ANNEXE 1

MANDATORY CONDITION: WHERE LICENCE AUTHORISES SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

VANNEXES (1886)

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-1)
 - at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (a)
 - at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal (b) licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal 2) licence
- (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, 31 arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring; (ii)
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably 5) available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies 6) to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 7). The responsible person shall ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (ii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

MANDATORY CONDITION: EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 1) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- 2) Where -
 - (a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - (b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this condition applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

In the case of the aforementioned conditions

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

ANNEXE 2

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

General

CCTV must be installed on the premises to include a recording monitor behind the bar servery. Such CCTV system
must be maintained and used throughout licensing hours. Recordings must be kept for a minimum of 31 days during
which time they shall be available to a police officer at any reasonable time.

Public Safety

- The maximum permitted capacity for the lower ground floor area shall be 60 persons.
- 2. Adequate emergency and fire exit lighting must be installed to British Standard Specifications.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- The solid construction of the premises and the fact that music and dancing shall be provided in the lower ground floor shall minimise levels of disturbance to passers by and local residents.
- The volume of amplified sound used in connection with the entertainment provided shall at all times be under the control of the management.

The Protection of Children From Harm

- A Challenge 21 policy shall be in force whereby any customer who does not look over 21 is asked for proof of age. 1.
- 2. All staff shall be trained in this policy (including acceptable forms of proof of age).

ANNEXE 3

CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Facilities for dancing, when provided in the lower ground floor area, shall be for the benefit of diners and persons 1. attending pre-booked functions, with or without meals, at the premises.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- Noise from the premises shall not be audible within any dwelling with windows open for normal ventilation especially 1. after 11pm. This shall be assessed from the boundary to the nearest residential properties, on all sides of the licensed premises. The criteria that shall be applied are;
 - Before 11pm Noise emanating from the premises shall not be clearly distinguishable above other noise.
 - (i) (ii) After 11pm - Noise emanating from the premises shall not be distinguishable above background levels of noise.
 - The local authority shall reserve the right in cases of tonal noise and where premises are attached to others, (iii) to make further assessments from within the residential property.
- 2. Doors and windows shall be kept shut during entertainment to reduce noise break out. A management scheme shall be in place to ensure this situation remains.
