Decision

That the application for a Premises Licence in respect of Coco, King Street, Brixham, be approved as applied for, subject to the following amendments and additional conditions:

That recorded music shall be permitted inside the premises only,

That recorded music shall be permitted until midnight on Sunday,

That the supply of alcohol shall be permitted until midnight on Sunday,

After 10pm, the designated smoking area shall permit no more than 8 patrons at any one time,

After 10pm, the designated smoking area shall be monitored at all times by either an SIA door steward or a member of staff to ensure that patrons using the area do not cause a nuisance to nearby residents,

A Noise Limiter shall be installed and used at the premises, with set levels agreed by Torbay Council's Public Protection Officer,

Recorded music shall be permitted from 9am to midnight 7 days a week,

Late night refreshment shall be permitted from 11pm to midnight 7 days a week;

Supply of alcohol shall be permitted from 10am to midnight 7 days a week; and

The premises shall be open to the public from 9am to 12.30am 7 days a week.

Reasons for Decision

Having carefully considered all the oral and written representations, Members resolved to grant the application having been satisfied that the amended and

additional conditions would seek to ensure that the Licensing Objectives would be promoted.

In coming to their decision, Members gave careful consideration to the application and the concerns raised by members of the public, who represented a number of mixed use premises within the locality to which the premises is situated. Members particularly noted that members of the public attending the hearing welcomed the Applicant and his operation to Brixham, despite their concerns that the location of the premises did not lend itself to such a late night licence given its amphitheatre surroundings and the detrimental impact patrons leaving the premises would have on nearby residents after midnight.

Members also had regard to the Applicant's Legal Representative submissions which were supported by Torbay Council's Public Protection Officer, in that the Applicant had a proven track record as a responsible Premises Licence Holder and having held a number of premises licence in residential areas, only one of which resulted in a complaint about noise from patrons which the Applicant had worked with the Torbay Council to resolve.

Whilst there were concerns about noise emanating from the Premises, Members were reassured by the measures taken by the Applicant to address this.

In narrowing the outstanding issue of concern which related to patrons leaving the premises at the end of the operational hours, Members resolved that a midnight licence was appropriate, having fully deliberated what if any conditions could be imposed to mitigate the potential noise outbreak from patrons leaving the premises given its location. In coming to this determination, Members had regard to Section 4, paragraphs 4.3 and 4.4 of its Licensing Statement of Principles 2016-2021.

Reason for Decision:

Having carefully considered all of the written and oral representations Members resolved to grant the Licence as applied for, having been reassured by the Applicant's detailed and thorough oral representation which detailed inter alia his previous experience, the high standards he expects from his employees and his zero tolerance towards anti-social behaviour.

In coming to their decision, Members noted the concerns raised by the Member of the Public on behalf of two organisations she was representing. Whilst Members were sympathetic to the issues raised, they were however mindful that the written and oral representations were largely based upon assumptions rather than being evidence based.

Members further noted that there were no representations in respect of this application from any Responsible Authority.

Decision:

That the application for a Variation to a Premises Licence in respect of the Bolton Hotel, New Road, Brixham be approved as applied for subject to the following conditions:

- i) the premises shall have and adhere to a Noise Management Plan. This Plan shall be agreed by Torbay Council's Public Protection Team and shall have particular regard to regulated entertainment, dispersal of patrons and designated smoking areas; and
- ii) all staff involved in the sale of alcohol after midnight shall hold a BIIAB Level 1 Award in responsible alcohol retailing, within 4 months of commencing employment. Existing staff involved in the sale of alcohol after midnight must also hold such an Award within 4 months from the date of this decision. Namely by the 18th September 2017.

Reason for Decision:

Having carefully consider the written and oral representations Members resolved to grant the application as applied for subject to the additional conditions, having been satisfied that such conditions would alleviate the concerns of the Responsible Authorities and uphold the Licensing Objectives.

In particular, Members were reassured by the representation made by the Public Protection Officer that the Applicant had worked with him to formulate extensive and enforceable conditions in order to uphold the Licensing Objective 'The Prevention of Public Nuisance'. Whilst the Police Representatives also made

reference to the improvements in the management of the premises, they opposed the granting of the application, however Members were satisfied that the conditions imposed would alleviate their concerns.

Members determination to impose the condition regarding the BIIAB Level 1 Award was following consideration of Torbay Council's Licensing Statement of Principles, the concerns of the Police Representatives and being of the view that a reputable well run premises should seek to invest in their staff and provide reassurance to Members that the premises will be well run whilst upholding the Licensing Objectives.

