1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application, in respect of the Premise detailed above, for a Variation to a Premises Licence.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 As the Licensing Authority has no powers under the Act to raise a Representation, Officers are unable to make any recommendation.
- 1.4 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives "Public Safety" and "The Prevention of Public Nuisance"
- 1.5 The matter must be considered on its merits having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written Representation if all parties have agreed that a hearing is not necessary. Having regard to the Representation, a decision must be made to take such steps as are necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. These are either:-
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence, or
 - (b) reject the application in whole or in part.

For this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

1.6 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Interested Parties and Responsible Authorities at the

determination of the matter.

2. Introduction

2.1 An application has been made under Section 34 of the Act for a Variation to a Premises Licence. Details of the application are shown in Appendix 1.

A brief description of the proposed Variation is as follows:-

To permit Live Music, Recorded Music and Provision of Facilities for Dancing on Monday to Sunday from 0900 to Midnight.

To permit Late Night Refreshment on Monday to Sunday from 2300 to 0030

To extend the Sale of Alcohol on Monday to Sunday from 0900 to Midnight.

The Premises are currently licensed for the Sale of Alcohol on Monday to Saturday from 1000 to 2300 and on Sunday from Noon to 2230.

- 2.2 There is a current Premises Licence in place which is shown as Appendix 2.
- 2.3 Torbay Council as the Licensing Authority is satisfied that the Applicant has met the administrative requirements of Section 35(1) but is unable to issue the amended Premises Licence, as relevant Representations have been received from Interested Parties. The Licensing Authority is also satisfied that Representations were received within the appropriate time-scale, have not been subsequently withdrawn and are not vexatious or frivolous.

The Licensing Authority has received 4 Representations from Interested Parties in relation to the Licensing Objectives "Public Safety" and "The Prevention of Public Nuisance". These are shown as Appendix 3.

There have been no additional Representations received from any Responsible Authority or any other Interested Party.

- 2.4 The Authority is required to conduct a hearing by the provisions of Section 35(3) unless all parties agree that this is not necessary.
- 2.5 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representations and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.6 If the application is refused, in whole or in part, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 1 of Schedule 5, to the Applicant.
- 2.7 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 4(2) of Schedule 5 to :(a) The applicant for the variation of the licence against any decision to modify the conditions
 (b) Any person who made a relevant representation in relation to the application
 - (b) Any person who made a relevant representation in relation to the application who desires to contend
 - (i) that any variation made ought not to have been made, or

(ii) that, when varying the licence, the Licensing Authority ought to have modified the conditions of the licence or ought to have modified them in a different way.

- 2.8 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' court may:-
 - (a) dismiss the appeal,

(b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or

(c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court,

and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

Noise or vibration will not emanate from the premises such as to cause persons in the neighbourhood to be unreasonably disturbed. In general terms, noise from the premises should not be audible within any noise sensitive premises (e.g. dwelling) with windows open for normal ventilation especially after 11pm. This will be assessed from the boundary to the nearest residential properties, on all sides of the licensed premises. The criteria that will be applied are;

- i. Before 11pm Noise emanating from the premises will not be clearly distinguishable above other noise.
- ii. After 11pm Noise emanating from the premises will not be distinguishable above background levels of noise.
- iii. The local authority will reserve the right in cases of tonal noise and where premises are attached to others (i.e. semi's and terraced properties), to make further assessments from within the residential property.

ANNEXE 1

MANDATORY CONDITION: WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

.

- 1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence , or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- 2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

ANNEXE 2

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

Restrictions transferred from the On Licence

The restrictions related to permitted hours do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purpose of the trade or club.
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of alcohol so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of the employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

ANNEXES continued ...

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is sold or supplied, except alcohol sold or supplied:

- (a) with and for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, consumed with the meal and paid for together with the meal;
- (b) for consumption by a person residing in the premises or his guest and paid for together with his accommodation;
- (c) to a canteen or mess.

Conditions Transferred from Full On (Restricted) Licence

- 1. Substantial food and beverages other than intoxicating liquor shall be available throughout licencing hours.
- 2. The consumption of all alcohol shall be by persons sat at tables and there shall be no consumption of alcohol from glass bottles from which it is intended or likely that a person shall drink.



