### Introduction:

The Council's Constitution, Local Protocol on Relations between Leader and Political Group states (para 6.3):

Each political group will be entitled to nominate members to a proportionate number of seats on outside organisations. However, where the outside organisation requests a specific role (e.g. a relevant Cabinet Member) the Council should accede to the request other than in exceptional circumstances. Appointments to outside organisations are made every four years following a local government election and will not normally be reviewed after a change of political balance during the four year period. The Chief Executive has delegated authority to determine any new appointments within the four year period.

### **Political Balance:**

The Council makes a total of 90 appointments to organisations and associations. Those organisations which have requested a specific role are shown in brackets in the table below. The remaining number of appointments is 33 and the political balance calculations are set out below:
