1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application, in respect of the Premise detailed above, for a Variation to a Premises Licence.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objective of "The Prevention of Public Nuisance".
- 1.4 The matter must be considered on its own merits having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written Representations if all parties have agreed that a hearing is not necessary. Having regard to the Representations and issues arising, a decision must be made to take such steps as are necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. These are:-
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence, or
 - (b) reject the application in whole or in part, or
 - (c) to grant the application as applied for

For this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

1.5 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Interested Parties and Responsible Authorities at the determination of the matter.

2. Introduction

2.1 An application has been made under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 (hereinafter referred to as 'the Act') for a Variation to a Premises Licence. Details of the application are shown in Appendix 1. Only the relevant pages of the application are shown.

A brief description of the proposed Variation is as follows:-

To increase the hours for the Supply of Alcohol in the lower ground floor café to allow the Supply of Alcohol from 10:00 until 01:00 seven days a week. This café is presently licensed for the Supply of Alcohol from 11:00 until 19:00 seven days a week.

To licence the outdoor area adjacent to the clubhouse for the Supply of Alcohol from 10:00 until 22:00 seven days a week.

The application states the premises will be open from 06:00 until 01.30 seven days a week but the grounds are open 24 hours a day.

The applicant has proposed to remove the following conditions:-

Annexe 2, Prevention of Crime and Disorder, condition 1 "Intoxicating liquor shall only be served between 12 midnight and 01.00am to persons attending a bona fide private function".

Annexe 2, Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Condition 2 "The clubhouse shall only remain open between 12.30am and 01.30am for the purpose of hosting a bona fide private function and there shall be no admission or re-admission after midnight".

The applicant has proposed to amend Annexe 2, Prevention of Crime and Disorder Condition 5

From:-

"Alcoholic and soft drinks will only be served in plastic or toughened glass in the café area".

To:-

"Alcoholic and soft drinks will only be served in plastic or toughened glass in the café and outdoor areas. No glass shall be permitted around the swimming pool."

2.2 A copy of the current premises licence showing the licensable activities, timings and conditions is shown at Appendix 2 of this report.

The exemptions under the Live Music Act 2012 apply to this licence.

2.3 Torbay Council as the Licensing Authority is satisfied that the Applicant has met the administrative requirements of Section 35(1) of the Act but is unable to issue the Variation to the Premises Licence, as relevant Representations have been received from members of the public and from a Responsible Authority. The Licensing Authority is also satisfied that the Representations were received within the appropriate time-scale, have not been subsequently withdrawn and are not vexatious or frivolous.

We have received a Representation from Public Protection in relation to the Licensing Objective "The Prevention of Public Nuisance". This is shown as Appendix 3. Some additional maps have been attached to this Representation to assist the committee.

We have accepted 6 Representations from 9 members of the public who are objecting to this application. The Representations relate to the Licensing Objective "The Prevention of Public Nuisance". These are shown as Appendix 4

There have been no Representations received from any other Responsible Authority or any other Interested Party other than those mentioned above.

- 2.4 The Licensing Authority is required to conduct a hearing by the provisions of Section 35(3) unless all parties agree that this is not necessary.
- 2.5 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representations and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.6 If the application is refused, in whole or in part, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 1 of Schedule 5, to the Applicant.
- 2.7 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 4(2) of Schedule 5 to :-
 - (a) The applicant for the variation of the licence against any decision to modify the conditions
 - (b) Any person who made a relevant representation in relation to the application who desires to contend
 - (i) that any variation made ought not to have been made, or
 - (ii) that, when varying the licence, the Licensing Authority ought to have modified the conditions of the licence or ought to have modified them in a different way.
- 2.8 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' Court may:-
 - (a) dismiss the appeal,
 - (b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or
 - (c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court,
 - and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.



In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

MANDATORY CONDITION: WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- 1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3) (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:

 (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5) (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6) The responsible person must ensure that:-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is

available to customers in the following measures:-

- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (DxV)

Where:-

(i) P is the permitted price

- (iii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence:-

(i) The holder of the premises licence

- (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that subparagraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEXE 2

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. Intoxicating liquor shall only be served between 12 midnight and 01.00am to persons attending a bona fide private function.
- 2. The clubhouse shall only remain open between 12.30am and 01.30am for the purpose of hosting a bona fide private function and there shall be no admission or re-admission after 12 midnight.

