#### Reason for Decision:

That Mr Christopher Mallett's Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence be suspended for a period of seven days on the ground of 'any reasonable cause', as in accordance with Section 61(1)(b) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.

#### Reason for Decision:

Having carefully considered all the written and oral Representations put before the Sub-Committee, Members resolved this ground to be established following the number of warning letters that had been issued from the Principal Safety and Licensing Officer (dated 16 January 2009, 3 April 2009, 4 December 2009 and 31 August 2010) and the Licensing Support Officer (dated 25 October 2010 and 9 February 2011) raising awareness of the concerns of public safety by drivers parking illegally in Torquay. Mr Mallett confirmed that he had received these warning letters and was aware of point 19 of Section 1, Part B of the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers Handbook which states:

'The number of vehicles stationed at any rank must not exceed the number for which the rank is appointed at any time. If a rank is full at time of a vehicles' arrival at a rank then the driver must proceed to the next available rank.'

Members noted Mr Mallett's oral and written admission, as dated 14 February 2011 that he had parked not in accordance with the Road Traffic Orders or Byelaw 8 and

that he had not followed the direction, as specified in the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Drivers Handbook

In concluding Members were satisfied that Mr Mallett had been given sufficient warnings but despite this had parked illegally on 15 October 2010, on two separate occasions on 20 October 2010, on 26 October 2010, on 2 February 2011, on two separate occasions on 8 February 2011, and 18 February 2011 and again on 19 February 2011 whereby he caused an obstruction to the highway.

Members felt that the suspension was a proportionate and necessary response to the breach of the Road Traffic Orders and Byelaw 8 in an attempt to ensure public safety.

Environmental Health Manager (Commercial)

The Environmental Health Manager (Commercial) outlined the Council's case, as set out in Report 81/2011 and the reasons for recommending that the Respondent be suspended for three days.

Respondent

Mr Boyne explained the circumstances surrounding his breaches of the Road Traffic Orders and Byelaw and confirmed that he had received the warning letters which were issued on 16 January 2009, 3 April 2009, 4 December 2009 and 31 August 2010.

Respondents Response to Representations:

With the Licensing Sub-Committee's consent, the Respondent circulated a photo showing a security van parking on the taxi rank on Union Street rather than parking in the designated loading bay.

#### Decision:

That Mr Albert Boyne's Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence be suspended for a period of three days on the ground of 'any other reasonable cause', as in accordance with Section 61(1)(b) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.

#### Reason for Decision:

Having carefully considered all the written and oral Representations put before the Sub-Committee, Members resolved this ground to be established following the number of warning letters that had been issued from the Principal Safety and Licensing Officer (dated 16 January 2009, 3 April 2009, 4 December 2009 and 31 August 2010) and the Licensing Support Officer (dated 19 October 2010 and 9 February 2011) raising awareness of the concerns of public safety by drivers parking illegally in Torquay. Mr Boyne confirmed that he had received these warning letters.

Members noted Mr Boyne's oral and written admission, as received on the 18 February 2011 that he had parked not in accordance with the Road Traffic Orders or Byelaw 8 and were satisfied by the evidence given that despite these warnings Mr Boyne had parked illegally on 8 February 2011 and had been written to on the 19 October 2010 about a previous incident of illegal parking in the same location.

Members felt that the suspension was a proportionate and necessary response to the breach of the Road Traffic Orders and Byelaw 8 in an attempt to ensure public safety.

Decision:

That the Applicant, as named in exempt Report 82/2011 be granted a Private Hire Drivers Licence.

#### Reason for Decision:

Having carefully considered all the written and oral Representations Members resolved to grant the Private Hire Drivers Licence, despite it being a departure from the Council's Policy and not in accordance with the Officers recommendation, for the following exceptional reasons:-

There have been no recorded criminal convictions since 11 February 2004. Although Members did note the significant number of offences for dishonesty, there were no offences of physical violence against a person or offences of a sexual nature.

The Applicant has held a Taxi Drivers Licence, as granted by North Lanarkshire Council since 29 August 2007 and a Private Hire Operators Licence, as granted by North Lanarkshire Council since 15 December 2007, as stated in correspondence from North Lanarkshire Council dated 1 February 2011. Members also noted the absence of evidence to suggest incidents of concern had occurred since the granting of these Licences.

Members were reassured by the Applicant's oral submission that he no longer drinks alcohol and has a supportive family which he wishes to be reunited with by seeking employment in this area.

In reaching this decision, Members principal reason for granting this application was to give the Applicant an opportunity of a second chance.

#### 1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine the above application for Review of a Premises Licence.
- 1.2 The matter may affect the Corporate Priorities of Community Prosperity and Economic Prosperity.
- 1.3 As the Licensing Authority has no powers under the Act to raise a Representation, Officers are unable to make any recommendation.
- 1.4 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Crime and Disorder", "Public Safety" and "The Prevention of Public Nuisance".
- 1.5 The Authority must hold a hearing to consider the application and any relevant Representations.

The Authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant Representations, take such of the steps as detailed below, if any, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

The steps are -

- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
- (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- (c) to remove the Designated Premises Supervisor;
- (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- (e) to revoke the licence;

and for this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them are altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

If the licence is subject to sections 19, 20 and 21 (requirement to include certain conditions in Premises Licences) they remain.

Where the Authority takes a step to modify the conditions or exclude a licensable activity, it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for only such period (not exceeding three months) as it may specify.

1.6 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Responsible Authorities at the determination of the matter.

#### 2. Introduction

2.1 An application has been made under Section 51 of the Act for a Review of the Premises Licence, at the Premise detailed above. Details of the application are shown in Appendix 1.

A brief description of the Review is as follows.

The Police have sought a Review of the Premises Licence on grounds relating to the Licensing Objectives, The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and The Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The Police have supplied supporting information relating to the Review, shown in Appendix 2.

A copy of the current Premises Licence is shown in Appendix 3.

2.2 Torbay Council as the Licensing Authority, is satisfied that the application has been properly made, that the Applicant is a Responsible Authority, and that the administrative requirements of Section 51(3)(a) and (b) have been met and that the Representation has not been subsequently withdrawn and is not vexatious, frivolous or repetitious.

There have been no Representations from any other Responsible Authority or any Interested Party.

We have received a letter from one of the holders of the Premises Licence in response to the Review. This is shown as Appendix 4.

- 2.3 The Authority is required to conduct a hearing by the provisions of Section 52(2).
- 2.4 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representations and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.5 Once the matter is determined, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 8(2) of Schedule 5 to :-
  - (a) the Applicant for the Review,
  - (b) the holder of the Premises Licence, or
  - (c) any other person who made relevant Representations in relation to the application.

In the event that an Appeal is entered, the determination will not have affect until the Appeal is either determined or withdrawn.

- 2.6 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' court may:-
  - (a) dismiss the Appeal,
  - (b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or
  - (c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court,

and may make such an order as to costs as it thinks fit.

16/02/10 - A drunk female was assaulted in Palace Avenue, Paignton. The three female offenders for this crime were eventually located in Paddys's Bar and all three were described as 'very drunk'. According to witnesses, there was a disturbance initially in the pub which spilled out onto the street. During the course of the assault the victim was dragged along the pavement, held down by a female whilst being kicked in the head and hit on the head with a stiletto shoe by the other female offenders.

05/06/10 - Assault on the premises whereby a male has hit another male with a pint glass causing serious injuries. Those involved were drunk. DPS and staff assisted police at the scene.

07/06/10 - Assault on the premises whereby a male received an injury to his right ear. Aggrieved would not co-operate with police or provide any statement or details of offender. CCTV of the incident was available but Mr WALSH unable to burn footage onto a disc.

11/06/10 - Male arrested for being drunk and disorderly directly outside the premises. It transpired he had been drinking in Paddy's Bar and was the subject of a Drinking Banning Order at 2 pubs in Torquay.

18/06/10 - Police called to premises regarding a male customer refusing to leave. Police attended and male removed.

13/08/10 - Police called to premises following a report of a fight inside. On arrival the offender had made off from the scene and the victim refused to co-operate with police. CCTV was checked and was found to be of poor quality and as a result vital evidence was not available. Numerous customers in the premises refused to assist police enquiries. DPS was not present at the time of this incident.

05/11/10 - Female arrested outside her home address in Queen Elizabeth Drive, Paignton, for being drunk and incapable. She was taken to Torbay Hospital for assessment and detained overnight. Female is an alcoholic and stated that she had been drinking all evening at Paddy's Bar. DPS seen following this incident and agreed she had been drinking heavily at his premises. He was warned re serving drunks.

21/11/10 - Charity box stolen from within premises. On police arrival four persons were present in the bar and all were described as 'intoxicated'. Mr WALSH arrived at the premises to operate the CCTV system and he was also described as 'heavily intoxicated'. During the course of the police investiation, difficulties were experienced by the investigating officer to access and view CCTV. CCTV was very poor quality and two offenders could clearly be seen but due to the poor quality could not be identified. Consequently this crime remains undetected. Furthermore, Mr WALSH and his staff could not download CCTV images and provide police with a copy.

23/11/10 - Aggressive, drunken male refused service of alcohol by bar staff and he then assaulted a member of staff. Police called, male arrested and charged with assault.

09/12/10 - Licensing Form L10 received from PC Le Messurier raising concerns regarding the provision of CCTV from Paddy's Bar in relation to an incident that occurred at the premises on 23/11/10 (see above). Mr Walsh was described as extremely unhelpful and showed no urgency in providing the CCTV footage. He

stated he did not know how to download from the system and did not know how to get in contact with his CCTV suppliers. CCTV was eventually provided on 16/01/11.

