Lead	Topic	Details
Phil Lord (adviser to 4 SACREs and Chair of NAPfRE, Wales)	What is <i>Cynefin</i> and how might it be understood in an English context?	Phil will discuss the concept of <i>cynefin</i> , which means 'belonging place' or 'habitat'. It is a central feature within the new Curriculum for Wales, used to build identity, heritage and community connection. What could it look like in an English setting?
Justine Ball (Adviser to Hampshire and Oxford SACREs)	RE in the NC? What are the implications for SACREs?	Justine will explore the way SACREs could change, in the light of RE joining the National Curriculum. What are the strengths of SACREs that we would want to build on?
Jane Yates (Adviser to Cumbria SACRE)	SACREs and local govt reorganisation	Jane will talk through her experience of LA reorganisation and explore the implications for SACREs. This may well have contrasting outcomes in different areas across the country.
