1.	Apologies for Absence	Action
	Apologies were received from Mr M Ould, Mr C Baker, Mr G Jennings, Mr D	
	Musgrove, Cllr M Hytche, Clare Rugg, Marshall Ritchie and Ms H Meacock.	

2.	Minutes of the last meeting	Action
	It was agreed that the minutes of the last meeting on the 21st May 2013, were a	
	true and accurate record of that meeting.	

3.	Matters Arising	Action
a)	Blue Sea Food Company	Action
,	KM reported that JT had written to the company with a list of complaints and that despite assurances improvements had not been made including for example lorries reversing without banksmen, foul language, smell, parking, waste etc. The business was also having a detrimental effect on other harbour businesses. KM was instructed to write to the company reminding them of the need to remove their container in December 2013. KM to also check that the planning enforcement notice had been served.	KM
b)	Ferry Pontoons KM reported that the Brixham pontoon was operational but that the Torquay facility had not been handed over as 'snagging' issues were still ongoing. KM explained that by the year end there would also be access gates and fencing to control the use of the pontoon and prevent inappropriate access to and from the Town Dock. He also anticipated that passenger signage would also be erected. KM advised that the revised tender documents for the frequent ferry service would be sent out later in September. WB expressed a concern for the safety of vessels given that there were sharp edges on the new pontoon. KM indicated that his first priority was to protect the harbour infrastructure but he agreed to investigate the scale of the problem.	KM
c)	Marine Conservation Zones KM reported that the Minister responsible had met with members of the British Ports Association and had accepted that the whole of the MCZ issue was a bit of a mess. It was also noted that the Welsh Assembly would not be adopting MCZs. It was suggested that not all of the 31 proposed zones would be adopted. KM continued by stressing that the shipping industry as a whole were to lobby the government during the forthcoming Maritime week. In summary KM concluded that all that could be done, had been done, to highlight the potential implications of an MCZ designation to the economy ,maritime events, the fishing industry ,cruise ship visits and leisure boating as a whole.	
d)	Parking Enforcement The Forum was reminded about the background to this matter. JT reported that the proposed contract with AS Parking Ltd had now been signed, staff trained and signage was awaited for Paignton harbour. JT stressed that the businesses, which on the whole preferred this option where harbour staff policed parking rather than current arrangements, would be informed of the implementation date. CC asked if there would be a relaxation in winter evenings. Both JT and KM responded that harbour staff attendance in the evenings would be dependent on problems arising. KM added that a similar system was also to be adopted at	
	Torquay harbour, especially at the end of South Pier, adjacent to the entrance to Beacon Quay. Page 47	JT/KM

3.	Matters Arising	Action
e)	Harbour website KM announced that the site was much improved and urged Forum members to view. He indicated that he hadn't received a great deal of feedback and that the take up in e-mail notification had been poor. KM reminded everyone that they could register online to receive Harbour Masters Notices, Newsletters, etc.	To note ALL
f)	Torquay Harbour fairway/Trinity House KM updated the Forum on his discussions with Trinity House on this matter. Trinity House had no objections to the starboard hand buoy being marked "5 Knots". KM pointed out that recorded incidents in the harbour entrance were minimal with only two reported so far this year. WB pointed out his ongoing concern about craft using the fairway buoy as a point to accelerate and decelerate, causing a significant amount of wash and subsequent risk. Following considerable debate and despite the lack of recorded incident data it was agreed to place another starboard hand buoy, marked "5 Knots", on the existing 5 knot line. It was also agreed that if necessary a port hand mark should be installed.	KM
g)	Quayside angling KM stated that the harbour staff aimed to act swiftly to control any unauthorised angling but if the problems persisted at Torquay he would install prevention measures similar to those used at Paignton harbour. JT stated that the installation seemed to have resolved the matter at Paignton.	KM
h)	Port Masterplan PL advised the Forum that the Port Masterplan had now been completed and the Interreg funding had been agreed to meet 50% of the cost.	

4.	Capital Works	Action
a)	Haldon Pier – update KM reported that the works to the inside of the Pier should resume over the winter months using the small amount of funding that was still available.	
b)	Princess Pier – update KM reminded the Forum that all of the works to the concrete part of the Pier were subject to an Environment Agency (EA) funding. KM stressed that the EA were now less responsive to large capital funding bids	
c)	Torquay inner harbour pontoon berths KM informed the Forum that the MMO licence had been applied for and that the contract would go out to tender in October. If bids were within the budget then the project should be operational by 1 st April 2014.	KM

5.	Town Dock	Action
	KM informed the Forum that 8 new service bollards were to be installed (8 water	
	points and 32 power sockets). It was highlighted that these additional facilities had	
	been installed at the request of users and KM could not rule out an increase in	
	charges to reflect the improvements.	KM

6.	Tor Bay Harbour Business Risk Register	Action
	KM gave the Forum an overview of the contents of the Business Risk Register	
	stressing that it dealt with strategic risks and not operational risks. The Register had been circulated to the Harbour Committee. Forum members were welcome to offer any comments.	ALL

7.	Maritime Events 2013 & 2014	Action
	KM stated that there were only a few events remaining this year and that	
	information was being gathered for the 2014 Maritime Events schedule. The	
	Mayor (GO) complimented the harbour staff on the professional way in which they	
	had supported the numerous events throughout the summer, with any difficulties	
	being successfully resolved as they arose.	

