Hi Mandy,

I thought it might be useful to provide you a very brief note on the Las Iguanas portfolio.

They currently have 38 premises across the United Kingdom.

Our statiscal assessment is that:-

- 16 of these premises are High Street with mixed use such as offices and residential above or nearby.
- 12 are based on Leisure complexes (8 of which are mixed use with offices and residential nearby).
- 2 are on out of town leisure complexes, one of those having a hotel above.
- 7 are based within existing shopping centres with one other unit being situated within a mixed residential and retail development.

I hope this is useful and Matthew will be relying on these stats during the proceedings at the Licensing Committee hearing, so would be grateful if these are included in the papers on the day.

Thank you for your letter dated 13 June 1995 and the possibility of you making a general statement regarding the use of strengthened glasses in our night clubs.

This initiative began in 1993 when I supported the Torbay Borough Council's decision to add a condition whereby all drinking glasses in use in night clubs should be of a type, when smashed would fragment and not leave jagged edges. Only one club in Torbay dissented and went to Law in objection. As a result the condition placed on all premises with the benefit of a Special Hours Certificate (those that stay open after normal permitted hours) was amended to say all glasses in which drinks are served shall be of strengthened glass and no drinks shall be served in a bottle from which it is intended that a customer will drink.

This condition became enforceable from December 1994 and to date the police have had no reported assaults involving the use of bottles and glasses. I would like to publicise this success. I feel added weight would be given if the Hospital felt that there had been a decrease in the amount of patients that you are dealing with who have injuries caused by a bottle or a glass that occurred in one of Torbay's night clubs.

A general enquiry to this effect has been made by one of my officers to Mr Hugh Walters'office. However, I am sorry to hear that Mr Walters is indisposed and we were not able to gain any information.

I look forward to hearing from you and should you require any further information please do not hesitate to contact me.

For your information, Torbay Safer Communities has kindly agreed to subsidise the cost of the jackets, but there will be some cost to be met by you. My licensing team will be available at the event and I have asked them to organise the eventual order and collect your eventual contribution.

You now have the wearing of high visibility jackets as a condition of your Premises Licence and your positive participation in this project is expected.

I believe that these jackets will not only make your doorstaff more readily identifiable, but will help to make our public feel much safer when they are enjoying our night-time economy and will help to prevent crime and disorder.

All drinks to be served in shatterproof glasses and no alcohol to be served in glass bottles from which it is intended or likely that a person shall drink.

If there is a requirement placed upon a premises licence for Security Industry Authority (SIA) trained stewards then the ration of stewards to customers on the premises will be no less than 1:75.

Persons under the age of 18 when accompanied by an adult can use the Pavement Cafe area from 0800 – 2300 hrs.

All drinks must be served in toughened, strengthened, polycarbonate or plastic glasses. No alcohol shall be served in glass bottles from which it is intended or likely that customers shall drink from 2000 onwards.

No person under the age of 18 shall be permitted into the premises after 8 pm.
