Members noted that there had been no Representations from the Police or Trading Standards.

Decision:

That the application for a Premises Licence in respect of The Brixham Rendezvous, 35 Fore Street, Brixham TQ5 8AA be granted as applied for, subject to the two additional conditions put forward by the Torbay Safeguarding Children Board and as agreed by the applicant.

In addition, no sale of alcohol shall be permitted from the takeaway part of the Premises for consumption off the Premises.

Members noted that the third floor of the Premises shall be removed from the application.

Reason for Decision:

Having carefully considered all the written and oral Representations, Members resolved to grant the License having been satisfied that to do so would not undermine the Licensing Objectives.

In granting the application, Members we also encouraged by the Oral Representation from the Torbay Safeguarding Children's Board's Business Manager in that she felt confident in the Applicant's and that following her meeting with them and as such, she endorsed the application subject to the two additional conditions.

Members noted that there was no Representation from the Police or Torbay Council's Public Safety and that both Responsible Authority's had met with the Applicant's as part of the consultation prior to the application being submitted. This again reassured Member's that granting this Licence would not undermine the Licensing Objectives, namely 'The Prevention of Crime and Disorder' and 'The Prevention of Public Nuisance.'

Members were very concerned to note that despite the Representation made by Brixham Town Council, the Member who appeared before the Licensing Committee on their behalf did by their own admission, admit that he had no evidence to support the Representation made by them.

Members felt that making such a Representation with no evidence was not only a waste of the Licensing Authority's time but that such action was a considerable waste to the tax payer because, as in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, where a Representation is made, the Authority must hold a hearing to consider it and this is a costly process for the Local Authority.

Members were advised by the Senior Licensing Officer that the Applicant would not be attending the Committee and had sent an e-mail confirming acceptance of the proposed Conditions by the Torbay Safeguarding Children Board.

- 1) No children under the age of 18 shall be allowed on the premises unless they are attending a private function or working on the premises in the capacity as a trainee; and
- 2) All children under the age of 18 attending private functions must be accompanied by a responsible adult; and
- 3) All trainees on site who are under 18 must be supervised by an adult tutor; and
- 4) A proof of age policy for any customer purchasing alcohol who looks under 25 years of age.

Members had questions that could not be answered by the Senior Licensing Officer.

Decision:

That the application for a Premises Licence in respect of Eat That Frog, 89 Torquay Road, Paignton TQ3 2SE be deferred to enable the Applicant to attend and explain how the Premises will be run complying with the Licensing Objectives.

Members noted there have been no Representations received from any Responsible Authority.

Copies of the Minutes of a Licensing Sub-Committee dated 28 July 2011 in respect of an application for a Premises Licence in respect of PB Stores, 105 Foxhole Road, Paignton TQ3 3SU and a Case Law document were made available to Members as these were referred to in the Oral Representation.

Decision:

That the application for a Premises Licence in respect of Bargain Booze, 105 Foxhole Road, Paignton TQ3 3SU be granted as applied for, subject to the following two additional Conditions;

That the notice as circulated at Committee hearing by the Applicant's Legal Representative be prominently displayed within the store and an A3 size of the notice be displayed in a prominent position in the window of the premises; and

That in 'all due diligence' a refusal log must be kept to record when sales of alcohol are challenged or refused and that this log shall be made available to the Police and the Local Authority, upon request.

Reason for Decision:

Having carefully considered all the Oral and Written Representations, Members gave due consideration of the concerns raised by the Interested Parties in particular respect to the Protection of Children from Harm and Anti Social Behaviour, however they noted the absence of any Representation from Safeguarding Children, Trading Standards and the Police in support of these concerns or of the application itself.

Having heard from the applicants Legal Representative on issues raised by the Interested Parties, Members were reassured that the Conditions imposed on the Premises Licence would alleviate these concerns and that compliance by the Premises Licence Holders and their staff of the manual as circulated at Committee would promote the Licensing Objectives.

The Minutes of the meeting of the Sub-Committee held on 27 June 2013 were confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

11. Allegation of inappropriate conduct towards Civil Enforcement Officers

Members considered a report and appendices 1 to 12, in respect of an allegation of inappropriate conduct by a Torbay Council Licensed Driver.

Decision:

That Mr Nasim's Torbay Council Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence be suspended for a period of four weeks, on the ground of 'any other reasonable cause', as in accordance with Section 61(1)(b) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, and that this suspension shall be with immediate effect, in

accordance with Section 61(2B) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, as it appears to Members on hearing the facts of the case that it is appropriate to do so in the interests of public safety.

