Beach Huts

- Consultation undertaken with: -
- The beach hut user group 'BHUGS'
- Some Community Partnerships have been consulted on the increases at their public meetings
- Wider Public "Budget Consultation" events and questionnaire
- Also subject to a Full Council Report which was presented on 8th December 2011.



- be rising. BHUGs - concerned but understood prices would
- Original proposal 23% rise could be charged
- Following consultation reviewed to an average increase of 12% (18% in areas of high demand)



Impact Assessment Overview

- Positive impacts:
- Older & younger people still have access to the beach huts and may get greater choice of site as a result of the price changes
- Free use of beach huts offered for a number of care groups Option for people with caring responsibilities to share beach huts for those that are unable to afford sole use.
- Beach huts that are currently accessible for people with a disability will not be affected
- an average increase of 12% (a maximum of 18% in high demand adjustment to the increase in charges has been made from 23% to Outcome = Adjustments have been made to remove barriers areas)





Parking Services

- Consultation undertaken with: -
- Extensive consultation prior to formal advertising process.
- General open public meetings being held on 5th Sept & 18th Oct 2011.
- Public meetings held by all Community Partnerships in areas where additional meters were proposed.
- Invitation for written objections.
- Two meetings held with local trader group made up of structures businesses from Torquay and Paignton on charging



- Out of the 11 meetings held -
- 38 individual responses written in advance of the meetings
- 2 petitions submitted
- 8 verbal representations were made at the public meetings
- Following the formal Traffic Regulation Order being were received advertised a further 38 group and individual objections
- and off street parking areas No objections received on the parking structure charging proposals following the advertising of this at all on-street
- Public "Budget Consultation" events have also been held



Impact Assessment Overview

Positive Impacts:

- Secondary shopping areas were removed from the onstreet pay and display scheme to ensure that in the businesses current economic climate traders could sustain their
- Amendments have been made to lengths of stays in some areas
- Free days have been introduced (i.e. Sundays) where there were significant church users expected
- Outcome = Adjustments have been made to has taken place remove barriers – since the consultation activity





Ibraries

- Consultation undertaken with: -
- Presenting to user groups and Friend of Library Groups.
- By questionnaire, on line and distributed through the library service points
- Two letters of objection from Friends of Library Groups have been received
- Approx. 2500 questionnaires received by individuals Libraries on the proposed reduction in service for the
- Awaiting full comprehensive results by 20th January.



Consultation Results

Preliminary Findings –

- Responses from Questionnaires Initial 2011). feedback based on 400 respondees December
- Most popular visiting time Mornings 9.30 to 13.00 - Highest % = Monday and Tuesday.
- Least popular visiting time Evenings 17.00 to 19.00 - Least % = Tuesday and Saturday.
- Least popular times in the day 9am 10am and 5pm - /pm.



Impact Assessment Overview

- Final reduction of hours proposed will need to be determined through full consultation results
- Full consideration will be given to vulnerable groups with the least impact achievable.
- Outcome 2: Adjustments to remove barriers = forward. groups depending on the specific proposals put There is potential for negative impact on vulnerable