- 14/01/11 Superintendent R BAKER wrote a letter to Mr WALSH concerning CCTV issues and Mr WALSH being drunk on his premises.
- 16/01/11 Copy email received from Carrie BABBAGE (Torbay Council Licensing Officer) concerning complaints of after hours drinking, disorder, noise and public nuisance issues from a local resident.
- 16/01/11 Police attended an incident at the premises at 0039 hrs, following a complaint from a resident that the DPS of Paddy's Bar was taking pictures and videoing them on his mobile phone through the premises windows. On police arrival it was established that the mobile phone did not have a camera, but Mr WALSH could not account for his actions and was clearly very intoxicated. Initially Mr WALSH refused police admittance to his premises and was very anti-police in his attitude.
- 24/01/11 Meeting at Paignton Police Station between Superintendent J NYE, Mr WALSH, Neil Stanlake (Police Licensing Officer) and Julie Smart (Police Licensing Officer). Police concerns re the management of Paddy's Bar raised with Mr WALSH and he was warned that further action will be taken if the concerns were not addressed and that his premises would be closely monitored for the foreseeable future. Following the meeting a letter was sent to Mr WALSH re-iterating the matters discussed.
- 31/01/11 Police attended the premises during a routine visit. DPS present but the officer formed the opinion that he was drunk and not in a fit state to run his premises.
- 05/02/11 Local police officer carried out routine check of premises and noticed numerous persons smoking in the rear area of the bar. The officer did not consider that this area was compliant with the Smoke-free (Premises and Enforcement) Regulations 2006.
- 15/02/11 Routine visit by police officer who spoke to the DPS and although she did not consider he was drunk, she formed the opinion that he had been drinking heavily.
- 23/02/11 Neil Stanlake, Police Licensing Officer, attended premises and requested the DPS to provide a specimen copy of CCTV. DPS subsequently provided this but still the quality and images are not to evidential standard.
- 28/02/11 At the request of the police a council officer attended the premises to inspect the provisions at the premises for smokers. The officer did not consider that the area designated for smokers complied with the requirements of the law.

16/02/10 - A drunk female was assaulted in Palace Avenue, Paignton. The three female offenders for this crime were eventually located in Paddys's Bar and all three were described as 'very drunk'. According to witnesses, there was a disturbance initially in the pub which spilled out onto the street. During the course of the assault the victim was dragged along the pavement, held down by a female whilst being kicked in the head and hit on the head with a stiletto shoe by the other female offenders.

05/06/10 - Assault on the premises whereby a male has hit another male with a pint glass causing serious injuries. Those involved were drunk. DPS and staff assisted police at the scene.

07/06/10 - Assault on the premises whereby a male received an injury to his right ear. Aggrieved would not co-operate with police or provide any statement or details of offender. CCTV of the incident was available but Mr WALSH unable to burn footage onto a disc.

11/06/10 - Male arrested for being drunk and disorderly directly outside the premises. It transpired he had been drinking in Paddy's Bar and was the subject of a Drinking Banning Order at 2 pubs in Torquay.

18/06/10 - Police called to premises regarding a male customer refusing to leave. Police attended and male removed.

13/08/10 - Police called to premises following a report of a fight inside. On arrival the offender had made off from the scene and the victim refused to co-operate with police. CCTV was checked and was found to be of poor quality and as a result vital evidence was not available. Numerous customers in the premises refused to assist police enquiries. DPS was not present at the time of this incident.

05/11/10 - Female arrested outside her home address in Queen Elizabeth Drive, Paignton, for being drunk and incapable. She was taken to Torbay Hospital for assessment and detained overnight. Female is an alcoholic and stated that she had been drinking all evening at Paddy's Bar. DPS seen following this incident and agreed she had been drinking heavily at his premises. He was warned re serving drunks.

21/11/10 - Charity box stolen from within premises. On police arrival four persons were present in the bar and all were described as 'intoxicated'. Mr WALSH arrived at the premises to operate the CCTV system and he was also described as 'heavily intoxicated'. During the course of the police investiation, difficulties were experienced by the investigating officer to access and view CCTV. CCTV was very poor quality and two offenders could clearly be seen but due to the poor quality could not be identified. Consequently this crime remains undetected. Furthermore, Mr WALSH and his staff could not download CCTV images and provide police with a copy.

23/11/10 - Aggressive, drunken male refused service of alcohol by bar staff and he then assaulted a member of staff. Police called, male arrested and charged with assault.

09/12/10 - Licensing Form L10 received from PC Le Messurier raising concerns regarding the provision of CCTV from Paddy's Bar in relation to an incident that occurred at the premises on 23/11/10 (see above). Mr Walsh was described as extremely unhelpful and showed no urgency in providing the CCTV footage. He

stated he did not know how to download from the system and did not know how to get in contact with his CCTV suppliers. CCTV was eventually provided on 16/01/11.

14/01/11 - Superintendent R BAKER wrote a letter to Mr WALSH concerning CCTV issues and Mr WALSH being drunk on his premises.

16/01/11 - Copy email received from Carrie BABBAGE (Torbay Council Licensing Officer) concerning complaints of after hours drinking, disorder, noise and public nuisance issues from a local resident.

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23/02/11 - Neil Stanlake, Police Licensing Officer, attended premises and requested the DPS to provide a specimen copy of CCTV. DPS subsequently provided this but still the quality and images are not to evidential standard.

28/02/11 - At the request of the police a council officer attended the premises to inspect the provisions at the premises for smokers. The officer did not consider that the area designated for smokers complied with the requirements of the law.







I write to you in your capacity as Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) at the above named premises and you will recall that on the 8<sup>th</sup> July 2008, my predecessor, Superintendent Chris Singer, also wrote to you concerning issues with your ability to run the premises.

There have been a number of incidents at your premises recently, one on the 23<sup>rd</sup> November where a male assaulted a member of your staff and was subsequently arrested and is being dealt with.

During the course of police enquiries, the investigating officers have reported that they visited your premises to obtain copies of CCTV evidence and on doing so it became apparent that you were unable to download your system and provide the necessary footage.

Furthermore, my officers consider that you were not particularly co-operative and in fact they have reported that you were at the time quite drunk, which was during your permitted hours.

I am aware that Neil Stanlake, one of my Licensing Officers, has been to see you about this matter and has told me that you accepted the fact that you had been drinking and apologised if you gave the impression that you were unco-operative.

It is imperative that you understand and appreciate your responsibilities as a Designated Premises Supervisor of a licensed premise and that whenever you are present at the premises you are in full control.

In respect of your CCTV system, Neil Stanlake tells me that you admitted to him that you are unable to download any footage due to your lack of knowledge of the system. I would therefore suggest that you take immediate steps to ensure you can do so in the

future in order to be able to comply with the condition on your premises licence covering CCTV.

I am somewhat disappointed that I am having to write to you again, about you being drunk on your own premises and I am not willing to tolerate poorly licensed premises within my area.

I trust you will consider the advice that Neil Stanlake gave you and read the Constabulary's Handbook on Licensing Responsibilities that he provided you with. Should there be any further concerns or incidents at your premises where it can be proved that you and your staff were not conducting the premises in a responsible manner, I shall apply to the Local Authority Licensing Committee for a review of your Premises Licence, which could result in the loss of your livelihood.

A copy of this letter has been sent to Torbay Council Licensing Department for their information and should you require any further information, please contact Neil Stanlake at my Licensing Department on the above telephone number.

I would like to make a complaint about the premises and landlord of Paddy's bar and restaurant on Winner street in Paignton.

I live by this pub and am always being disturbed by customers fighting, shouting or banging on the doors to be let in after he has closed up.

The landlord serves alcohol as early as 8am in the morning as people will bang on the door, he lets them in and they leave with bottles of alcohol

He also has "lock-in's" that go on til past 3am in the morning, with people banging on the doors and shouting to be let in.

When there are fights on the premises the landlord does nothing to intervene he just sits at the table and watches it all happen, sometimes even joinging in.

He lets customers shout outside whilst having cigarettes and the music is also extrememly loud, especially when the doors to the premisies are left wide open.

We have 4 young children who are always woken up by the noise and aggravation from these premises, sometimes they wake up scared aswell due to the shouting and foul language that goes with it.

We have spoken to the landlord and asked him to keep the noise down etc but this does no good as it just happens more the next evening.

He sits in the pub window drinking from sometimes 6am in the morning and this will continue throughout the day.

I hope that something can be done about this.

# PAIGNTON POLICE STATION -- MONDAY 24 JANUARY 2011 RE PADDY'S BAR, 107 WINNER STREET, PAIGNTON

Present:

Chief Inspector James NYE

Neil STANLAKE, Police Licensing Officer Julie SMART, Police Licensing Officer

Mr Patrick WALSH, Premises Licence Holder and DPS of Paddy's Bar

C/Insp NYE explained that Mr WALSH had been invited to attend Paignton Police Station due to growing police concerns about the way in which Paddy's Bar was being run. C/Insp NYE then ran through the details of 9 incidents that had occurred at or been linked to the premises since February 2010.

A discussion then took place regarding CCTV at the premises. Mr WALSH admitted that he cannot download footage for release to the police as he does not know how to operate the system. He was advised to seek guidance from his CCTV supplier.

A discussion followed re Mr WALSH's attitude towards the police. During an incident on 16 January 2011 Mr WALSH refused police officers entry to his premises and swore at them. Mr WALSH stated that the incident occurred after closing time and the premises were empty. C/Insp NYE stated that although this was the case, Mr WALSH should be co-operating with the police. Mr WALSH denied using abusive language to the officers.

C/Insp NYE stated that the police have evidence of the premises contributing to crime and disorder, obstruction of the police, serving drunks and several incidents of Mr WALSH being drunk on the premises. He pointed out that Mr WALSH had received two written warnings and several verbal warnings but did not appear to be taking his responsibilities seriously. Mr WALSH was informed that should there be any further incidents in relation to his premises the police would seek a Review of the Premises Licence, and police officers will be monitoring the conduct of the premises for the foreseeable future. C/Insp NYE further stated, "I expect you to be sober and helpful and you need to sort out your inability to download your CCTV". When asked if he had any questions, Mr WALSH replied, "NO, NOT REALLY".