Reason for Decision:

Having carefully considered all the written and oral Representations, Members resolved to suspend Mr Nasim's Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence for the following reasons:

It was accepted by Mr Nasim and subsequently agreed by Mr Fenlon, who appeared in support of Mr Nasim that Mr Nasim had parked illegally on two separate occasions during the same incident and it was that which led to the Civil Enforcement Officers returning to the location of Mr Nasim's vehicle.

Members found that the Civil Enforcement Officers had acted in accordance with Torbay Council's Parking Enforcement Policy when taking photographs of Mr Nasim's vehicle which was in contravention of the road traffic order. As such, Members dismissed the submission by Mr Nasim that the Civil Enforcement Officers were threatening and harassing him and taking unnecessary pictures for no reason.

Whilst Members had due regard to the written Representations of both Mr Fenlon and Ms Cartwright and the subsequent oral Representation by Mr Fenlon at the hearing, Members noted that neither of these witnesses by their own admission had heard what Mr Nasim said to the Civil Enforcement Officers. Therefore Members unanimously concluded that the evidence given by the Civil Enforcement Officers was a true account of the incident. This conclusion was largely founded on the photographic evidence which supported the allegation that Mr Nasim had behaved inappropriately towards the said Officers. When questioned by Members, Mr Nasim accepted that the photograph which showed his inappropriate hand gesture towards the said Officers was offensive. As such, Members resolved that Mr Nasim's conduct during this incident was offensive, inappropriate and fell well below the standards they expected of a driver licensed by Torbay Council.

Members noted that Torbay Council's (Taxi) & Private Hire Policy, at Appendix G, page 55 states that the vehicle allocation for the GPO roundabout location, in Torquay is for up to 3 vehicles. At the time of the incident, oral evidence showed that there were more than 3 vehicles at this location. Members noted that Mr Nasim had received and signed for his copy of this Policy.

In accordance with Torbay Council's Byelaw, with respect to Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicles, Members noted that in accordance with point 8(b) on page 4, Mr Nasim should have proceeded to another stand which he failed to do so. By moving his vehicle off the rank in to the location he did, Mr Nasim no longer assumed or complied with the correct position offered to Hackney Carriage Drivers and their vehicles. As such, Members resolved that Mr Nasim had acted in breach of Torbay Council's Hackney Carriage (Taxi) & Private Hire Policy, point

8(b) of Torbay Council's Byelaw with respect to Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicles and road traffic order.

Members further noted the appendices of the report before them which evidenced that Mr Nasim had previously received written warnings, one of which was after he had appeared before a Licensing Sub-Committee that resulted in a 7 day suspension of his Hackney Carriage Driver Licence, for parking in contravention of road traffic orders and in breach of Torbay Council's Byelaw with respect to Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicles. Given that Mr Nasim appears today before Members of the same Committee, for the same offence and it is that which has led to the allegation of inappropriate conduct towards the Civil Enforcement Officers, Members resolved that they could no longer be satisfied that the continuation of these contraventions by Mr Nasim that he remained a fit and proper person to hold such a licence.

In considering revocation of Mr Nasim's Hackney Carriage Driver's Licence, Members resolved that on this occasion a longer period of suspension would act as a deterrent to Mr Nasim and hopefully serve as an assurance by him that future conduct will be maintained at a standard expected of a driver licensed by Torbay Council.

In suspending Mr Nasim's Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence with immediate effect, as in accordance with Section 61(2B) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, Members resolved that it appeared to them in the interest of public safety to do so, as Mr Nasim's continued disregard for road traffic orders, despite previous written warnings and a suspension, placed other road users and pedestrians at a real risk of injury or even death.

In concluding, Members of the Licensing Sub-Committee recommend that Mr Nasim undertake during his period of suspension an Anger Management Course, familiarise himself with the Road Traffic Orders in Torbay, read again Torbay Council's Hackney & Private Hire Policy, as received and signed for by him, obtain and read a copy of Torbay Council's Byelaw with respect to Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicles and obtain and read a copy of Torbay Council's Parking Enforcement Policy.

1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application, in respect of the Premises detailed above, for a new Club Premises Certificate.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities in the Economic Plan.
- 1.3 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Crime and Disorder" and "The Prevention of Public Nuisance".
- 1.4 The matter must be considered on its merits having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written representation if all parties have agreed that a hearing is not necessary. A decision must be made, having considered the representations, either:-
 - (a) to grant the licence subject to
 - (i) such conditions as are consistent with the submitted operating Schedule modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (ii) any condition which must under Section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence:

(Such conditions may differ in respect of different parts of the premises and/or different activities).

- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
- (d) to reject the application.
- 1.5 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices

required to be served on the Interested Parties and Responsible Authorities at the determination of the matter.

