1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application for a new Premises Licence, in respect of the Premise detailed above.
- 1.2 The application relates to all the Corporate Priorities within the Community Plan.
- 1.3 The matters raised relate to the Licensing Objectives the "Prevention of Public Nuisance" and "Prevention of Crime and Disorder".
- 1.4 The matter must be considered on its merits, having received details of the issues arising either at a hearing or by written Representation. A decision must be made, having considered the Representations, either:-
 - (a) to grant the licence subject to
 - (i) such conditions as are consistent with the submitted operating Schedule modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (ii) any condition which must under Section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence;

(Such conditions may differ in respect of different parts of the Premises and/or different activities).

- (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the Premises Supervisor;
- (d) to reject the application.

1.5 Reasons for the decision must be given for inclusion in the appropriate Notices required to be served on the Applicant, Responsible Authorities and all Interested Parties, following the determination of the matter.

2. Application

2.1 An application has been made under Section 17 of the Act for a Premises Licence to permit licensable activities at the Premise detailed above. Details of the relevant pages of the application are shown in Appendix 1.

A brief description of the application, as follows:-

Provision of Films Indoors from 17:00 to 24:00 Monday to Saturday and from 17:00 to 23:00 on Sunday

Provision of Live Music Indoors from 17:00 to 24:00 Monday to Saturday and from 17:00 to 23:00 on Sunday

Provision of Recorded Music Indoors from 08:00 to 11:00 and then from 16:00 to 24:00 Monday to Saturday and from 17:00 to 23:00 on Sunday.

Provision of anything of a similar description to live music, recorded music or performance of dance Indoors from 08:00 to 11:00 then again from 16:00 to 24:00 Monday to Saturday and from 17:00 to 23:00 on Sunday.

The Supply of Alcohol for consumption on the premises from 17:00 to 24:00 Monday to Saturday and from 17:00 to 23:00 on Sunday.

Late Night Refreshment Indoors from 23:00 until 00:00 Monday to Saturday.

Premises opening hours from 08:00 to 11:00 then again from 16:00 to 24:00 Monday to Saturday and from 16:00 to 23:00 on Sunday.

The Applicant has given the following description of the premises: -

"Small Ground Floor Restaurant, serving food and drinks as a table service, with seating at tables for between 25 to 40 persons, situated in a row of shops, takeaways, a public house and other restaurants".

The plan accompanying the application is shown as Appendix 2.

2.2 The Council as the Licensing Authority is satisfied that the Applicant has met the administrative requirements of Section 17(5) but is unable to issue the Licence, as relevant Representations have been received. The Licensing Authority is also satisfied that the Representations have been received within the appropriate time scale and have not been subsequently withdrawn.

We have received 2 Representations from Interested Parties outlining their objections in relation to "The Prevention of Public Nuisance". These are shown as Appendix 3 and Appendix 4.

There have been no Representations received from any Responsible Authority or any other Interested Party, other than those mentioned above.

- 2.3 The Authority is required to conduct a hearing under the provisions of Section 18(3) unless all parties agree that this is not necessary.
- 2.4 Appropriate Notices have been issued to all parties, as required by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearing Regulations) 2005, including, where appropriate, details of the Representation and the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 2.5 If the application is refused, in whole or in part, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 1 of Schedule 5, to the Applicant.
- 2.6 If the application is granted, a Right of Appeal to the Magistrates' Court is granted by Section 181 of the Act and, by Paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 5 to :-
 - (a) The holder of the licence against any decision
 - (i) to impose conditions on the licence, or
 - (ii) to take any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify a person as Premises Supervisor.
 - (b) Any person who made a relevant Representation who desires to contend
 - (i) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (ii) that, on granting the licence, the Licensing Authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or taken any step to exclude a licensable activity or refuse to specify person as Premises Supervisor.
- 2.7 Following such Appeal, the Magistrates' Court may:-
 - (a) dismiss the appeal,
 - (b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or
 - (c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the Court,
 - and may make such order as to costs as it thinks fit.

 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.





I am writing to strongly object to the license being issued to the above-named property for the following reasons:

- It has no planning permission for the work carried out from a beauty salon to this restaurant anyway. THIS IS A RESDENTIAL, FAMILY NEIGHBOURHOOD WE DON'T NEED ANOTHER TAKEAWAY.
- 2) There was no planning application in place for residents and shop owners to contest for the Restaurant/Takeaway to be located at 171, which has already has 2 takeaways (one either side) which means if this were to go ahead there will be 5 in a row.

THIS IS A RESDENTIAL FAMILY NEIGHBOURHOOD WE SHOULD HAVE BEEN CONSIDERED AND INFORMED.

3) This is a residential area. It is now becoming "a free for all", with too many takeaways and restaurants. The area is already saturated with food outlets.

THIS IS A RESDENTIAL FAMILY NEIGHBOURHOOD.

4) The traffic and parking. It has become very noisy with significant traffic increased. The traffic is extremely noisy (we cannot have out windows open during the summer months as we can't even hear our TV. Delivery drivers for the food outlet come and go constantly increasing the distruption and noise.

Regarding the increase in traffic and delivery drivers – this has resulted in the parking spaces being limited and it has become a "nightmare" to get parked, often resulting in absolutely no parking spaces for the residents outside their properties, opposite, or even to the adjoining Haytor Road.