Neil STANLAKE then raised the issue of Mr WALSH's drinking habits, and stated that it is not acceptable for a DPS to be heavily intoxicated as standards get lowered. He asked Mr WALSH, "Do you need help with your drinking?", to which Mr WALSH replied, "NO, I DON'T THINK SO. I DO HAVE A DRINK EVERYDAY I ADMIT". He also stated that he did not think there had been that many incidents at his premises.

Neil STANLAKE advised Mr WALSH to read through his Premises Licence and ensure he complies with it. Neil explained that this meeting was a last resort, and

there would be no more warnings. If any further incidents occur, the police will seek a Review. Mr WALSH was advised to contact the Licensing Department if he needs any help or advice.

C/Insp NYE summed up the main reasons for the police concerns and stated that he wished Mr WALSH to:

- 1. Sort out CCTV by mid February and contact Licensing Department when this has been done.
- 2. No further incidents to occur at the premises, but if they do Mr WALSH will cooperate with the police.
- 3. Mr WALSH not to be drunk whilst at his premises.

Neil STANLAKE then referred to an email which had been received from a local resident in which it is alleged that the premises were selling alcohol after permitted hours and that on occasions customers visit the premises at 8.00 am in the morning to purchase alcohol. Mr WALSH's response to this was "NO, NEVER".

The meeting then concluded.

I write to you in your capacity as Premises Licence Holder and Designated Supervisor, of Paddy's Bar, 107 Winner Street, Paignton, following a meeting at Paignton Police Station on Monday 24 January 2011 with Chief Inspector Nye.



- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who
  are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of alcohol so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of the employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

#### **Credit Sales**

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is sold or supplied, except alcohol sold or supplied:

### Dear Sirs:

Following the erection of formal notices upon the exterior of my public house, I write to you with a personal plea and offer of rectification. Over the last 18months we seem to have had a small number of "disturbance incidents" seemingly caused by people who frequent our licensed establishment, which have caused concern to one local resident in particular. Clearly I am aware of some of these events, but in mitigation sometimes these events happen outside of my premises and as such beyond my control. The concerned resident(s) naturally assume it is the result of those people consuming large amounts of alcohol upon my premises, which is more often not the case. As an example some of these disturbances are directly the result of refusing to serve alcohol to clients who have clearly become intoxicated in other local licensed establishments.

However I am totally aware of my responsibilities as a Licensed Landlord, and that these events could have been perhaps handled in a better and more sensitive manner and to that end I have made a decision that will hopefully rectify the matter. With the Licensing Authorities approval I will immediately seek to engage an appropriately licensed and experienced Manager / Manageress who will run Paddy's Bar in a manner that will not further offend either the licensing authority or local residents. I would stress I would have no further involvement in the running of Paddy's Bar other than that of a financial silent partner. I respectfully remind you that this has been a hard decision to make and as such it is one that has taken time to confirm that this offer is the right course of action to take.

Please can you indicate if my proposal is suitably robust and meaningful to ensure the continuance of a long established local business and ongoing employment for my dedicated staff, Furthermore I am fully receptive to constructive advice and take immediate steps to assist in the rectification of this urgent matter.

### 1. What we are trying to achieve

1.1 This report concerns a Hackney Carriage Driver who despite several warnings has failed to comply with the Road Traffic Orders and Byelaws of Torbay Council whilst going about his business.

### 2. Recommendation(s) for decision

- 2.1 It is recommend that:
  - 1. Mr Paul Stone's Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence be suspended for 7 days.

### 3. Key points and reasons for recommendations

- 3.1 By the provisions of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, Torbay Council is the Licensing Authority in respect of Hackney Carriages, Private Hire Vehicles and their drivers within Torbay.
- 3.2 Section 61 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 gives the Local Authority the power to suspend or revoke a Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence for 'any other reasonable cause'.
- 3.3 This report concerns Hackney Carriage Drivers queuing and parking in areas in Torbay covered by Road Traffic Orders, as well as causing an obstruction to other road users. This has resulted in complaints from The Police, other road users and members of the public, as well as the general concerns Officers have about safety. This is particularly prevalent on Torquay harbour side but applies elsewhere too.

- 3.4 Although a number of different measures had been tried and three letters sent to all Hackney Carriage Drivers during 2009, problems were not resolved. In an attempt to address this, the Officer working party, with attendees from Parking Enforcement, Highways, Licensing, Transportation and the Police met again. It was decided at this meeting to threaten to move the Taxi's ranks from The Strand, onto Torwood Street. This raised significant concerns so Officers attended a meeting with taxi drivers. The outcome of that meeting is that a trial was implemented to see if the Hackney Carriage drivers would comply with the road Traffic Orders. To help this, significant enforcement took place as well. A letter was sent to all Hackney Carriage Drivers advising them of the trial and the enforcement that would take place both on the harbourside and elsewhere, see Appendix 3.
- 3.5 Despite these letters of which all were sent to Mr Stone, on 29 October 2010 at 23.07 a Licensing Enforcement Officer witnessed Hackney Carriage Licence Number HC132, registration number MF58 HNL, parked in such a way that it was overhanging into the carriage way from the back of Vaughn Parade Short Rank. This was observed for 3 minutes. Mr Stone was subsequently sent a letter dated 4 November 2010 about this incident.
- 3.6 At 2343 on the 18 February 2011, Hackney Carriage Number HC132, registration number MF58 HNL, was witnessed by a Licensing Enforcement Officers overhanging the carriage way from the back of the Vaughn Parade Short Rank, for 7 minutes. Again at 0022 on 19 February 2011 the same vehicle was witnessed by Licensing Enforcement Officers parked illegally on double yellow lines at the back of the bus bay on the seaward side of Torquay Harbour. A letter was sent to Mr Stone on the 4 March 2011 regarding these incidents and requesting an explanation.
- 3.7 The above incidents are in contravention of both the Road Traffic Order and Byelaw 8 of Torbay Council's Hackney Carriages and Private Hire Vehicles Byelaws.

### Supporting information to Report 91/2011

### A1. Introduction and history

- A1.1 By the provisions of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, Torbay Council is the Licensing Authority in respect of Hackney Carriages, Private Hire Vehicles and their drivers within Torbay.
- A1.2 Section 61 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 gives the Local Authority the power to suspend or revoked a Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence for 'any other reasonable cause'.
- A1.3 This report concerns Hackney Carriage Drivers queuing and parking in areas in Torbay covered by Road Traffic Orders, as well as causing an obstruction to other road users. This has resulted in complaints from The Police, other road users and members of the public, as well as the general concerns Officers have about safety. See Appendix 1. This is particularly prevalent on Torquay harbour side but applies elsewhere too.
- A1.4 This biggest area for complaints and the concerns of Officers is around the bus bays and taxi ranks on The Strand and on The Clocktower roundabout, as well as the GPO roundabout. Officers' concerns relate to the risk to pedestrians crossing the road, or alighting from buses, where they are away from the kerbside and being hit by a moving vehicle. There are also significant concerns about taxis obstructing the highway particularly at the exit to the roundabout and being a danger to other road users. There have been 13 road traffic accidents in the past 13 months up to December 2010 on the harbourside alone, though not all related to taxis. Torbay Council as the Licensing, Highways and Parking Enforcement Authority needs to exercise a duty of care in these matters, as informal attempts to resolve the issue have been unsuccessful.
- A1.5 Although a number of different measures had been tried and three letters sent to all Hackney Carriage Drivers during 2009 (see Appendix 2), problems were not resolved and this resulted in a number of Drivers having their Drivers Licences suspended.
- A1.6 In a further attempt to address this, an Officer working party, with attendees from Parking Enforcement, Highways, Licensing, Transportation and the Police, met. It was decided at this meeting to threaten to move the Taxi's ranks from The Strand, onto Torwood Street. This was put to representatives of the Hackney Carriage Drivers in early August 2010. They raised significant concerns therefore Officers were invited to attend a meeting of the Taxi Trade Association.
- A1.7 The outcome of that meeting is that a trial was implemented to see if the Hackney Carriage drivers would comply with the road Traffic Orders. To help this significant enforcement took place as well. A letter was sent to all Hackney Carriage Drivers advising them of the trial and the enforcement that would take place both on the harbourside and elsewhere, see Appendix 3. Overall this approached worked well, though since the end of the trial and the reduction in enforcement some drivers have returned to being less compliant. However it is important to note the majority still comply and at this time it has been felt that to move the ranks would disadvantage those, although it still remains an option.

- A1.8 What follows is the failures of Mr Stone to comply with Road Traffic Orders both in Torquay Town Centre and on the harbourside.
- A1.9 Despite these letters of which all were sent to Mr Stone, on 29 October 2010 at 23.07 a Licensing Enforcement Officer witnessed Hackney Carriage Licence Number HC132, registration number MF58 HNL, parked in such a way that it was overhanging into the carriage way from the back of Vaughn Parade Short Rank. This was observed for 3 minutes. See Appendix 4. Mr Stone was subsequently sent a letter dated 4 November 2010 about this incident. See Appendix 5.
- A1.10 At 2343 on the 18 February 2011, Hackney Carriage Number HC132, registration number MF58 HNL, was witnessed by a Licensing Enforcement Officers overhanging the carriage way from the back of the Vaughn Parade Short Rank, for 7 minutes. Again at 0022 on 19 February 2011 the same vehicle was witnessed by Licensing Enforcement Officers parked illegally on double yellow lines at the back of the bus bay on the seaward side of Torquay Harbour. See Appendix 6. A letter was sent to Mr Stone on the 4 March 2011 regarding these incidents and requesting an explanation. See Appendix 7.
- A1.11 The above incidents are in contravention of both the Road Traffic Order and Byelaw 8 of Torbay Council's Hackney Carriages and Private Hire Vehicles Byelaws.
- A1.12 Mr Stone responded to the letter dated 4 March 2011 by a letter dated 8 March 2011. See Appendix 8.
- A1.13 Attached is a map of the location, giving the Road Traffic requirements that apply to the harbourside. See Appendix 9.
- A1.14 It should be noted that the harbourside is a very busy area with many competing interests. One argument put forward by some drivers is that there is insufficient space for taxis. There is no requirement in law for Torbay Council to provide Taxi Ranks; however the Council does provide space as Taxis provide an important part of an integrated transport strategy, helping to address late night economy issues. The taxi ranks are reviewed regularly as part of the Council's unmet demand study for Hackney Carriages. If 'no waiting areas' are excluded, Taxi ranks make up 18% of the space before midnight and 26% after midnight. This does not at this time include the new rank outside The Clocktower public house. See Appendix 10.
- A1.15 A copy of Byelaw 8 of Torbay Council's Hackney Carriages and Private Hire Vehicles Byelaws is attached at Appendix 11.
- A1.16 It is recommended that Mr Stone's Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence be suspended for 7 days.
- A1.17 There is a right of Appeal. Any Appeal would be to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days from the date of a Notice being sent out following the decision.

