**The Dressed Crab, Torquay Harbour (next to slip way), Vaughan Parade, Torquay**

I refer to the above premise and an application for the Grant of a Premises Licence, submitted by the applicant, Mr Daniel Bennett.

This premise is situated within the Torbay Council Cumulative Impact Area, which has been identified as an area subject to high levels of alcohol related crime, disorder, anti-social behaviour and public nuisance.

I would take this opportunity to remind you that your Special Saturation Policy states that where relevant representations have been made, an application for a new Premises Licence, or the variation of an existing Premises Licence, would normally be refused, where it is anticipated that the application will add to the problems of crime and disorder or/and public nuisance in the area, unless the Applicant can demonstrate within their Operating Schedule, that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the Licensing Objectives.

I would also remind you that your Licensing Statement of Principles 2011 strongly recommends that applicants consult with Responsible Authorities to consider the matters set out in your policy and incorporate them in the Operating Schedule to reduce the risk of representations. Unfortunately the police were not consulted prior to the submission of this application. Despite this we are not objecting to the grant of this application but request that the below conditions are imposed on the licence:

1. The consumption of alcohol shall be restricted to persons who are seated.

2. No alcohol shall be sold in glass bottles from which it is intended or likely that a person shall drink.
3. All drinks shall be served in toughened, strengthened, polycarbonate or plastic glasses.
4. The top half of the kiosk door shall be secured in the open position at all times that alcohol is sold from the premise to ensure adequate supervision of customers in the seating area.

The police consider that including the above conditions on the premises licence will ensure that staff at the premises can satisfactorily supervise customers and reduce the likelihood of incidents involving glassware, which will assist in ensuring the licensing objectives are met.

Furthermore, my Licensing Officer, Mrs Julie Smart, has corresponded with the applicant, Mr Bennett, who has confirmed that he will agree to adhere to the above conditions, a copy of the email is attached for your information. Therefore, in accordance with Section 9.2 of the Revised Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (March 2015) the police do not consider that a hearing is necessary in relation to this application, unless contested representations are received from other responsible authorities.
