Market research, which was carried out throughout the season in 2004.
