Decision:

That the application for a Premises Licence in respect of The John Bull, 68-80 Chatto Road, Torquay be approved as applied for, subject to the following amended and additional conditions:

- 1) There shall be a minimum of 3 members of staff on the premises from 9 pm until the premises close on a Friday and Saturday.
- 2) Notices shall be displayed on the exits to remind patrons to leave the premises quickly and quietly, and not to loiter in the premises surrounding area.
- Notices shall be displayed in the premises outside areas, reminding patrons to be respectful towards residents and to keep noise to a minimum so as to not to unreasonably disturb nearby residents.
- 4) Staff shall routinely monitor the outside area after 9 pm, to ensure that nearby residents are not unreasonably disturbed by its patrons, or that patrons are loitering in the premises surrounding area.
- 5) That the designated smoking area shall be located in the area to the left of the cellar doors when exiting the premises, as defined on the premises plan.
- 6) That there shall be no more than 5 patrons permitted in the designated smoking area after 10pm.
- 7) Patrons using the smoking area after 10pm shall be seated.
- 8) Drinks shall not be permitted in the designated smoking area after 10pm,
- 9) The premise designated smoking area shall be routinely monitored after 10pm and any patron causing a nuisance shall be asked to come inside the premises, and where they refuse to do so, they shall be asked to leave the premises immediately.
- 10) Patrons using mobile phones after 10pm shall only be permitted to do so in the designated smoking area.
- 11) The outside seating areas shall be cleared and closed to all patrons by 10pm every night, save for the designated smoking area.

- 12) Patrons shall be encouraged not to use their mobile phones outside the boundary of the premises.
- 13) An incident book shall be kept on the premises, and all incidents and complaints shall be recorded therein and be made available for inspection by an appointed Responsible Authority Officer on request.
- 14) The placing of refuse, such as bottles into receptacles within the premises outside areas, shall not take place between 9 pm and 9 am.
- 15) All external windows and doors shall be closed after 10 pm.
- 16)A written Noise Management Policy must be kept on the premises and reviewed by the Premises Licence Holder annually or sooner, where required, and be made available for inspection by an appointed Responsible Authority Officer on request.

Reasons for Decision:

Having carefully considered all the written and oral Representations, Members resolved to approve the application for a Premises Licence, with the imposition of the amended and additional conditions, as set out above.

In coming to their decision, Members had regard to the proximity of the premises and its neighbouring residential properties, and it being within what is predominantly a residential area; along with the concerns raised by Interested Parties, both in their written and compelling oral Representations by those who attended the Committee hearing, and initially gave serious consideration to refusing this application, as they could not be satisfied in its current form, that the Licensing Objectives would be promoted.

However, as opposed to refusing the Application outright, Members resolved that with the amended and additional conditions which in their deliberation, took careful consideration to craft, resultant of the need to balance the premises intended operation, whilst ensuring promotion of the Licensing Objectives were upheld, and importantly, to address the concerns of those Interested Parties who raised objections, that the premises operation in compliance of those conditions, would promote the Licensing Objectives.

Having been satisfied, on the evidence before them, that historically these premises operations have had a detrimental impact on those living in the immediate vicinity and had undermined the promotion of the Licensing Objectives, and as Members heard, whilst the intended Manager was a previous employee of the premises, Members noted the absence of a Representation from any of the Responsible Authorities. Again, on the evidence before them, Members deduced that such an absence was likely to have been resultant of the lack of complaints and as advocated by one Interested Party, borne out of a fear of reprisal, having experienced conduct by some patrons, which in Members opinion, was wholly unacceptable. In recognising their complaints were valid and that just because they had gone unreported or recorded did not mean they were unjustified, Members were hopeful in granting this application,

and having been present at the Committee hearing and therefore heard what has been said, that the Premises Licence Holder and their intended Manager, will have a zero tolerance to such behaviours and that a banning procedure will be put in place to act as a deterrent, for future unacceptable conduct by its patrons.

On the oral submissions made by the Premises Licence Holder and intended Manager, Members determined it necessary to impose a condition regarding the number of staff being present on the premises on Friday and Saturday nights. Believing that one staff member and the Manager to be too few, when taking into account the amount of monitoring of the outside area the Manager said she would be undertaking. Members were also mindful that should there be an incident on what will be their busiest nights, at least one member of staff would be involved with the second serving patrons, thus leaving no one to maintain the level of monitoring the Manager had committed to.

On the evidence before them, Members noted that the outside area of the premises was of considerable concern to Interested Parties, and they themselves had concerns too. Members determined, with the offer of the Premises Licence Holder, that by relocating the designated smoking area, and subsequently limiting the number of patrons and closing other outside areas at 10pm. this should reduce potential noise nuisance caused to nearby residential properties and promote the Licencing Objective, 'The Prevention of Public Nuisance'.

In conclusion, and whilst Members were reassured by the Premises Licence Holder and Managers commitment to engage with residents to address complaints as they arise, Members noted that a Review of the Premises Licence can be sought by any Interested Party or Responsible Authority should issues arise, as a result of this grant of a Premises Licence.