### A2. Risk assessment of preferred option

### A2.1 Outline of significant key risks

A2.1.1 There are no significant risks if the recommendation is agreed. The potential risks to other road users and pedestrians would be reduced by agreeing the

recommendation. However, there is the potential for an Appeal to the Magistrates' Court which may incur a financial cost.

A2.1.2 If the recommendation is not followed, then the risk may be greater in the long term, as the issue of ignoring the Road Traffic Orders and Byelaw may continue with the potential for further road traffic accidents or worse.

### A3. Options

- A3.1 The options are:
  - (i) to grant the suspension
  - (ii) to refuse the suspension
  - (iii) to suspend for a different period of time
  - (iv) to revoke the licence

### A4. Summary of resource implications

A4.1 There are resource implications if there is an Appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the suspension.

# A5. What impact will there be on equalities, environmental sustainability and crime and disorder?

A5.1 There are no impacts upon equalities and environmental sustainability. There are potential crime and disorder issues associated with obstruction of the highway, but this approach should address those.

### A6. Consultation and Customer Focus

A6.1 There has been no public consultation on this matter, although the drivers are aware of the issues both from their Taxi handbook, from the letters they have received and from a Taxi Trade Association meeting.

### A7. Are there any implications for other Business Units?

A7.1 There are no implications for other business units.

### Illegal Parking by Taxis in Torbay

For the past three years we have seen escalating problems with taxis parking illegally in Torbay. In particular in Torquay in Union Street, GPO Roundabout and within the Harbour side area during the evenings.

We have received a high volume of complaints over the years in particular from Stagecoach where taxis park in bus stops preventing buses alighting passengers safely, from bus users and members of the public who feel taxis are permitted to park illegally and not suffer the consequences. In general the illegal parking on double yellow lines, bus stops etc are causing congestion in busy town centre areas and road safety issues.

The problems we experience in enforcing the illegal parking is that the drivers are present with their taxis at all times and when we approach them in regard to enforcing the illegal parking they simply drive off to avoid enforcement. Our legal procedures dictate presently that the Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) has to be physically attached to the vehicle or handed to the driver and the taxis know this procedure well and will exit the location to avoid the issue of the PCN. This is very frustrating but we are putting in new plans under new legislation to ensure that the PCN is issued immediately and then it does not have to be affixed to the vehicle or handed to the driver and will be posted to the registered keeper, this we feel will improve enforcement in these circumstances.

We have undertaken increased patrols to deal with the taxi parking problem and even had enforcement staff working to Midnight on quite a few weekends on Torquay Harbour side but alas no PCNs were issued as taxis kept driving round in circles to get on the ranks to avoid the issue of a PCN. Our staff in trying to enforce these vehicle have also been the subject of threats and abuse by a number of drivers.

The problems appear to be much worse during the recent economic climate because there are too many taxis chasing too few fairs and therefore the ranks in particular in Torquay are overflowing with taxis. We would greatly appreciate any assistance you could provide us in holding the relevant taxis to account when seen to be parking illegally or abuse our staff, perhaps through the Committee route and suspend licences.

Your assistance in this matter would be most appreciated.

Dear Steve,

The intention of this letter is too clarify events of the last 9 months on The Strand involving Taxi Drivers and the issues being caused by them.

Over the last 9 months several problems have been caused and despite our joint efforts (and this includes Police, Council and NCP) the problems have continued and got worse. As you are aware a lot of work has gone in over this issue over the past few months (Inc the Night Time Economy Team) along with yourself and colleagues of yours from the council.

The main issues are with Hackney Carriage drivers. These primarily are constantly parking on the Debenhams side of The Strand, on the roundabout around the clocktower and parking on the exit of the roundabout where they are queuing to get on the bus stop on the harbour side of The Strand. The parking on the roundabout has already caused on accident in the latter part of last year involving a single decker bus which I am aware you know about. However there have been several incidents which have not been reported which have been very near misses. One was on Saturday night as I was issuing a ticket to a Taxi Driver who was parked causing an obstruction, when a double decker number 12 came around the roundabout and was confronted with a stationary taxi stopped in the same place. He slammed on his brakes and skidded on the wet ground missing the Taxi by cm. I am sure there will have been upset passengers, not to mention the driver. The taxi then sped off and unfortunately I did not see who it was.

With reference to parking on the Debenhams side of The Strand, the issue with this is there is nowhere for the buses to pull in causing them to have to block the road to set down passengers and then the passengers having to walk through parked cars to get to the safety of the pavement, which is completely unacceptable. After midnight when the busses stop, the problem is that there is nowhere for other taxis and members of the public to drop off or pick up, often drunk people again, causing the issues just described. Keeping that side of The Strand clear is also important just because often people who are drunk stagger into the road and the extra space can stop serious accidents. The fear is that a fatal RTC is only a matter of time away unless action is taken now.

I have also noticed that the number of Taxis on The Strand is increasing. I am not sure why, maybe more are just choosing to come to Torquay but there is definitely an increase. At one point over the weekend we had a line (parked every and anywhere they could) and I counted 41 Hackney Carriages, which I fear at the time was more than the number of people on The Strand. Also I have serious concerns about the rumours of de-regulation and the issues that it will bring. I spoke to a taxi driver who worked in Swansea when they did it and he said it was carnage, to the point it was reverted after 3 months. I would like to speak to you about this in more detail.

As you are aware I arranged with the drivers in consultation with you that they can use the first part of the bus stop from 21:00hrs in a bid to show that give and take is the best way to proceed.

However since that has been imposed our problem with drivers parking on the roundabout and blocking the exit has only started at 21:00hrs instead of 00:00hrs. Therefore as it was arranged that it would stay whilst it was used sensibly I recommend that this be removed with immediate effect. This is to ensure the continued safety of pedestrians and road users alike. I will have no issue with explaining to the drivers why that privilege has been removed.

I know that the council face difficulties as we do in dealing with this issue, but I must stress that something must be done. I know that space is limited and that there are too many Taxi's using Torquay at the moment. In response to this I have had an idea which involves closing the Vaughn Parade Taxi rank and utilising other currently unused space which will increase the number of Taxis able to fit on a rank. I promise that it is not as crazy as it sounds however it will be easier to discuss with you in person.

I look forward to your reply and please do not hesitate to contact me via email should you need to do so. Also I have emailed you reference meeting up with you in Paignton.

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### **BRIEFING PAPER**

### TAXI PARKING STRAND, TORQUAY

Since July 2006 the local Bus Company has encountered numerous complaints from drivers stating that they have been experiencing problems mainly on Friday and Saturday evenings with Taxi's taking over the bus bays on the Strand. When this problem occurs the buses cannot get in close to the kerb to load or unload passengers this causes an issue with passengers having to alight in the middle of the road. Also, those with disabilities who find it difficult to get off the bus because it is not adjacent to the kerb cannot alight at their stop.

On one occasion a bus driver noted a number of taxis causing problems on a particular night and one Taxi driver was particularly offensive to him.

Torbay Council has regular meetings with the bus companies and this issue is constantly being raised. Whilst signing and Traffic Orders are in place to prevent vehicles from waiting in the bus bays the problem has continued and bus drivers are becoming very despondent because no one seems to be addressing the issue.

The operation Managers for Stagecoach Bus Company have previously sent in a number of reports over the years completed by their drivers highlighting the taxi drivers causing the offences. These have been passed on to our Licensing Department requesting action be taken against the drivers.

The Licensing Department have informed Highways that many taxi drivers have been spoken with and reminded that it is an offence to park/wait within the Bus Bays however they do not have the power to take away a Drivers License and this is a matter for the Licensing Committee.

This is a very frustrating situation for the Council, as the Public Transport Team work to encourage and promote the use of Public Transport throughout the area. This in turn reduces congestion and carbon emissions and ensures buses can access the stops promoting the use for disabled and those with restricted mobility. However if the Bus Companies cannot access their specific bus bays for loading and unloading this discourages customers from using this form of transport.

The Taxi Parking issue has been ongoing for nearly four years since it was originally brought to the Council's attention.

I write to confirm the ongoing problems with taxis parking at the Strand bus stops.

This issue has been ongoing for the full duration of my time in post as Operations Manager since September 2007. However, I am aware that the previous manager raised this problem as early as 2006.

The main concern from my perspective is one of safety. If my vehicles cannot properly access their designated stopping places they are forced to disembark passengers in the middle of the road. This not only blocks the road for other road users but puts my passengers at risk.

Being unable to pull into the curb at a bus stop increases the potential of passengers falling on to or out of the bus and sustaining physical injuries. It also adds the risk of cyclists colliding with passengers on the nearside of the vehicle, which is a hazard that would otherwise not have been present.

I might add that the vast majority of my passengers are over the age of 60 and therefore many struggle with mobility issues. The step height from the bus to the curb is much lower than that directly onto the road; this in itself can cause physical injury and pain to some passengers.

