



 - Protecting and supporting vulnerable adults












The challenge continues

Demand for children's and adult social care is increasing



Government funding is reducing:



£25,700,000 in 2015/2016 £6,420,000 in 2019/2020

...and will reduce further



Therefore, Torbay Council has influence over a gross budget of £193 million





How is it shared across our targeted actions?







Our principles

- Use reducing resources to best effect
- Reduce demand through prevention and innovation
- Integrated and joined up approach







Context

- £17 million pounds worth of savings and new income needed by 2021/2022
- On top of the £76 million already made over the last seven years to achieve a balanced budget
- £7.5 million of those budget reductions will be made in 2019/2020
 - ➤ Changes in funding assumptions £1.2 million
 - ➤ Transformation Portfolio £1.4 million
 - ➤ Decisions already made and known changes £1.9 million
 - Proposal for efficiencies, service change and income generation – £3.1 million

Known changes and previous decisions

Targeted Action 1: Protecting children and giving them the best start in life

- 20% increase in numbers of Children Looked After
- Continuing support for Children's Services (Additional investment of £3.0m)
- Redesign of Business Support (Saving of £150k)
- Reviewing procurement and contract management processes (Saving of £550k)







Targeted Action 2: Working towards a more prosperous Torbay



- Includes Parking Services,
 Regeneration, Asset Management,
 Planning and Harbours
- Strong incentive to plan for and achieve economic growth
- Cessation of revenue regeneration funding (Saving of £59k)
- Reduction in planned/reactive maintenance (Saving of £150k)
- Investment and Regeneration Portfolio (Increased income of £625k)





Targeted Action 3: Promoting healthy lifestyles across Torbay

- Reduction in Public Health grant from Government
- Contract reductions for Adult Substance Misuse Service (Saving of £100k)







Targeted Action 4: Ensuring Torbay remains an attractive and safe place to live and visit



- Reduction in Events budget (Saving of £164k)
- Reduction in highways maintenance, street lighting and playground maintenance (Savings of £320k, £25k and £7k respectively)
- Seek external support for illuminations and UNESCO Geopark (Additional income of £30k and £10k respectively)
- Reduction in Natural Environment budget and Coast and Countryside Trust fee (Savings of £125k and £45k respectively)
- New beach huts (Additional income of £20k)
- Charging for some Environmental Health services (Additional income of £25k)





Targeted Action 5: Protecting and supporting vulnerable adults

- Part of a pooled arrangement with the NHS
- £400m overall for acute hospital, community health and adults social care services
 - to achieve best outcomes for communities and reduce delays and repeat of information between social care and health
- Redesign our commissioning teams (£113k)







All Targeted Actions: Corporate Support



- Absolutely necessary for the delivery of front line services
- Relocation of the Registrars Service (Savings of £45k)
- Charge costs of maintaining Oldway to the Reserve (Saving to revenue budget of £143k)
- Reduction in corporate funding for apprenticeships (Saving of £212k)
- Reduce Members Allowances budget (Saving of £50k)