My representation is made on the following two licensing Objectives identified in the Current Licensing Act; Prevention of Public Nulsance and Public Safety of which I've detailed a number of key points. Beacon Quay is a working harbour for both commercial and leisure activities, with a unique ambiance and safety record to be proud of. Thousands of users, ranging from the very young (many youth clubs including the Torbay Youth Sailing Trust), families enjoying valuable leisure time, to professional racing (such as the recently successful Laser SB3 world championships). Since the Torquay Harbour regeneration and the redevelopment of Beacon Quay, the past few years have been unique in terms of successful continuity with the small businesses. based on the Quay Below Decks historically was a Cafe and should remain as such. Introducing live and amplified music would change the environment completely and would be detrimental to the survival of the now well established business community. These varied businesses have experienced challenging financial times over recent years and the thought of disorder and drunkenness (which is an unfortunate fact of venues that participate in live or amplified music) on the Quayside would have irreversible financial consequences. The Torbay Harbour Byelaws clearly states in Section 24 that "No wireless, amplifier, gramophone or loud haller shall be operated, from a vessel or otherwise, within an enclosed harbour so as to give reasonable cause for annoyance to other users of the harbour".

Itemised below are the facts that relate to my object to the application:

Prevention of Public Nulsance

A recent council report states "The harbour is recognised as a 'fantastic' natural environment which needs protection and is important to the Bay's appeal as a tourist destination." The ambiance of the Quayside is unique and should remain. Granting this license would rescind on the authorities vision and Torquay Harbour Action Plan for the following reasons:

- Ambience of the quayside
- The layout of the premises and the detached seating area makes it impossible to contain the noise.

Public Safety

Public Safety is of paramount importance. Granting this license would seriously jeopardise public safety and questionably undermine all the hard work, initiated by Torbay Council, in trying to curtail the ever increasing drunkenness, disorder and alcohol related incidents. The reasons include:

- A combination of alcohol and live or amplified music is not conducive to proving a safe environment for the many users of the Quay.
- The over-stretched police force do not have the resource to police a remote venue such as Below Desks.
- The Harbour Authority are trained professionals in the marine industry and do not have the jurisdiction or expertise to manage an outdoor drinking and music venue.

It is clear that all of the above points would not only contravene the Licensing Objectives of the Licensing Act 2003, but also the Harbour bylaws and therefore I would suggest that Torbay Council have no option but to refuse the application.

Music Licence:

and have previous experience of live music being played from the cate during the daytime. On those occasions it was impossible to conduct telephone calls or speak to our customers in the shop due to the noise of the music. The internal space of Below Decks is quite small, and their patio area is some distance from the cafe, therefore it is assumed that the volume will have to be set quite high in order for their customers on the patio area to hear it. We have a right to carry out our business in a quiet and peaceful environment, and would expect our neighbours not to infringe on our rights.

Extension of licensing hours:

Being located next door to Below Decks, we regularly have the inconvenience of nent outside our shop during the day drinking alcohol, sometimes blocking access to our customers, and we can see no reason why a harbourside cafe establishment has a need to extend the drinking hours any further, we feel they are trying to be a public house, rather than a food outlet.



1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application, in respect of the Premise detailed above, for a new Premises Licence.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 As the Licensing Authority has no powers under the Act to raise a Representation, Officers are unable to make any recommendation.
- 1.4 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Crime and Disorder", "Public Safety", "The Prevention of Public Nuisance" and "The Protection of Children from Harm".
- 1.5 The matter must be considered on its merits having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written Representation if all parties have agreed that a hearing is not necessary. A decision must be made, having considered the Representations, either:-
 - (a) to grant the licence subject to

(i) such conditions as are consistent with the submitted operating
 Schedule modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary
 for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 (ii) any condition which must under Section 19, 20 or 21 be included in

(ii) any condition which must under Section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence;

(Such conditions may differ in respect of different parts of the Premises and/or different activities).

(b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;

- (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the Premises Supervisor;
- (d) to reject the application.