The act of a taxi simply blocking a bus stop can therefore cause untold damage and is a deterrent to my passengers using my services in future.

We work in partnership with Torbay Council and hope to reach a resolution to this issue as soon as possible.

### Re: Torquay Harbourside & The Strand Taxi rank and Bus Bay

I am writing to you to advise you on the work being undertaken by Torbay Council and the Police to try and resolve issues that are arising in the use of The Strand, its taxi rank, the adjacent bus bay and the roundabout. During 2008 there have been a number of complaints about this area, mainly about drivers using areas not designated as taxi ranks. I have been tasked to try and find a solution to this problem. It is my view that a compromise is needed because their simply isn't enough space for all the demands made upon this area.

Torbay Council is also working with representatives of the Taxi Association to try and help find a solution.

I think it is important in the first instance to remind you that the only places drivers can queue for fares at this time are the three ranks, on Victoria Parade, on The Strand and on Cary Parade. Though waiting has been tolerated at times on the Bus Bay, it is must clear that the road traffic orders in place prohibit this.

Torbay Council has taken the view that it would be helpful to change the bus bay after midnight on the harbour side of The Strand; however it has to seek approval from the Department of Transport for this change. It has approached them about the change to the existing order and they have agreed with our submission that after midnight the Bus bay on the harbour side can become a taxi rank. This will still need to go through the proper channels of advertising etc, but we are hopeful that this can be agreed by mid March.

Until mid March there is no right to use this bus bay before or after midnight, and should you be approached and asked to move on, or even receive a fixed penalty notice, for doing so, I will expect you to comply. Should any driver make threats or anything similar against Torbay Council personnel or their contractors as some have done, they can expect to be brought before the Licensing Committee with the threat of their driver's licence being suspended. This also applies to any arguments with bus drivers, as they too have been warned and in two cases action has been taken against their drivers.

The same applies to the roundabout, where drivers have been queuing on it. This is simply not acceptable and is not only causing an obstruction but is simply dangerous. Ticketing is now taking

place in that area, as several drivers have discovered.

Finally, at the start of this letter I said Torbay Council is working with the Taxi Association, and through them we hoped to identify some other potential locations for new ranks. It may be that we are not successful, but we do understand times are hard and if we can help we will. The process is slow and there will be other interests regarding any location, who will have a right to raise their concerns, but if we feel the location is right, I will add my support behind any report to Licensing Committee.

In due course I will write again to confirm any changes we have been able to achieve.

### Re: Torquay Harbourside & The Strand Taxi rank and Bus Bay

I am writing to you and all other Hackney Carriage drivers to update you on the current situation with respect to taxi ranks and bus bays on the harbourside. The new rank, which is the bus bay on the harbourside of The Strand is now in place, for use after midnight. Stagecoach has agreed to move their final summer buses to the Debenham's side of The Strand to help facilitate this.

Unfortunately Hackney Carriage driver's have taken to using the Debenham's side of The Strand as well, for queuing. This is creating a similar problem that we were trying to resolve on the seaward side, that buses and other vehicles that are using that area legally, are potentially dropping passengers off away from the curb side. This is also happening at the GPO roundabout on the top of Fleet Walk by Tesco's. This could lead to a serious road incident, with potential injury or worse. There have already been a couple of near misses. I am sure this is not something you would wish to see and as a representative of Torbay Council I simply cannot allow to occur.

I must therefore insist that you do not use these areas, notably the bus bays on either side of The Strand and at the old GPO roundabout, by Tesco's. In the case of the seaward side of The Strand, this is just before midnight. This will also apply to any other areas which may cause obstruction of the highway or where there are Road Traffic Orders in place. If anybody is caught using them then they run the risk that action being taken against them, by way of fixed penalty notice or being brought before Licensing Committee.

I am sure this will be seen by many as unreasonable, but you must understand that waiting in these areas is not in compliance with the Road Traffic Orders, which are there to give everybody a share in the road space available, and as I said in my previous letter, there isn't sufficient space for all the competing interests.

Torbay Council is continuing to try and find further alternative spaces, to add to the 31 available after midnight on the harbourside. There are consultations taking place in several areas, following a meeting with the Taxi Association. I will give support to these and work on your behalf to try and secure more rank space, but I cannot promise anything at this time, as at least one location will also require Department of Transport approval, which will take time.

### Re: Torbay Harbourside & The Strand Taxi rank and Bus bay

I am writing to you and all other Hackney Carriage Drivers to clarify the article in the Herald Express on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> November, which you may have read. Torbay Council and Devon and Cornwall Police have been in discussions over the last 12 months to find solutions to a number of issues regarding the non-observation of Road Traffic Orders by some Hackney Carriage Drivers. This applies to all areas of Torbay, but especially on the harbourside.

In January and April 2009 I wrote to all drivers about what is expected in terms of where they queue or park up, but unfortunately many drivers have ignored my advice. This was re-enforced by the use of staff from NCP to ask drivers not to use certain areas, but again many drivers have since ignored this. These staff, who are doing our work, have often received abuse, which is totally unacceptable. This was only from a minority of drivers and these are being dealt with.

In light of drivers ignoring advice, new technology is being investigated and adopted to mean that drivers may receive fixed penalty notices without the need of any ticket being affixed to a vehicle. In the meantime evidence is being collected by Officers of Torbay Council, NCP staff and the Police of non-compliance with Road Traffic Orders. If you are generally compliant with Road Traffic Orders then you have nothing to concern yourselves about. But should you be witnessed queuing or parking in non-authorised areas you will be brought before Licensing Committee with the risk of having your drivers badge suspended. I take no pleasure in issuing this warning but due to a significant minority ignoring previous requests it has left me with no option. So you must take this as a final warning.

So why are we doing this? Firstly to ensure all road users have their fair share of the limited space. This is particularly true of Torquay harbourside, but this equally applies elsewhere on the harbourside and in Torbay generally. Before midnight taxis have 18% of allocated space on the harbourside. After midnight it is 26%. The second reason is to avoid accidents due to incorrectly queuing or parked vehicles.

What else are we trying to do?

Discussions continue between various departments and the Police to find solutions and consultation has taken place on a section of road on Torwood Street in recent months, but unfortunately again the objections are too strong to change the present designation. Due to this we are prepared to allow 'unofficially' that the rear of the Strand bus stop 4 spaces to be used between 9pm and midnight. This is not a permanent situation because the development of further bus routes is one of the objectives of Torbay Council and the space may be needed in the future. However it may help us all get through the recession to better times.


There are also other considerations in the pipeline, but these would be linked to harbourside developments, so are not likely to arise in the near future. However we will continue to consider any options that are presented to us.

So as one final reminder, comply with the Road Traffic Orders or run the risk of having your drivers badge suspended, or worse.

#### MANDATORY CONDITION: WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-

- the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who
  are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of alcohol so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of the employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

I am writing to you to inform you that your vehicle registration details have been passed to me because your vehicle has been seen illegally parked on the Harbourside at Torquay by Licensing Enforcement Officers. I have been informed that at 23:07 hrs on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2010, your vehicle was parked in such a way that it was overhanging into the carriage way from the back of the Vaughan Parade Short Rank, this was observed for 3 mins. Please be reminded that you should not be parking illegally at any time and any further breaches of parking regulations is likely to result in you being brought before the Licensing Committee to explain your actions, with the recommendation of suspension of your drivers badge. The road traffic order for the short rank has designated the rank for 3 cars, and although four can probably fit without causing an obstruction, five cannot.

As I am sure you are aware there have been many problems with the parking of taxis around Torquay Harbourside for sometime now and we have reached the point where we can no longer allow this situation to continue. 

#### 1. What we are trying to achieve

1.1 This report concerns a Hackney Carriage Driver who despite several warnings has failed to comply with the Road Traffic Orders and Byelaws of Torbay Council whilst going about his business.

#### 2. Recommendation(s) for decision

- 2.1 It is recommend that:
  - 1. Mr Dariush Zarezadeh's Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence be suspended for 7 days.

#### 3. Key points and reasons for recommendations

- 3.1 By the provisions of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, Torbay Council is the Licensing Authority in respect of Hackney Carriages, Private Hire Vehicles and their drivers within Torbay.
- 3.2 Section 61 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 gives the Local Authority the power to suspend or revoke a Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence for 'any other reasonable cause'.
- 3.3 This report concerns Hackney Carriage Drivers queuing and parking in areas in Torbay covered by Road Traffic Orders, as well as causing an obstruction to other road users. This has resulted in complaints from The Police, other road users and members of the public, as well as the general concerns Officers have about safety. This is particularly prevalent on Torquay harbour side but applies elsewhere too.

- 3.4 Although a number of different measures had been tried and three letters sent to all Hackney Carriage Drivers during 2009, problems were not resolved. In an attempt to address this, the Officer working party, with attendees from Parking Enforcement, Highways, Licensing, Transportation and the Police met again. It was decided at this meeting to threaten to move the Taxi's ranks from The Strand, onto Torwood Street. This raised significant concerns so officer attended a meeting with taxi drivers. The outcome of that meeting is that a trial was implemented to see if the Hackney Carriage drivers would comply with the road Traffic Orders. To help this significant enforcement took place as well. A letter was sent to all Hackney Carriage Drivers advising them of the trial and the enforcement that would take place both on the harbourside and elsewhere, see Appendix 3.
- 3.5 Despite these letters of which all were sent to Mr Zarezadeh at 10.37 on 18<sup>th</sup> October 2010 and again at 14.30 on 22 October 2010, a Parking Enforcement Officer witnessed Hackney Carriage Licence number HC 102, registration number WF57 ZUA, parked illegally on double yellow lines outside Natwest Bank, Union Street, Torquay. Mr Zarezadeh was subsequently sent a warning letter dated 28 October 2010 about these incidents.
- 3.6 At 0037 on the 19<sup>th</sup> February 2011, a Licensing Support Officer witnessed Hackney Carriage HC102, registration number WF57 ZUA, illegally parked on double yellow lines at the rear of the bus lane on the seaward side of Torquay Harbour. At the time in question a police van on an emergency call, came around the clock tower roundabout and had to move the vehicle on by the use of its sirens, as it was causing an obstruction in the highway. A letter was sent to Mr Zarezadeh regarding this incident on the 4 March 2011 and requesting an explanation.
- 3.7 The above incidents are in contravention of both the Road Traffic Order and Byelaw 8 of Torbay Council's Hackney Carriages and Private Hire Vehicles Byelaws.