1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application for a new Premises Licence, in respect of the Premise detailed above.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives the "Protection of Children from Harm".
- 1.4 The matter must be considered on its merits, having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written Representation. A decision must be made, having considered the Representations, either:-
 - (a) to grant the licence subject to
 - (i) such conditions as are consistent with the submitted operating Schedule modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (ii) any condition which must under Section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence:
 - (Such conditions may differ in respect of different parts of the Premises and/or different activities).
 - (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the Premises Supervisor;
 - (d) to reject the application.

1.5 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Applicant, Responsible Authorities and all Interested Parties, following the determination of the matter.

2. Application

2.1 An application has been made under Section 17 of the Act for a Premises Licence to permit licensable activities at the Premise detailed above. Details of the relevant pages of the application are shown in Appendix 1.

A brief description of the application, is as follows:-

The provision of Live Music from 1000 hrs to 2200 hrs on Mondays to Thursdays, and Sundays, and from 1000 hrs to 2300 hrs on Fridays and Saturdays, indoors and outdoors.

The provision of Recorded Music from 1000 hrs to 2200 hrs on Mondays to Thursdays, and Sundays, and from 1000 hrs to 2300 hrs on Fridays and Saturdays, indoors and outdoors.

The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises from 1000 hrs to 2200 hrs on Mondays to Thursdays, and Sundays, and from 1000 hrs to 2230 hrs on Fridays and Saturdays.

The opening hours of the premises between 0900 hrs to 2200 hrs on Mondays to Thursdays, and Sundays, and from 0900 hrs to 2300 hrs on Fridays and Saturdays.

The Applicant has given the following description of the premises: -

"The Barton Acorn Youth, Community and Sports Centre currently has an underutilised café/hospitality area with adjoining function spaces, and further access to an enclosed community garden. The Centre is undergoing refurbishment and would like to make full use of this space and what it is able to offer to hirers and community events. We would like to be able to offer alcoholic beverages and feel this could help the Centre in terms of fundraising and boosting income. Ideally we would like to licence the whole premises including the garden"

The plan accompanying the application is shown in Appendix 2.

2.2 The Council as the Licensing Authority is satisfied that the Applicant has met the administrative requirements of Section 17(5) but is unable to issue the Licence, as relevant Representations have been received. The Licensing Authority is also satisfied that the Representations have been received within the appropriate time scale and have not been subsequently withdrawn.

We have received 1 Representation from one Responsible Authority, Childrens Services, in relation to the Protection of Children from Harm. This is shown at Appendix 3.

No Representations have been received from any other Responsible Authority or any Interested Party.

- 2.3 The Authority is required to conduct a hearing under the provisions of Section 18(3) unless all parties agree that this is not necessary.
- 2.4 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representation and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.5 If the application is refused, in whole or in part, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 1 of Schedule 5, to the Applicant.
- 2.6 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 5 to :-
 - (a) The holder of the licence against any decision
 - (i) to impose conditions on the licence, or
 - (ii) to take any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify a person as Premises Supervisor.
 - (b) Any person who made a relevant Representation who desires to contend
 - (i) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (ii) that, on granting the licence, the Licensing Authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions or taken any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify person as Premises Supervisor.
- 2.7 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' Court may:-
 - (a) dismiss the appeal,
 - (b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or
 - (c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court,
 - and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

- ii. The hours and activities permitted by the premises licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003 the conditions attached.

- iv. Recognising the signs of drunkenness.

- Training will be recorded in documentary form and will be refreshed at no greater than 12 month intervals.

- Training records will be retained for 12 months.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises shall operate and maintain a digital colour CCTV system to the satisfaction of the Police and Local Authority. As a minimum, the system must:

- i. Cover all public areas of the licensed premises, including entry and exit points. This also includes any outside areas under the control of the premises licence holder
- ii. Record clear images permitting the identification of individuals and enable facial recognition images (a clear head and shoulder image) of every person entering and leaving in any light condition.
- iii. Continually record whilst the premises are open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises.
- iv. Have a constant and accurate time and date generation.
- v. Store recordings for a minimum period of 14 days with date and time stamping.
- vi. Viewable copies of recordings will be provided on request to the police and local authority officers as soon as is reasonably practicable and in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 (or any replacement legislation) vii. The CCTV system will be capable of downloading images to a recognisable viewable format.
- DPS and/or the premises licence holder will be responsible for conducting dynamic risk assessments for the requirement of additional door staff especially during busy periods, public holidays, or any other events such as sporting events or festivals.
- The following details for each door supervisor will be contemporaneously entered into a register kept for that purpose:
- II. SIA licence/badge number, and registration number of any accreditation scheme recognised by the Licensing Authority (including expiry date of that registration or accreditation).

- III. The date and time they began their duty.
- IV. The date and time they completed their duty.
- V. The full details of any agency through which they have been allocated to work at the premises if appropriate.
- The register shall be available for inspection and copying at all reasonable times by an authorised officer of a responsible authority.
- The register will be kept at the premises at all times and be so maintained as to enable an authorised officer to establish the particulars of all door supervisors engaged at the premises during the period of not less than 12 months prior to the request.
- Staff will be expected to report all crime to local police and to keep an incident diary.

