1. Key points and Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to update SACRE members on the findings published in recent Ofsted reports, particularly where comments relate to Religious Education (RE), collective worship or Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development (SMSC) of pupils. Where appropriate, the report may recommend that SACRE officers should contact specified schools to either congratulate them on their outstanding practice, or to offer curriculum support in specified areas.
- 1.2 Only one primary school and no secondary schools have been inspected since our last meeting.
- 1.3 The report for Hayes Primary school says that pupils do not 'have a sound understanding of different faiths and cultures'. As a result the school was contacted and training given. The school has been very expressive of their thanks to Torbay SACRE for the support given as a result.

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Title: RE syllabus primary survey: analysis

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1. Although the survey has been sent out to hundreds of teachers and schools, there have only been 24 responses, which is disappointing.

Key points and Summary

- 1.1 Most primary RE is taught through discrete lessons and by the class teacher. However, some schools (26%) also report RE being taught by HLTAs on occasions.
- 1.2 Most schools allocate at least an hour to RE in primary schools.
- 1.3 Over 3/4 of schools have fully implemented the new syllabus, with about half say they are confident about the new approaches, and the other half saying they are confident in certain aspects.
- 1.4 More than half the respondents say the new syllabus has helped them to better present ideas about Humanism, while about 50% say they have been enabled to teach better about issues relating to the environment or racism/anti-racism.
- 1.5 A majority also say that the new syllabus helps them to teach about diversity, lived experience, Ways of Knowing and personal worldviews.
- 1.6 87% say they are confident in their understanding of what is meant by a Religion and Worldviews approach to RE.