#### Supporting information to Report 92/2011

#### A1. Introduction and history

- A1.1 By the provisions of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, Torbay Council is the Licensing Authority in respect of Hackney Carriages, Private Hire Vehicles and their drivers within Torbay.
- A1.2 Section 61 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 gives the Local Authority the power to suspend or revoked a Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence for 'any other reasonable cause'.
- A1.3 This report concerns Hackney Carriage Drivers queuing and parking in areas in Torbay covered by Road Traffic Orders, as well as causing an obstruction to other road users. This has resulted in complaints from The Police, other road users and members of the public, as well as the general concerns Officers have about safety. See Appendix 1. This is particularly prevalent on Torquay harbour side but applies elsewhere too.
- A1.4 This biggest area for complaints and the concerns of Officers is around the bus bays and taxi ranks on The Strand and on The Clocktower roundabout, as well as the GPO roundabout. Officers' concerns relate to the risk to pedestrians crossing the road, or alighting from buses, where they are away from the kerbside and being hit by a moving vehicle. There are also significant concerns about taxis obstructing the highway particularly at the exit to the roundabout and being a danger to other road users. There have been 13 road traffic accidents in the past 13 months up to December 2010 on the harbourside alone, though not all related to taxis. Torbay Council as the Licensing, Highways and Parking Enforcement Authority needs to exercise a duty of care in these matters, as informal attempts to resolve the issue have been unsuccessful.
- A1.5 Although a number of different measures had been tried and three letters sent to all Hackney Carriage Drivers during 2009 (see Appendix 2), problems were not resolved and this resulted in a number of Drivers having their Drivers Licences suspended.
- A1.6 In a further attempt to address this, an Officer working party, with attendees from Parking Enforcement, Highways, Licensing, Transportation and the Police, met. It was decided at this meeting to threaten to move the Taxi's ranks from The Strand, onto Torwood Street. This was put to representatives of the Hackney Carriage Drivers in early August 2010. They raised significant concerns therefore Officers were invited to attend a meeting of the Taxi Trade Association.
- A1.7 The outcome of that meeting is that a trial was implemented to see if the Hackney Carriage drivers would comply with the road Traffic Orders. To help this significant enforcement took place as well. A letter was sent to all Hackney Carriage Drivers advising them of the trial and the enforcement that would take place both on the harbourside and elsewhere, see Appendix 3. Overall this approached worked well, though since the end of the trial and the reduction in enforcement some drivers have returned to being less compliant. However it is important to note the majority still comply and at this time it has been felt that to move the ranks would disadvantage those, although it still remains an option.

- A1.8 What follows are the failures of Mr Zarezadeh to comply with Road Traffic Orders both in Torquay Town Centre and on the harbourside.
- A1.9 At 10.37 on 18<sup>th</sup> October 2010 and again at 14.30 on 22 October 2010, a Parking Enforcement Officer witnessed Hackney Carriage Licence number HC 102, registration number WF57 ZUA, parked illegally on double yellow lines outside Natwest Bank, Union Street, Torquay. See Appendix 4. Mr Zarezadeh was subsequently sent a written warning letter dated 28 October 2010 about these incidents. See Appendix 5.
- A1.10 At 0037 on the 19<sup>th</sup> February 2011, a Licensing Support Officer witnessed Hackney Carriage HC102, registration number WF57 ZUA, illegally parked on double yellow lines at the rear of the bus lane on the seaward side of Torquay Harbour. At the time in question a police van on an emergency call, came around the clock tower roundabout and had to move the vehicle on by the use of its sirens, as it was causing an obstruction in the highway. See Appendix 6. A letter was sent to Mr Zarezadeh regarding this incident on the 4 March 2011 regarding and requesting an explanation. See Appendix 7.
- A1.11 The above incidents are in contravention of both the Road Traffic Order and Byelaw 8 of Torbay Council's Hackney Carriages and Private Hire Vehicles Byelaws.
- A1.12 Mr Zarezadeh responded to the letter dated 4 March 2011 by a letter dated 10 March 2011. See Appendix 8. In this letter Mr Zarezadeh has written that he pulled over to allow a Police vehicle, which had its lights and sirens on, to pass. However, a statement from the Environmental Health Manager states that this was not the case and that the vehicle was already illegally parked. See Appendix 12.
- A1.13 Attached is a map of the location, giving the Road Traffic requirements that apply to the harbourside. See Appendix 9.
- A1.14 It should be noted that the harbourside is a very busy area with many competing interests. One argument put forward by some drivers is that there is insufficient space for taxis. There is no requirement in law for Torbay Council to provide Taxi Ranks; however the Council does provide space as Taxis provide an important part of an integrated transport strategy, helping to address late night economy issues. The taxi ranks are reviewed regularly as part of the Council's unmet demand study for Hackney Carriages. If 'no waiting areas' are excluded, Taxi ranks make up 18% of the space before midnight and 26% after midnight. This does not at this time include the new rank outside The Clocktower public house. See Appendix 10.
- A1.15 A copy of Byelaw 8 of Torbay Council's Hackney Carriages and Private Hire Vehicles Byelaws is attached at Appendix 11.
- A1.16 It is recommended that Mr Zarezadeh's Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence be suspended for 7 days.
- A1.17 There is a right of Appeal. Any Appeal would be to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days from the date of a Notice being sent out following the decision.

#### A2. Risk assessment of preferred option

#### A2.1 Outline of significant key risks

- A2.1.1 There are no significant risks if the recommendation is agreed. The potential risks to other road users and pedestrians would be reduced by agreeing the recommendation. However, there is the potential for an Appeal to the Magistrates' Court which may incur a financial cost.
- A2.1.2 If the recommendation is not followed, then the risk may be greater in the long term, as the issue of ignoring the Road Traffic Orders and Byelaw may continue with the potential for further road traffic accidents or worse.

#### A3. Options

- A3.1 The options are:
  - (i) to grant the suspension
  - (ii) to refuse the suspension
  - (iii) to suspend for a different period of time
  - (iv) to revoke the licence

#### A4. Summary of resource implications

A4.1 There are resource implications if there is an Appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the suspension.

# A5. What impact will there be on equalities, environmental sustainability and crime and disorder?

A5.1 There are no impacts upon equalities and environmental sustainability. There are potential crime and disorder issues associated with obstruction of the highway, but this approach should address those.

#### A6. Consultation and Customer Focus

A6.1 There has been no public consultation on this matter, although the drivers are aware of the issues both from their Taxi handbook, from the letters they have received and from a Taxi Trade Association meeting.

#### A7. Are there any implications for other Business Units?

A7.1 There are no implications for other business units.

#### Illegal Parking by Taxis in Torbay

For the past three years we have seen escalating problems with taxis parking illegally in Torbay. In particular in Torquay in Union Street, GPO Roundabout and within the Harbour side area during the evenings.

We have received a high volume of complaints over the years in particular from Stagecoach where taxis park in bus stops preventing buses alighting passengers safely, from bus users and members of the public who feel taxis are permitted to park illegally and not suffer the consequences. In general the illegal parking on double yellow lines, bus stops etc are causing congestion in busy town centre areas and road safety issues.

The problems we experience in enforcing the illegal parking is that the drivers are present with their taxis at all times and when we approach them in regard to enforcing the illegal parking they simply drive off to avoid enforcement. Our legal procedures dictate presently that the Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) has to be physically attached to the vehicle or handed to the driver and the taxis know this procedure well and will exit the location to avoid the issue of the PCN. This is very frustrating but we are putting in new plans under new legislation to ensure that the PCN is issued immediately and then it does not have to be affixed to the vehicle or handed to the driver and will be posted to the registered keeper, this we feel will improve enforcement in these circumstances.

We have undertaken increased patrols to deal with the taxi parking problem and even had enforcement staff working to Midnight on quite a few weekends on Torquay Harbour side but alas no PCNs were issued as taxis kept driving round in circles to get on the ranks to avoid the issue of a PCN. Our staff in trying to enforce these vehicle have also been the subject of threats and abuse by a number of drivers.

The problems appear to be much worse during the recent economic climate because there are too many taxis chasing too few fairs and therefore the ranks in particular in Torquay are overflowing with taxis. We would greatly appreciate any assistance you could provide us in holding the relevant taxis to account when seen to be parking illegally or abuse our staff, perhaps through the Committee route and suspend licences.

Your assistance in this matter would be most appreciated.

Dear Steve,

The intention of this letter is too clarify events of the last 9 months on The Strand involving Taxi Drivers and the issues being caused by them.

Over the last 9 months several problems have been caused and despite our joint efforts (and this includes Police, Council and NCP) the problems have continued and got worse. As you are aware a lot of work has gone in over this issue over the past few months (Inc the Night Time Economy Team) along with yourself and colleagues of yours from the council.

The main issues are with Hackney Carriage drivers. These primarily are constantly parking on the Debenhams side of The Strand, on the roundabout around the clocktower and parking on the exit of the roundabout where they are queuing to get on the bus stop on the harbour side of The Strand. The parking on the roundabout has already caused on accident in the latter part of last year involving a single decker bus which I am aware you know about. However there have been several incidents which have not been reported which have been very near misses. One was on Saturday night as I was issuing a ticket to a Taxi Driver who was parked causing an obstruction, when a double decker number 12 came around the roundabout and was confronted with a stationary taxi stopped in the same place. He slammed on his brakes and skidded on the wet ground missing the Taxi by cm. I am sure there will have been upset passengers, not to mention the driver. The taxi then sped off and unfortunately I did not see who it was.