An incident log shall be kept and maintained at the premises which will include a log of the following, including pertinent details (select from the following):

- i. Any incidents of disorder or of a violent or anti-social nature
- ii. All crimes reported to the venue, or by the venue to the police.
- iii. All ejections of patrons.
- iv. Any complaints received.
- v. Seizures of drugs or offensive weapons.
- vi. Any faults in the CCTV system.
- vii. Any visits by a responsible authority (under the Licensing Act 2003) or emergency service.
- Records must be completed within 24 hours of any incident, and will contain the time and date, the nature of the incident, the people involved, the action taken and details of the person responsible for the management of the premises at the time of the incident.
- The logs shall be kept for at least 12 months following the date of entry and be made available for inspection and copying upon request of an authorised officer of a responsible authority.
- A written drugs policy is in force at the premises with the objective of securing, as far as reasonably practicable, the safety of patrons and others attending the premises.

c) Public safety

A trained member of staff is required to be on the premises at all times and event runners are expected to have the appropriate experience/qualifications and certificate(s) to validate their activities.

Hazardous and dangerous items including equipment and chemicals will not be kept in areas where the public have access.

Appropriate health and safety signage will be used when and where required.

Firefighting equipment and routes will be routinely checked to ensure exits are not left obstructed and are functioning.

Adequate procedures will be implemented to ensure overcrowding (such as that which may cause injury through crushing) does not occur in any part of the premises by:

- i. Adhering to capacity limits.
- ii. limiting entry during busy periods.
- iii. By employing adequate supervision to manage and control the situation.
- iv. Provide adequate seating and/or waiting areas.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The Centre will foster a welcoming, community friendly environments

Staff will be trained to ask patrons to leave respectfully and quietly.

Staff will be trained to be vigilant against:

- i. Loitering
- ii. Noise pollution
- iii. The potential for littering
- iv. Antisocial behaviour.

Staff will maintain external areas of the premises.

Clear and legible notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and to leave the vicinity as quickly and quietly as possible.

Should issues arise, staff will be deployed as stewards in hi-vis outside the premises in the car park and along the residential exit/entry road (Lummation Cross) to ensure visitors leave respectfully.

e) The protection of children from harm

There will be in place a written age verification policy in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol, which will specify a Challenge 25 proof of age requirement.

Staff working at the premises must ask individuals who appear to be under 25 years of age, attempting to purchase alcohol, to produce identification. The only acceptable identification documents will be:

- A photo driving licence
- A passport
- An identification card carrying the PASS hologram

Unless such identification is produced the sale of alcohol must be refused.

This policy will include documented steps taken to prevent adults from purchasing alcohol for or on behalf of children under 18 and staff training will include guidance on how to deal with a suspected proxy sale.

Access to harmful materials and substances will be controlled by making them difficult to access or closely monitored.

Staff will raise concerns to management, the relevant services and/or police, should there be cause for concern in terms of the welfare of minors on the site.

Frequent patrols will enable staff to be maintain a clean and tidy environment, for the safety of public to use at all times.





Good morning,

As a responsible body, Children's Services would like to make representation in respect of this application. This representation is being made in relation to the national licensing objective, the protection of children from harm, on the following basis:

- The specifics of the lease relates to use of these premises as a Youth, Community and Sports Centre, with no other type of use endorsed without the express consent of the Council. As a Youth and Community and Sports Centre which will be delivering youth activity specifically between the hours of 5pm and 11pm, there is a concern that the licencing application and use of the premises to sell alcohol could pose a risk to those young people accessing the venue at that time. This is particularly pertinent as it is highly likely that many of those young people accessing this activities will be vulnerable young people.
- The application is for licencing seven days a week, 10am-10pm, with an
 understanding that the license is to allow the centre to hold functions such as
 weddings, which are likely to take place over the weekend and evenings, times
 when a significant schedule of specific youth activity should be taking place.
 Again, this links to the specific conditions of the lease and the use of the premises
 as a Youth, Community and Sports Centre.
- The application comments about installing CCTV which has not been context of the primary use of the centre being for young people, and the associated issues of consent and the storage of images captured.
- The Acorn Youth and Community Centre is situated within the Barton with Watcombe ward. This is the second highest ward across Torbay in respect of contacts received within the Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub. In addition, there are higher number of children subject to child in need or child protection planning within this ward than other areas of Torquay and wider Torbay. This, linked with the known deprivation data in respect of this area, links to concerns in respect of child and young person alcohol use, with children living in Torquay are overrepresented in the Torbay Youth Justice Service (children in Torquay they make up 51% of the Torbay 10-17 population but 70% of the YJS cohort) and children living in this ward are known to be more at risk of child exploitation. As such, this is an area of high vulnerability and increases the concerns in respect of the protection of children from harm, through the selling of alcohol within a youth centre setting.