1.6 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Interested Parties and Responsible Authorities following the determination of the matter.

2. Introduction

2.1 An application has been made under Section 17 of the Act for a Premises Licence to permit licensable activities at the Premise detailed above. Details of the relevant pages of the application and the plan are shown in Appendix 1 and 2.

A brief description of the application, as follows:

The provision of Late Night Refreshment indoors from 2300 until 0015 7 days a week.

The sale of alcohol on and off the Premises from 1000 until midnight 7 days a week.

To be open to the public from 0800 until 0030 7 days a week.

2.2 The Council as the Licensing Authority is satisfied that the Applicant has met the administrative requirements of Section 17(5) but is unable to issue the Licence, as a relevant Representations have been received from a Responsible Authority and Interested Parties. The Licensing Authority is also satisfied that the Representations have been received within the appropriate time scale, have not been subsequently withdrawn and are not vexatious or frivolous.

We have received a Representation from Public Protection in relation to the Licensing Objective "The Prevention of Public Nuisance". This is shown as Appendix 3.

We have received five Representations from Interested Parties in relation to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of "Crime and Disorder", "Public Safety", "The Prevention of Public Nuisance" and "The Protection of Children from Harm". These are shown in Appendix 4.

- 2.3 The Authority is required to conduct a hearing by the provisions of Section 18(3) unless all parties agree that this is not necessary.
- 2.4 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representations and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.5 If the application is refused, in whole or in part, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 1 of Schedule 5, to the Applicant.
- 2.6 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 5 to :-
 - (a) The holder of the licence against any decision
 - (i) to impose conditions on the licence, or

- (ii) to take any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify a person as Premises Supervisor.
- (b) Any person who made a relevant Representation who desires to contend
 - (i) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (ii) that, on granting the licence, the Licensing Authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or taken any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify person as Premises Supervisor.

2.7 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' Court may:-

(a) dismiss the appeal,

(b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or

(c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court,

and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

c) Public safety



I would therefore recommend that the following conditions be applied to the licence to alleviate the residents concerns.

"A responsible member of staff will take steps to monitor the outside drinking area and take all reasonable steps to minimise public nuisance from people drinking in the outside area particularly after 18:00. "


"Drinking will not be allowed in the external drinking area after 20:00."

Dear Licensing, This application seems to be asking for many things all at once.

I object in full to an outside drinking license, plus also object to the late hours application, and also object to any license at all being given if it is not 'with food'. I also object to retail sales.

I have lived since 1999 at the above address in the residential flat fronting this application. My bedroom window looks over the 'Market House' full-on.

In the past few years I have had to call the police on a number of occasions in the late evening/night due to brawling in the street (The Strand) outside. The harbour area seems to attract the drunks.

I object to this application on the grounds of:

- 1) Late night crime & disorder would increase.
- 2) Public nuisance. Drunk people are invariably noisy, and the harbour is a basin in effect, a natural amphitheatre, where all sounds are amplified due to the nature of the high sided cliffs all round. All the houses all the way round would also hear any noise from below in the harbour streets. As for my own bedroom, all

noise would carry straight in. People who have been drinking 'hang-around' the harbour after the premises are shut. I think a 'buffer-time for them to disperse would be acceptable. As a resident I would have no objection to a license until 11 pm, probably in keeping with other surrounding licensed restaurant premises.

3) By asking for such a late license, it suggests that the nature of the business is more a drinking establishment (pub) than a food and alcohol license. An 11pm cut-off would keep the nature more of a restaurant, not a rowdy pub. And rowdy outside it would be with an outside seating area and balcony. Residents have the right to quiet enjoyment after 10.30pm

To protect nearby residents the 'Old Brewery' application in Ellacombe Torquay (Nov 2010) had a noise management plan suggested by Gareth Fudge, Noise 'Abatement Officer of Torbay Council, and the plan was accepted, consisting of no customers outside after 10.30pm. May I suggest a similar plan be considered if the council feel it appropriate, to protect the noise in the whole harbour area and all the residents who look down on the harbour area, if a licenses is to be granted. Brixham harbour is not a flat area!

