- 1.1 To consider and determine an application, in respect of the Premise detailed above, for a new Premises Licence.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 As the Licensing Authority has no powers under the Act to raise a Representation, Officers are unable to make any recommendation.
- 1.4 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Crime and Disorder" "Public Safety" and "The Protection of Children from Harm"
- 1.5 The matter must be considered on its merits having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written Representation if all parties have agreed that a hearing is not necessary. A decision must be made, having considered the Representations, either:-
 - (a) to grant the licence subject to

(i) such conditions as are consistent with the submitted operating Schedule modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and

(ii) any condition which must under Section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence;

2.1 An application has been made under Section 17 of the Act for a Premises Licence to permit licensable activities at the Premise detailed above. Details of the relevant pages of the application are shown in Appendix 1.

The supply of alcohol off the Premises from 07:00hrs until 23:00hrs Monday to Sunday.

- 2.6 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 5 to :-
 - (a) The holder of the licence against any decision
 - (i) to impose conditions on the licence, or
 - (ii) to take any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify a person as Premises Supervisor.
 - (b) Any person who made a relevant Representations who desires to contend
 - (i) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (ii) that, on granting the licence, the Licensing Authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or taken any step to Page 2

2.7 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' Court may:-

(a) dismiss the appeal,

and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

2.7 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' Court may:
(a) dismiss the appeal,
(b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or
(c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court, and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application, in respect of the Premise detailed above, for a Variation to a Premises Licence.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 As the Licensing Authority has no powers under the Act to raise a Representation, Officers are unable to make any recommendation.
- 1.4 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives "Public Safety" and "The Prevention of Public Nuisance"
- 1.5 The matter must be considered on its merits having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written Representation if all parties have agreed that a hearing is not necessary. Having regard to the Representation, a decision must be made to take such steps as are necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. These are either:-
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence, or
 - (b) reject the application in whole or in part.

For this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

1.6 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Interested Parties and Responsible Authorities at the

determination of the matter.

2. Introduction

2.1 An application has been made under Section 34 of the Act for a Variation to a Premises Licence. Details of the application are shown in Appendix 1.

A brief description of the proposed Variation is as follows:-

To permit Live Music, Recorded Music and Provision of Facilities for Dancing on Monday to Sunday from 0900 to Midnight.

To permit Late Night Refreshment on Monday to Sunday from 2300 to 0030

To extend the Sale of Alcohol on Monday to Sunday from 0900 to Midnight.

The Premises are currently licensed for the Sale of Alcohol on Monday to Saturday from 1000 to 2300 and on Sunday from Noon to 2230.

- 2.2 There is a current Premises Licence in place which is shown as Appendix 2.
- 2.3 Torbay Council as the Licensing Authority is satisfied that the Applicant has met the administrative requirements of Section 35(1) but is unable to issue the amended Premises Licence, as relevant Representations have been received from Interested Parties. The Licensing Authority is also satisfied that Representations were received within the appropriate time-scale, have not been subsequently withdrawn and are not vexatious or frivolous.

The Licensing Authority has received 4 Representations from Interested Parties in relation to the Licensing Objectives "Public Safety" and "The Prevention of Public Nuisance". These are shown as Appendix 3.

There have been no additional Representations received from any Responsible Authority or any other Interested Party.

- 2.4 The Authority is required to conduct a hearing by the provisions of Section 35(3) unless all parties agree that this is not necessary.
- 2.5 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representations and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.6 If the application is refused, in whole or in part, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 1 of Schedule 5, to the Applicant.
- 2.7 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 4(2) of Schedule 5 to :(a) The applicant for the variation of the licence against any decision to modify the conditions
 (b) Any person who made a relevant representation in relation to the application
 - (b) Any person who made a relevant representation in relation to the application who desires to contend
 - (i) that any variation made ought not to have been made, or

My representation is made on the following two Licensing Objectives identified in the Current Licensing Act; Prevention of Public Nulsance and Public Safety of which I've detailed a number of key points. Beacon Quay is a working harbour for both commercial and leisure activities, with a unique ambiance and safety record to be proud of. Thousands of users, ranging from the very young (many youth clubs including the Torbay Youth Sailing Trust), families enjoying valuable leisure time, to professional racing (such as the recently successful Laser SB3 world championships). Since the Torquay Harbour regeneration and the redevelopment of Beacon Quay, the past few years have been unique in terms of successful continuity with the small businesses. based on the Quay Below Decks historically was a Cafe and should remain as such. Introducing live and amplified music would change the environment completely and would be detrimental to the survival of the now well established business community. These varied businesses have experienced challenging financial times over recent years and the thought of disorder and drunkenness (which is an unfortunate fact of venues that participate in live or amplified music) on the Quayside would have irreversible financial consequences. The Torbay Harbour Byelaws clearly states in Section 24 that "No wireless, amplifier, gramophone or loud haller shall be operated, from a vessel or otherwise, within an enclosed harbour so as to give reasonable cause for annoyance to other users of the harbour".

Itemised below are the facts that relate to my object to the application:

Prevention of Public Nulsance

A recent council report states "The harbour is recognised as a 'fantastic' natural environment which needs protection and is important to the Bay's appeal as a tourist destination." The ambiance of the Quayside is unique and should remain. Granting this license would rescind on the authorities vision and Torquay Harbour Action Plan for the following reasons:


- Ambience of the quayside
- The layout of the premises and the detached seating area makes it impossible to contain the noise.

Public Safety

Public Safety is of paramount importance. Granting this license would seriously jeopardise public safety and questionably undermine all the hard work, initiated by Torbay Council, in trying to curtail the ever increasing drunkenness, disorder and alcohol related incidents. The reasons include:

- A combination of alcohol and live or amplified music is not conducive to proving a safe environment for the many users of the Quay.
- The over-stretched police force do not have the resource to police a remote venue such as Below Desks.
- The Harbour Authority are trained professionals in the marine industry and do not have the jurisdiction or expertise to manage an outdoor drinking and music venue.

It is clear that all of the above points would not only contravene the Licensing Objectives of the Licensing Act 2003, but also the Harbour bylaws and therefore I would suggest that Torbay Council have no option but to refuse the application.

We have a right to carry out our business in a quiet and peaceful environment, and would expect our neighbours not to infringe on our rights.

Extension of licensing hours:

Being located next door to Below Decks, we regularly have the inconvenience of nent outside our shop during the day drinking alcohol, sometimes blocking access to our customers, and we can see no reason why a harbourside cafe establishment has a need to extend the drinking hours any further, we feel they are trying to be a public house, rather than a food outlet.

 Music late in to the night should not normally be allowed. At worst it should be occasional and limited until no later than 11.00pm.


