24/05/09 - Large scale fight at the premises, resulting in serious head injuries to a male and involved numerous drunken persons, who were clearly seen on CCTV footage outside the premises drinking from bottles and glasses during the fracas. The offender was convicted at Exeter Crown Court in February 2010 and was sentenced to 5 years imprisonment.

Following this incident, the Police Superintendent instructed close monitoring of these premises by way of a Problem Solving Plan (FT/09/4170). Local residents were spoken to by the Neighbourhood Beat Officer, but no one was willing to assist due to fear of reprisals.

03/09/09 - Police called to a very drunk male lying in Belgrave Road near to the premises. The male had to be taken to Torbay Hospital and it was confirmed that he had been drinking within The Tor Abbey.

Following this incident, the premises were made subject of further close monitoring by way of an Op Grennall Log (149 04/09/09).

15/10/09 - Officers attended the premises following a hoax '999' call. Whilst at the premises they noticed two males sitting at the bar, who appeared drunk. These males were seen approximately an hour later leaving the premises, they were spoken to by the same officers. They denied having been in the Tor Abbey, but were clearly heavily under the influence of alcohol.

28/11/09 - Following a serious assault on a male who had been drinking at the premises, intel was received indicating the use of cocaine on the premises by customers and the DPS.

16/01/10 - Local residents reported a fight in Belgrave Road, Torquay, near to the premises at 0040 hours. Police enquiries did not reveal any evidence of any licensing breaches and it could not be established if the fight was related to The Tor Abbey.

03/06/10 - Complaints from local residents about the conduct of the premises, in particular noise and persons drinking on the street. DPS advised and matter passed to Torbay Council Environmental Health Department.

01/01/11 - Serious outbreak of disorder within the premises, involving the DPS and staff, during which the DPS is seriously assaulted by three males. Police called and numerous concerns raised, including drunkenness, unauthorised licensable activities taking place and smoking within the premises. Enquiries into this matter are still ongoing and the offenders have not been located.

20/02/11 - Report of a disturbance in Belgrave Road near to the Tor Abbey Inn. Officers attended and two groups of very intoxicated females were involved in a confrontation. The landlord of the premises was spoken to by police officers and stated that the persons involved had not come from his premises. Local residents were spoken to by the Police Licensing Officers and they stated that those involved had come from within the premises, which was later confirmed by the DPS.

07/03/11 - Police called to the premises at 2342 hours following a report of a disturbance. On arrival a male was located covered in blood from an injury sustained within. Injured person refused to pursue the matter and some minor damage to an internal window was dealt with by way of civil redress at the request of the DPS.

For information, local residents have, for some time, been complaining about the conduct of the Tor Abbey Inn, but in all cases these residents have been reluctant to assist the police or council in a positive manner. The local Neighbourhood Beat Officer has engaged with them and obtained at least one community impact heresay witness statement outlining their concerns.