- 4) Public safety: The harbour is a dangerous place for people who have been drinking. There are stone steps down to a deep harbour (when the tide is in) just outside the front of the Market House premises. These are dangerous to people drinking around outside, as indeed the whole harbour area is.
- 5) The harbour is the focal point for tourism in Brixham. Many tourists are families. Children run around the pavements exploring while their parents sit and take in the view. Drinking allowed outside is not conducive to this, and an be deemed harmful to children in terms of bad language and raised volces due to drinking, and a bad example to see drinking in the street area. The Golden Hind attraction right outside the market House is a magnet to children.
- 6) The majority of visitors outside of school holidays are older, retired people. People outside drinking on pavement level would be harmful to their feeling of safety.

Surely only alcoholic drinks with food prevents this premises from causing crime/disorder, public nuisance, public safety, & harm to children.

Retail sales are not necessary in the habour area. The town is served with a supermarket open til 11pm selling alcohol already (Tesco). Retail sales in the harbour would encourage drinking around the harbour, which is not permitted. Who would be around to enforce this? The police cannot be called every time someone opens a can of beer as they walk round the harbour. There are no other retail shops in the vicinity for food/drink to consume at home, the harbour is not the right place for this.

All in all, please consider this application very carefully, as if there is any noise after 11pm from it, as a resident, and like I am sure other residents, if there is any noise or trouble if licenses are granted, I will be calling the Police and relevant authorities if there is due cause. Hopefully the licensing application being considered will take all my points if deemed relevant into account.

May I ask that fly-posting be forbidden if a license is granted, it would make a tourist area look untidy. I gather that such a restriction can be placed on a license.

I am writing to object to the application above. A late night licence with the outdoor seating area, together with the retail sales of alcohol from 10:00 until midnight every day will, in my view, completely change the nature of the harbour area for the worse. Part of Brixham's charm to which tourists are drawn, is the quiet and unspoiled nature of the town, especially round the harbour area. To alter this radically, as the proposed licence will undoubtedly do, is likely to irrevocably damage the town's tourism, and all of the other traders in the town are dependent on this tourism.

There is sufficient ill-feeling in the town regarding the sale of the building, which was left to the people of Brixham, as it is without further aggravating the situation with licencing arrangements which are unnecessary. I am also concerned for the people who reside on the quayside as I can imagine the noise generated by people sitting drinking outside is likely to be considerable, and that is without the provision of a late-night licence.

Having looked at the web site for St Austell Brewery why are they asking for longer opening hours than any of their other establishments. Have other councils realised the problems of late night drinking. Having lived in the harbour for over 35 years I have seen the changes. Brixtnam's charm is being eroded by the late night consumption of accord/noise/behaviour after 11pm. Brocham has a large number of holiday lets and it is important that the visitors leave Brixtnam with a memory a quaint un sooit Town. These visitors are our life blood in the winter. Botham Trawler race shows what can happen when people have the opportunity to donk inside and out all day. Shop windows were smached (prevention of crime and disorder) In Britcharn at hight families can walk with their children on the harbor side pavement without being close to drinkers. I seel strongly that the consumption of alcohol should only be with in the walls of the market house. Already the public will be put at risk having to walk close to the balcony where glasses could be dropped accidentally. With long opening hours in such a predominant area there is no guarantee that children will not be protected from excessive drinking or harm by possible drunks. Will the pub be required to employing security to reduce the risk of trouble? (Protection of children from harm) Longer drinking hours often lead to the increase in criminal damage to surrounding areas and an increase of members of the public unnating in alley ways and storage areas. Considering the council closes tollets at an early time any license should consider this. (public safety) When customers come out of a premise after drinking they are often loud and abusive not aware of their actions and the worry would be that an innocent member of the public might be pushed in to the harbour. (Prevention of public nuisance) Britham needs to survive and it is important that all of the businesses compete on an even playing field and that no one business is given an unlair advantage over any other: Over the years pubs and restaurants have had to work with resections and if the council were to grant this license in its present state it would be the detriment to the other pubs and restaurant that are striving to survive. This business already has had concessions given to it, from the scaffolding in the road to the retrospective planning application for knocking walls down in a grade 1 building.