- Licensing Act 2003 shall apply.
- CCTV will be installed and working to the satisfaction of the Police and Local Authority and recordings will be maintained for 30 days.
- 5. Alcoholic and soft drinks will only be served in plastic or toughened glass in the cafe area.
- 6. All bottles and glasses will be removed from public areas as soon as possible after they are empty or finished with.

Public Safety

- The admission limit previously imposed in respect of the Show Bar by the Public Entertainment Licence shall be retained in respect of the area.
- 2. Licensing Act 2003 shall apply.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- No recorded music shall be played after 22.00 hours at any regulated entertainment which takes places outside the main club building.
- Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause persons in the neighbourhood to be unreasonably disturbed. Noise should not be audible within any noise sensitive premises with windows open for normal ventilation, especially after 23.00 hours. The criteria applied, from boundary to the nearest residential property are:-
 - (i) Before 23.00 hours Noise emanating from the premises shall not be clearly distinguishable above other noise.
 - (ii) After 23.00 hours Noise emanating from the premises shall not be distinguishable above background levels of noise.
 - (iii) The Local Authority shall reserve the right in cases of tonal noise and where premises are attached to others (i.e. semis and terraced properties) to make further assessments from within the residential property.
- 3. The volume of amplified sound used in connection with the entertainment provided shall at all times be under the control of the licensee/management and the controlling mechanism shall be operated from a part of the premises not accessible to the public.
- After 23.00 hours windows shall be kept shut during any amplified entertainment and live music to reduce noise breakout.
- There shall be no outside recorded music after 22.00 hours, except incidential background music.
- 6. Licensing Act 2003 shall apply.

The Protection of Children From Harm

- Licensing Act 2003 shall apply.
- The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy and any individual who appears to be under the age of 25 will be required to produce an approved form of photographic identification as outlined within the Torbay Council's Licensing Statement of Principles.
- No persons under the age of 18 years shall be permitted in the area immediately adjacent to the bar.





- Hoburne Devon Bay is large holiday park situated in Goodrington, Paignton. The park has been built on the slopes and summit of a hill which is surrounded by two valleys, one to the east and one to the west.
- 2. As normal with holiday parks of this nature and size there is a focus on providing regular family orientated entertainments for guests and lodge owners.
- 3. A dedicated licenced entertainment complex is situated just below the summit on the eastern slope of the park overlooking Clennon valley.
- 4. The applicant in making this variation application seeks two objectives:-
 - To licence an outdoor beer garden with a terminal hour of 22:00, 7 days a weeks for all existing activities.
 - To remove a non-standard timing condition on part of the main entertainment building to align with existing terminal hour of 1am, 7 days a week for all licensed activities.
- 5. The applicant's agent consulted and provided all responsible authorities with a draft applications for comment before submission of the final application.

- 6. I do not believe the proposed variations to the existing licence will seek to undermine the licensing objective the Prevention of Public Nuisance and therefore did not offer any further comments, observations or objections.
- However during consultation a number of representations have been received and accepted by the Torbay Councils Licensing team from residents who live in Clennon Valley area.
- 8. For the most part there has been a misunderstanding of the changes the applicant seeks to make to the existing licence. All residents do mention disturbance from recorded music and amplified speech as a current source of nuisance. The alleged nuisance is a result of licensable activities currently authorised by the premises licence.
- 9. A check of records held by the licensing team shows one complaint of noise in the last 10 years. The complaint was made in July 2018 and when investigated highlighted a failure to keep windows and doors closed that look out over Clennon Valley. This failure was swiftly rectified and no further complaints have been made to the Authority.
- 10. The Authority does not hold any evidence other than one complaint to support the resident's allegations of nuisance. However, it is reasonably foreseeable if sound levels are not adequately managed, noise breakout from the entertainment complex does have the ability to cause nuisance. This is compounded by the topography of the land the park is sited on.
- 11. Further it is normal for holiday parks, during peak times, to provide some form of entertainment on a daily basis. With frequent entertainment combined with topography and prevailing wind direction it is very likely if not managed noise from the entertainment complex could cause a public nuisance.
- 12. Fortunately the residents report airborne propagation of sound and this is relatively straightforward to correct.
- 13. At the time of submitting this representation I am currently in constructive dialogue with the applicants agent and I fully expect by the time of the hearing I will be in position to update members of our agreed position.
- 14. An agreement will provide residents the reassurance and confidence in the applicants operation going forward.

Please advise regarding what decisions are to be made.