KM made the Forum aware that Torbay Council had to make significant savings over the next two years and whilst there was no immediate demand on the harbour budget there was a clear indication that the Harbour Authority business unit would be expected to assist wherever possible. He emphasised that there was no intention to link this with harbour charges. KM suggested that the recommendation for harbour charges, in general, would be an increase in line with inflation (currently circa 3%), although the increase might be higher where facilities had clearly improved with new investment i.e. the Town Dock and passenger vessel charges. KM continued by stressing that his recommendation would be that any payments
to the Council's general fund budget should be in the form of one off annual contributions through 2014/15 and 2015/16 and not a permanent arrangement. His view was that any significant contribution over and above the current arrangement was probably unsustainable. KM indicated that the Harbour Committee's Budget Review Working Party would consider a range of measures that could deliver short term savings or increased income that could translate into a larger contribution to the Council over the next two years. One example KM provided was taking on the responsibility for the harbourside public toilets. KM did warn the Forum that the current budget forecast was for a deficit and that the harbour's capital project list

3.	Matters Arising	Action
а)	IFCA Byelaw changes MM, from the IFCA, explained to the Forum that they are looking to bring out new byelaws that will allow easier and quicker management of the fishery and can be changed in the light of new data. This is to be done by introducing permitting byelaws and fishermen that are issued with a permit will have to agree to the terms and conditions of the permit. The final draft byelaws are to go to the Minister for approval next month.	
b)	Electric Recharge project PL informed the Forum that the MFV basin and the crane pier both now had the facilities to recharge all electricity used. The new system has had a few snagging problems but is now working well. The Harbour Authority hope that the new system will reduce electricity costs by as much as a third.	
c)	Latent Defects PL stated that the cost of putting right the remaining defects on the new Fish Quay building would be funded by the Harbour Authority. All the quotes for the work had now been received and it was expected that the defects will be resolved before the next Liaison Forum meeting.	PL/DB
d)	Torbay Lass PL informed the Forum that the Torbay Lass project is being led by Trinity Sailing. PL explained that the Harbour Authority is in support of the venture but was concerned that the boat could become a liability. Consequently the owners of the vessel will sign a legal document to say that if the final funding decision is 'no' then they will take the vessel away. If the Lottery funding application is successful then a full time funding officer will be appointed to oversee the financial aspects of the project. The final Lottery decision will not be made until June 2014, however, if the first round funding application is approved the vessel will move to Brixham in the next few weeks. KM asked about the final refit site for Torbay Lass and challenged the suitability of Oxen Cove as a location given the other pressures for use of that space.	PL

a)	Fenders, Capping & Ladders Project PL reported that the fenders, capping & ladders works were underway and on schedule. Most of the fenders were being replaced or repaired, the damaged capping was being refurbished and new ladders were being installed around the MFV basin. DB informed that a new and improved landing davit will soon be installed. KM suggested that written confirmation of the agreed location for the davit would be required from BTA prior to installation. b)	Victoria Breakwater PL reported that after a full structural survey of the Breakwater, repair works of around £150,000 had been identified. The Harbour Authority and the Council have since secured funding for this work from the Environment Agency and the repairs should be undertaken in 2014/15. Page 52	EA

d)	Ice Plant Rick Smith from the Brixham Trawler Agents explained to the Liaison Forum about the new Ice Plant that is soon to be installed. Teignmouth Marine Services have been contracted to oversee the works and the project is due to be completed in a couple of months. The new unit will be more efficient in terms of both electricity and water consumption.	

5.	Fish Market Advisory Group	Action
	PL informed the Forum that a new group had been set up, made up of tenants in and around the new Fish Market. The purpose of the group is to address Fish Market management issues including any maintenance issues that arise. The first meeting was held last month and was deemed by all to be a success. It is expected that the meetings will take place every 3 months.	PL

	PL reported that this matter had been raised by Dave Saunders who was concerned over the lack of staff on the slipways taking in launch & recovery fees and collecting visitor income. PL stated that the Harbour Authority had a member of staff retire last year who used to collect the monies from the slipways and he was struggling to fill the void. He went on to say that he would carry out an investigation and a cost benefit analysis over the winter period to see how to improve the situation in the future. KM reported that the income was currently down by some £10k on last year.	PL