2. Introduction

2.1 An application has been made under Section 71 of the Act for a Club Premises Certificate to permit licensable activities at the premises detailed above. Details of the relevant pages of the application are shown in Appendix 1.

To provide Live Music and Recorded Music indoors from 1100 until 0100 Monday to Saturday and from 1100 until 2330 on Sunday.

The Provision of Facilities for Dancing indoors from 1100 until 0100 Monday to Saturday and from 1100 until 2330 on Sunday.

To supply alcohol on and off the premises from 1100 to 0100 Monday to Saturday and from 1100 until 2330 on Sunday.

To be open to the members and guests from 1100 to 0130 Monday to Saturday and from 1100 until midnight on Sunday.

A copy of the plan is shown as Appendix 2.

A copy of the club rules that apply to this application will be made available in the Governance Support room, in the Town Hall, in Torquay.

2.2 The Council as Licensing Authority, is satisfied that the applicant has met the administrative requirements of Section 71(6) but is unable to issue the Certificate as relevant Representations have been received from Interested Parties and a Responsible Authority. The Authority is also satisfied that such representations have been received within the appropriate time scale, have not been subsequently withdrawn and are not vexatious or frivolous.

We have received a Representation from the Police in relation to the Licensing Objective "The Prevention of Crime and Disorder". This is shown in Appendix 3.

We have received four Representations from Interested Parties in relation to the Licensing Objective "Prevention of Public Nuisance". These are shown in Appendix 4.

There have been no other Representations from the other Responsible Authorities or any other Interested Party.

- 2.3 The Authority is required to conduct a hearing by the provisions of Section 72(3) unless all parties agree that this is not necessary.
- 2.4 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the representations and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.5 If the application is refused, in whole or in part, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and by Part 2, 10 of Schedule 5, to the applicant.

- 2.6 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Part 2, 11 of Schedule 5 to :-
 - (a) The holder of the licence against any decision
 - (i) to impose conditions on the licence, or
 - (ii) to take any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify a person as premises supervisor.
 - (b) Any person who made a relevant representations who desires to contend
 - (i) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (ii) that, on granting the licence, the licensing authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or taken any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify person as premises supervisor.
- 2.7 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' Court may:-
 - (a) dismiss the appeal,
 - (b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the licensing authority, or
 - (c) remit the case to the licensing authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the court,

and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.



Torre Conservative Club, Lansdowne Lane, Torquay Licensing Act 2003

I am with my sister, a Mrs . , joint owner of the freehold of Numbers and Vansittart Road, Torquay.

No is divided into two flats; both are tenanted, the upper flat by a couple who I understand work in the hotel trade and the ground floor by a very elderly lady. Number is also tenanted by a couple and the lady is disabled.

I am writing for myself and my sister and have concern as well for our tenants, having seen notice of the application by the Torre Conservative Club for live and recorded music from 11.00 a.m. to 1.00 a.m. weekdays and to 11.30 pm on Sundays.

The Conservative Club backs on to No. Vansittart Road. No is within 12 metres.

We wish to object in the strongest terms to this application on the following grounds:-

- 1. The properties we own are bound to be affected by noise which will emanate from the premises whatever sound-proofing might be installed within them (people tend to leave windows open, especially during the summer). To expect any tenants to put up with this nuisance daily (or rather nightly) until 1.00 a.m. in the morning is completely unreasonable, indeed it is an outrageous interference with the rights of residents to peace and quiet at hours when most people are in bed.
- 2. The location of the Conservative Club is adjoining what is basically a residential area. South Street comprises terraced residential properties on both sides. Vansittart Road is also basically residential. Some properties are divided into flats and others are single private dwellings. To grant this application would not only cause serious nuisance to our tenants but to a great many other people in the surrounding residential area.

- 3. We appreciate that the Conservative Club is just that a "club" so presumably only Club members are admitted. However we have no doubt that the object of the Club if the application is approved is to increase membership and these extra members will be those who enjoy live music. The result of this will be extra traffic with nowhere to park. South Street has parking only on one side and while Vansittart Road has on-street parking both sides, many of the properties do not have off-street parking with the result that most, if not all, available space is taken up by the residents.
- 4. If the Club is to remain open until 1.00 a.m. then with the best will in the world and all efforts by the owners, there will be noise at turning out time. While one would hope that Club members would not display the drunkenness and anti-social habits which prevail in other parts of Torquay there would be little if anything the Club proprietors could do to stop it once these people are off the premises.

Vansittart Road is a rare example in the centre of the town of a pleasant tree lined quiet place to reside. Why should this be put at risk by a totally unsuitable (for the area) commercial activity which will impact on the value of neighbouring property and the lives of those living there?

The application should be rejected.