With reference to parking on the Debenhams side of The Strand, the issue with this is there is nowhere for the buses to pull in causing them to have to block the road to set down passengers and then the passengers having to walk through parked cars to get to the safety of the pavement, which is completely unacceptable. After midnight when the busses stop, the problem is that there is nowhere for other taxis and members of the public to drop off or pick up, often drunk people again, causing the issues just described. Keeping that side of The Strand clear is also important just because often people who are drunk stagger into the road and the extra space can stop serious accidents. The fear is that a fatal RTC is only a matter of time away unless action is taken now.

I have also noticed that the number of Taxis on The Strand is increasing. I am not sure why, maybe more are just choosing to come to Torquay but there is definitely an increase. At one point over the weekend we had a line (parked every and anywhere they could) and I counted 41 Hackney Carriages, which I fear at the time was more than the number of people on The Strand. Also I have serious concerns about the rumours of de-regulation and the issues that it will bring. I spoke to a taxi driver who worked in Swansea when they did it and he said it was carnage, to the point it was reverted after 3 months. I would like to speak to you about this in more detail.

As you are aware I arranged with the drivers in consultation with you that they can use the first part of the bus stop from 21:00hrs in a bid to show that give and take is the best way to proceed.

However since that has been imposed our problem with drivers parking on the roundabout and blocking the exit has only started at 21:00hrs instead of 00:00hrs. Therefore as it was arranged that it would stay whilst it was used sensibly I recommend that this be removed with immediate effect. This is to ensure the continued safety of pedestrians and road users alike. I will have no issue with explaining to the drivers why that privilege has been removed.

I know that the council face difficulties as we do in dealing with this issue, but I must stress that something must be done. I know that space is limited and that there are too many Taxi's using Torquay at the moment. In response to this I have had an idea which involves closing the Vaughn Parade Taxi rank and utilising other currently unused space which will increase the number of Taxis able to fit on a rank. I promise that it is not as crazy as it sounds however it will be easier to discuss with you in person.

I look forward to your reply and please do not hesitate to contact me via email should you need to do so. Also I have emailed you reference meeting up with you in Paignton.

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#### **BRIEFING PAPER**

#### TAXI PARKING STRAND, TORQUAY

Since July 2006 the local Bus Company has encountered numerous complaints from drivers stating that they have been experiencing problems mainly on Friday and Saturday evenings with Taxi's taking over the bus bays on the Strand. When this problem occurs the buses cannot get in close to the kerb to load or unload passengers this causes an issue with passengers having to alight in the middle of the road. Also, those with disabilities who find it difficult to get off the bus because it is not adjacent to the kerb cannot alight at their stop.

On one occasion a bus driver noted a number of taxis causing problems on a particular night and one Taxi driver was particularly offensive to him.

Torbay Council has regular meetings with the bus companies and this issue is constantly being raised. Whilst signing and Traffic Orders are in place to prevent vehicles from waiting in the bus bays the problem has continued and bus drivers are becoming very despondent because no one seems to be addressing the issue.

The operation Managers for Stagecoach Bus Company have previously sent in a number of reports over the years completed by their drivers highlighting the taxi drivers causing the offences. These have been passed on to our Licensing Department requesting action be taken against the drivers.

The Licensing Department have informed Highways that many taxi drivers have been spoken with and reminded that it is an offence to park/wait within the Bus Bays however they do not have the power to take away a Drivers License and this is a matter for the Licensing Committee.

This is a very frustrating situation for the Council, as the Public Transport Team work to encourage and promote the use of Public Transport throughout the area. This in turn reduces congestion and carbon emissions and ensures buses can access the stops promoting the use for disabled and those with restricted mobility. However if the Bus Companies cannot access their specific bus bays for loading and unloading this discourages customers from using this form of transport.

The Taxi Parking issue has been ongoing for nearly four years since it was originally brought to the Council's attention.

I write to confirm the ongoing problems with taxis parking at the Strand bus stops.

This issue has been ongoing for the full duration of my time in post as Operations Manager since September 2007. However, I am aware that the previous manager raised this problem as early as 2006.

The main concern from my perspective is one of safety. If my vehicles cannot properly access their designated stopping places they are forced to disembark passengers in the middle of the road. This not only blocks the road for other road users but puts my passengers at risk.

Being unable to pull into the curb at a bus stop increases the potential of passengers falling on to or out of the bus and sustaining physical injuries. It also adds the risk of cyclists colliding with passengers on the nearside of the vehicle, which is a hazard that would otherwise not have been present.

I might add that the vast majority of my passengers are over the age of 60 and therefore many struggle with mobility issues. The step height from the bus to the curb is much lower than that directly onto the road; this in itself can cause physical injury and pain to some passengers.

The act of a taxi simply blocking a bus stop can therefore cause untold damage and is a deterrent to my passengers using my services in future.

We work in partnership with Torbay Council and hope to reach a resolution to this issue as soon as possible.

## Re: Torquay Harbourside & The Strand Taxi rank and Bus Bay

I am writing to you to advise you on the work being undertaken by Torbay Council and the Police to try and resolve issues that are arising in the use of The Strand, its taxi rank, the adjacent bus bay and the roundabout. During 2008 there have been a number of complaints about this area, mainly about drivers using areas not designated as taxi ranks. I have been tasked to try and find a solution to this problem. It is my view that a compromise is needed because their simply isn't enough space for all the demands made upon this area.

Torbay Council is also working with representatives of the Taxi Association to try and help find a solution.

I think it is important in the first instance to remind you that the only places drivers can queue for fares at this time are the three ranks, on Victoria Parade, on The Strand and on Cary Parade. Though waiting has been tolerated at times on the Bus Bay, it is must clear that the road traffic orders in place prohibit this.

Torbay Council has taken the view that it would be helpful to change the bus bay after midnight on the harbour side of The Strand; however it has to seek approval from the Department of Transport for this change. It has approached them about the change to the existing order and they have agreed with our submission that after midnight the Bus bay on the harbour side can become a taxi rank. This will still need to go through the proper channels of advertising etc, but we are hopeful that this can be agreed by mid March.

Until mid March there is no right to use this bus bay before or after midnight, and should you be approached and asked to move on, or even receive a fixed penalty notice, for doing so, I will expect you to comply. Should any driver make threats or anything similar against Torbay Council personnel or their contractors as some have done, they can expect to be brought before the Licensing Committee with the threat of their driver's licence being suspended. This also applies to any arguments with bus drivers, as they too have been warned and in two cases action has been taken against their drivers.

The same applies to the roundabout, where drivers have been queuing on it. This is simply not acceptable and is not only causing an obstruction but is simply dangerous. Ticketing is now taking

place in that area, as several drivers have discovered.

Finally, at the start of this letter I said Torbay Council is working with the Taxi Association, and through them we hoped to identify some other potential locations for new ranks. It may be that we are not successful, but we do understand times are hard and if we can help we will. The process is slow and there will be other interests regarding any location, who will have a right to raise their concerns, but if we feel the location is right, I will add my support behind any report to Licensing Committee.

In due course I will write again to confirm any changes we have been able to achieve.

### Re: Torquay Harbourside & The Strand Taxi rank and Bus Bay

I am writing to you and all other Hackney Carriage drivers to update you on the current situation with respect to taxi ranks and bus bays on the harbourside. The new rank, which is the bus bay on the harbourside of The Strand is now in place, for use after midnight. Stagecoach has agreed to move their final summer buses to the Debenham's side of The Strand to help facilitate this.

Unfortunately Hackney Carriage driver's have taken to using the Debenham's side of The Strand as well, for queuing. This is creating a similar problem that we were trying to resolve on the seaward side, that buses and other vehicles that are using that area legally, are potentially dropping passengers off away from the curb side. This is also happening at the GPO roundabout on the top of Fleet Walk by Tesco's. This could lead to a serious road incident, with potential injury or worse. There have already been a couple of near misses. I am sure this is not something you would wish to see and as a representative of Torbay Council I simply cannot allow to occur.

I must therefore insist that you do not use these areas, notably the bus bays on either side of The Strand and at the old GPO roundabout, by Tesco's. In the case of the seaward side of The Strand, this is just before midnight. This will also apply to any other areas which may cause obstruction of the highway or where there are Road Traffic Orders in place. If anybody is caught using them then they run the risk that action being taken against them, by way of fixed penalty notice or being brought before Licensing Committee.

I am sure this will be seen by many as unreasonable, but you must understand that waiting in these areas is not in compliance with the Road Traffic Orders, which are there to give everybody a share in the road space available, and as I said in my previous letter, there isn't sufficient space for all the competing interests.

Torbay Council is continuing to try and find further alternative spaces, to add to the 31 available after midnight on the harbourside. There are consultations taking place in several areas, following a meeting with the Taxi Association. I will give support to these and work on your behalf to try and secure more rank space, but I cannot promise anything at this time, as at least one location will also require Department of Transport approval, which will take time.

# Re: Torbay Harbourside & The Strand Taxi rank and Bus bay

I am writing to you and all other Hackney Carriage Drivers to clarify the article in the Herald Express on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> November, which you may have read. Torbay Council and Devon and Cornwall Police have been in discussions over the last 12 months to find solutions to a number of issues regarding the non-observation of Road Traffic Orders by some Hackney Carriage Drivers. This applies to all areas of Torbay, but especially on the harbourside.

In January and April 2009 I wrote to all drivers about what is expected in terms of where they queue or park up, but unfortunately many drivers have ignored my advice. This was re-enforced by the use of staff from NCP to ask drivers not to use certain areas, but again many drivers have since ignored this. These staff, who are doing our work, have often received abuse, which is totally unacceptable. This was only from a minority of drivers and these are being dealt with.

