Full co-operation shall be given to any emergency service and criminal enquiry

Excellent working relationships shall continue with the current licensing authorities offering safe and enjoyable drinking and dining establishments

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

A policy shall be adopted not to excessively discount drinks.

Undesirable customers shall be excluded.

Individuals who appear intoxicated shall not be served.

The number of guests shall be monitored to prevent overcrowding.

Non alcoholic beer and snacks shall be available

Staff shall be trained to remain calm and composed in difficult situations.

Photographic ID must be produced when an individual is suspected of being under the age of 18.

Regular bottle and glass collections shall be undertaken throughout the premises.

Patrons shall not be permitted to leave the premises with any glass belonging to the premises

c) Public safety

All exit doors shall be easily openable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means and shall be available for egress while the public are on the premises.

Adequate access shall be provided for emergency vehicles.

Cold drinking water shall be available at the bar.

First Aid facilities and equipment suitable for the number of patrons and the type of event undertaken shall be provided.

This shall enable first aid treatment to be given promptly in the event of injury to patrons or staff.

All doors and fastenings shall be kept in good working order.

Gangways, exit routes and steps shall be maintained in good order with non-slippery and even surfaces.

Escape exits shall be unobstructed and clearly identifiable.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Children below 14 shall be excluded from the premises in the interest of protecting children from harm.

Children aged 14 - 15 must be accompanied by a responsible person of eighteen years or older.

A sign shall be positioned near the entrance to the premises indicating that no person under the age of 14 will be allowed on the premises and that children aged 14 - 15 must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

Photographic ID must be produced when an individual is suspected of being under the age of 18.

Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises such as to cause persons in the neighbourhood to be unreasonably disturbed. In general terms, noise from the premises should not be audible within any noise sensitive premises (e.g dwelling) with windows open for normal ventilation especially after 23.00 hrs. This shall be assessed from the boundary to the nearest residential properties, on all sides of the licensed premises. The criteria that shall be applied are:- (i) After 23.00 hrs - Noise emanating from the premises shall not be distinguishable above background levels of noise. (ii) The local authority shall reserve the right in cases of tonal noise and where premises are attached to others (i.e. semi's and terraced properties), to make further assessments from within the residential property. To reduce noise breakout, doors and windows facing onto any noise sensitive premises (e.g dwelling) shall be kept shut during entertainment. A management scheme shall be in place to ensure this situation remains. The placing of refuse, such as bottles, into receptacles outside the premises shall take place at times that will prevent disturbance to nearby properties. The handling of beer kegs, bottles and other similar items shall not take place in the late evening, at night and during the early morning, when the noise generated could cause a nuisance particularly outside buildings. Cooking, noxious or persistent smells from the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties and the premises must be properly vented.
