Green Waste - Paignton

Composted and then used instead of a chemical fertiliser in agriculture.



Aluminium Cans

- Warrington, Cheshire

Melted down and used to make new cans.



Paper - Kings Lynn, Norfolk

Recycled into paper for newspapers and for energy production.



Cooking Oil - Newton Abbot

Refined and processed into biodiesel fuels.



Glass - Kirby-in-Ashfield, Nottinghamshire

Recycled into glass bottles and jars.



Food Waste - Holsworthy, Devon

Anaerobic digestion, producing biogas used to generate power, provide heat and produce compost.



Wood - Winkleigh, Devon

Shredded and reprocessed for use in board manufacturing and animal bedding.



Tyres - Castle Cary, Somerset

Shredded, granulated and remade into soft surfaces for play and horse training areas.



Batteries - Lutterworth, Leicestershire

Broken down and toxic heavy metal recovered for reprocessing.



Cardboard & Tetra Pak - Caerphilly, Wales

Recycled into new cardboard packaging.



Plastic - Manchester

Recycled into new plastic food packaging.



Metal - Wokingham, Berkshire

Broken down into component parts and metals and plastics re-used.