In light of drivers ignoring advice, new technology is being investigated and adopted to mean that drivers may receive fixed penalty notices without the need of any ticket being affixed to a vehicle. In the meantime evidence is being collected by Officers of Torbay Council, NCP staff and the Police of non-compliance with Road Traffic Orders. If you are generally compliant with Road Traffic Orders then you have nothing to concern yourselves about. But should you be witnessed queuing or parking in non-authorised areas you will be brought before Licensing Committee with the risk of having your drivers badge suspended. I take no pleasure in issuing this warning but due to a significant minority ignoring previous requests it has left me with no option. So you must take this as a final warning.

So why are we doing this? Firstly to ensure all road users have their fair share of the limited space. This is particularly true of Torquay harbourside, but this equally applies elsewhere on the harbourside and in Torbay generally. Before midnight taxis have 18% of allocated space on the harbourside. After midnight it is 26%. The second reason is to avoid accidents due to incorrectly queuing or parked vehicles.

What else are we trying to do?

Discussions continue between various departments and the Police to find solutions and consultation has taken place on a section of road on Torwood Street in recent months, but unfortunately again the objections are too strong to change the present designation. Due to this we are prepared to allow 'unofficially' that the rear of the Strand bus stop 4 spaces to be used between 9pm and midnight. This is not a permanent situation because the development of further bus routes is one of the objectives of Torbay Council and the space may be needed in the future. However it may help us all get through the recession to better times.

There are also other considerations in the pipeline, but these would be linked to harbourside developments, so are not likely to arise in the near future. However we will continue to consider any options that are presented to us.

So as one final reminder, comply with the Road Traffic Orders or run the risk of having your drivers badge suspended, or worse.

### Re: Hackney Carriage Drivers

I am writing to you following a meeting of the Torbay Taxi Association dated 17<sup>th</sup> August 2010, which I attended along with two colleagues from Devon and Cornwall Constabulary. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss a proposal by Torbay Council and Devon and Cornwall Constabulary to remove the Vaughan Parade and The Strand Bus Stop ranks and to replace them with new temporary ranks on Torwood Street.

This was met with complete opposition, due a number of reasons. Some of those reasons had validity but maybe some less so. The vast majority present preferred an option of hard enforcement to address the concerns of public safety, so targeting those who refuse to take responsibility for their actions. Since that meeting Officers at Torbay Council have met with their Police colleagues to review our response.

I am writing to all Hackney Carriage Drivers and Plate holders to confirm that response and to offer a compromise to these concerns. The first is that the Vaughan Parade rank will remain in use during the working day (between 6am to 6pm), so those drivers that rely upon it can continue to do so.

We are also offering to retain the Vaughan Parade rank during the evening and night (between 6pm to 6am) and The Strand Bus Bay rank (harbour side of The Strand between midnight and 6am), for a trial period of two months. However, this does **NOT** include The Strand Bus Bay (harbour side) between 9pm and midnight, which has been allowed 'unofficially' to be used as a rank.

If after a trial period of 2 months the problems continue, then these provisions will be withdrawn. The two months will commence from 6pm on 17<sup>th</sup> September 2010.

Finally a temporary rank will be installed outside The Clocktower pub, on Torwood Street in Torquay on Friday and Saturday evenings 6pm to 6am, as a means of trying to ease the situation though it may not be in place by the 17<sup>th</sup> September 2010, though I am hoping it will be.

If you require this in a different format or language, please contact me.

The problems I make reference to above, include the queuing on the Clock Tower roundabout, or the driving around it numerous times which results in traffic being blocked, or any queuing in unauthorised bus bays or where there are Road Traffic Orders. The removal of the 9pm to midnight 'unofficial' use of the rear of The Strand (harbourside) is due to significant concerns that have arisen recently with drivers queuing on the Clock Tower roundabout, and buses using the roundabout. This has been made more difficult recently due to the hoardings that surround the Clock Tower meaning buses do not have a good line of sight. This was only ever agreed originally providing drivers policed it and did not queue on to the roundabout. However, this has not been the case and as such, this provision is now withdrawn

Although Torbay Council and the Police will endeavour to enforce during the specified trial period, the ultimate responsibility is for ALL drivers to ensure that the trial is a success. The responsibility is therefore partially yours if you work in this area at night. If you do work on Torquay harbourside at night and you want to keep these ranks then obey the Road Traffic Orders and help ensure that others do too.

Earlier this year Torbay Council used its Licensing Committee to support the work of the Police and the Parking Enforcement Team and a number of drivers were suspended for 7 days. So can you please take this as a warning as any driver who is caught parking or queuing in areas with Road Traffic Orders, runs the risk of having their drivers licence suspended. Although our enforcement will be concentrating initially on the harbourside, this will apply elsewhere too.



I am writing to you to inform you that your vehicle registration details have been passed to me by Torbay Council's Parking Enforcement Officers because your vehicle has been seen illegally parked on Union Street, Torquay. The Parking Enforcement Officers have informed me that at 10:37hrs on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> October 2010 and again at 14:30hrs on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2010 your vehicle was parked on double yellow lines outside Natwest Bank on Union Street. Please be reminded that you should not be parking illegally at any time and any further breaches of parking regulations could result in you being brought before the Licensing Committee to explain your actions. I have enclosed the relevant photographs from the dates quoted.

As I am sure you are aware there have been many problems with the parking of taxis around Torquay for sometime now and we have reached the point where we can no longer allow this situation to continue. If you were not the driver of the vehicle at this time please accept my apologies, however I do need you to contact me to advise me of who was driving your vehicle at the time this incident took place.



 The driver of a hackney carriage of a description for which stands are fixed by any byelaw in that behalf shall when plying for hire in any street and not actually hired:

- (a) Proceed with reasonable speed to and station the carriage on one of such
  stands or the stands provided at Torquay Paignton or Torre Stations if
  authorised by the Railway Authorities to use such stands;
  - (b) If a stand at the time of his arrival is occupied by the full number of carriages authorised to occupy it proceed to another stand;
- (c) On arriving at a stand not already occupied by the full number of carriages authorised to occupy it station the carriage immediately behind the carriage authorised to occupy it station the carriage immediately behind
- or carriages on the stand and so as to face in the same direction;

  (d) From time to time when any other carriage immediately in front is driven off or moved forward so as to fill the
- place previously occupied by the carriage driven off or moved forward;

  (e) If his carriage is the first or second carriage on the stand remain with the carriage ready to be hired at once.
- A proprietor or driver of a hackney carriage when standing or plying for hire shall not be calling out or otherwise importune any person to hire such carriage and shall not make use of the services of any person for the purpose.
- 10. Every proprietor or driver of a hackney carriage shall at all times when standing plying or driving for hire, conduct himself in a civil and orderly manner be clean and respectable in his dress and shall act with civility towards every person seeking to hire such carriage and shall comply with every reasonable requirement of any person hiring such carriage and shall take all reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of persons conveyed in or entering or alighting from the vehicle.
- 11. The proprietor or driver of a hackney carriage who has agreed or has been hired to be in attendance with the carriage at an appointed time and place shall unless delayed or prevented by some sufficient cause punctually attend with such carriage at such appointed time and place.
- 12. The driver of a hackney carriage when hired to drive to any particular destination shall subject to any directions given by the hirer proceed to that destination by the shortest available route.
- 13. A proprietor or driver of a hackney carriage shall not convey or permit to be conveyed in such carriage any greater number of persons than the number of persons specified on the plate affixed to the outside of the carriage. For the purposes of this byelaw, two children between the ages of three and ten years shall be regarded as one person but no more than six such children may be conveyed in a hackney carriage at any one time. A child under the age of three years shall not be reckoned.

14. It a badge has been provided by the Council and delivered to the driver of a hackney carriage he shall when standing or plying for hire and when hired wear that badge in such a position and manner as to be plainly visible.

15. The driver of a hackney carriage so constructed as to carry luggage shall when requested by any person hiring or seeking to hire the carriage:

Convey a reasonable quantity of luggage;

- Afford reasonable assistance in loading or unloading;
- Afford reasonable assistance in removing it to or from the entrance of any house station or place at which he may take up or set down such person.
- 16. A driver of a motor hackney carriage shall not at any time when driving for hire smoke tobacco or any other like substance except with the consent of the hirer.
- 17. A proprietor or driver of a hackney carriage who shall knowingly convey in the carriage the dead body of any person and shall immediately thereafter notify the fact to the Medical Officer of Health of the Council.
  - 18. The driver or proprietor of a motor hackney carriage shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent the discharge therefrom in any street or public place of oil or spirit and shall not repair such carriage in any such street or public place so as to cause any such discharge except where such repairs are essential to secure the continued safe functioning of the vehicle and shall not wash such carriage in any street or public place.
- 19. The driver of a hackney carriage shall during the time that such carriage is standing at one of the stands referred to in these byclaws keep such stand in a clean and tidy condition.
- 20. The driver of a hackney carriage vehicle shall at all times while standing or plying for hire, have a copy of these Byelaws and shall produce the same for perusal and inspection on request by any person hiring the carriage, or other passenger, or any Authorised Officer of the Council.
- 21. A proprietor or driver of a hackney carriage shall not, while standing, plying or driving for hire drive or allow to be driven or harnessed to the carriage any animal in such a condition as to expose any person conveyed or being in such carriage or any person traversing any street to risk of injury.
- 22. The driver of a hackney carriage drawn by any animal or animals shall while standing plying or driving for hire cause every part of the harness of the animal or animals drawing the carriage to be kept in order so that the animal or animals shall be properly and securely attached to the carriage and under due control.

At 0037, I witnessed Hackney Carriage HC102, registration number WF57 ZUA, illegally parked on double yellow lines at the rear of the bus lane on the seaward side of Torquay Harbour, which forms part of the Clocktower Roundabout. At the time in question a police van on an emergency call, came around the clock tower roundabout and moved the vehicle on as it was causing an obstruction in the highway. The driver, Mr Zarezadeh, did not pull over as was suggest in his letter dated 10th March 2011, but

was already parking/queuing on the double yellow lines to the rear of the rank.