Members determination to impose the condition regarding the Noise Management Plan was following consideration of the Licensing Objectives, the fact that there are residential properties in close proximity to the Premises and the concerns raised by the Responsible Authorities.

Members considered imposing a condition to supervise and limit the number of patrons using the designated smoking areas, however noted that the Licensing Authority had not received any complaints regarding the designated areas and in the absence of representations from residents in the area, Members deemed a specific condition to be unnecessary and that the Noise Management Plan should have regard to these designated areas to ensure that the Variation granted would not result in new complaints.

In concluding, Members noted that should an issue arise as a result of the granting this application then a review of the licence can be sought.

1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application, in respect of the Premise detailed above, for a Variation to a Premises Licence. The Premise is located within the Cumulative Impact Area.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives "The Prevention of Public Nuisance".
- 1.4 The matter must be considered on its own merits having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written Representations if all parties have agreed that a hearing is not necessary. Having regard to the Representations and issues arising, a decision must be made to take such steps as are necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. These are either:-
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence, or
 - (b) reject the application in whole or in part.

For this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

1.5 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Interested Parties and Responsible Authorities at the determination of the matter.

2. Introduction

2.1 An application has been made under Section 34 of the Act for a Variation to a Premises Licence. Details of the application are shown in Appendix 1. Only the relevant pages of the application are shown.

A brief description of the proposed Variation is as follows:-

To increase the hours for recorded music indoors by 4 hours to enable music to start at 10.00 rather than 14.00. The timings will therefore be 10.00 until 1.00 Monday to Thursday and 10.00 until 2.00 Friday to Sunday.

To increase the hours for the provision of anything of a similar description to Live Music, Recorded Music or Performance of Dance indoors by 4 hours to enable the activity to start at 10.00 rather than 14.00. The timings will therefore be 10.00 until 1.00 Monday to Thursday and 10.00 until 2.00 Friday to Sunday.

To increase the hours for the Sale of Alcohol indoors by 4 hours to enable Alcohol to be sold at 10.00 rather than 14.00. The timings will therefore be 10.00 until 1.00 Monday to Thursday and 10.00 until 2.00 Friday to Sunday.

To add Late Night Refreshment to the licence indoors from 23.00 until 1.00 Monday to Thursday and from 23.00 until 2.00 Friday to Sunday.

To remove 13 conditions from the licence and replace them with 5 updated conditions.

- 2.2 A copy of the current premises licence showing the licensable activities, timings, conditions and the plan of the premise is shown at Appendix 2 of this report.
- 2.3 Torbay Council as the Licensing Authority is satisfied that the Applicant has met the administrative requirements of Section 35(1) but is unable to issue the variation to the Premises Licence, as a relevant Representation has been received from an Interested Party. The Licensing Authority is also satisfied that the Representation was received within the appropriate time-scale, has not been subsequently withdrawn and is not vexatious or frivolous.

We have received Representations from a Member of the Public in relation to the Licensing Objective "The Prevention of Public Nuisance". This is shown as Appendix 3.

There have been no Representations received from any Responsible Authority or any other Interested Party.

- 2.4 The Authority is required to conduct a hearing by the provisions of Section 35(3) unless all parties agree that this is not necessary.
- 2.5 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representations and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

- 2.6 If the application is refused, in whole or in part, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 1 of Schedule 5, to the Applicant.
- 2.7 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 4(2) of Schedule 5 to :-
 - (a) The applicant for the variation of the licence against any decision to modify the conditions
 - (b) Any person who made a relevant representation in relation to the application who desires to contend
 - (i) that any variation made ought not to have been made, or
 - (ii) that, when varying the licence, the Licensing Authority ought to have modified the conditions of the licence or ought to have modified them in a different way.
- 2.8 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' Court may:-
 - (a) dismiss the appeal,
 - (b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or
 - (c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court,

and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

ANNEXE 1

MANDATORY CONDITION: WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- 1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3) (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:

 (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a
 group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing
 objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5) (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6) The responsible person must ensure that:-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:-

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (DxV)

Where:-

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence:-
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

MANDATORY CONDITION: DOOR SUPERVISION

- Where one or more individuals are carrying out security activities, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 2) But nothing in the aforementioned conditions requires such a condition to be imposed in respect of a) and b) and (b)(i) and (b)(ii)
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), are exempt.


