How has the work progressed since May 17?

- New information and advice pages added as a result of feedback from service users for example:
 - [SEN Early Years Resources](#) - this suit of resources was created in conjunction with the Early Years Advisory Teacher to give Early Years Practitioners and Parents/Carers easy access to relevant information and resources. Although the resources are targeted at young children, many of them are also useful for schools and parents in relation to any children who are developmentally delayed.

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- Updating educational settings records - an annual audit of SEN information and school websites is undertaken and feedback is given to schools in relation accuracy and compliance.
- Updating webpages to make them more visually engaging and contain more easily accessible information by embedding relevant video clips for example:

- A wider variety of feedback is published in relation to SEND services and procedures in general within the local area.
- Ongoing regional peer reviewing and collaboration.
- Ongoing active Promotion via events: Parent/Carer event, SEND Network and SENDCO forum.
- Encouragement and training offered to service providers to allow them to take increasing responsibility for their own related service record pages.
- Monitoring hit rates to webpages

How has this improved outcomes for children who have SEND? How can this be evidenced?

- New information and advice pages added as a result of feedback from service users for example:
 - [SEN Early Years Resources](#) – early years settings are actively using the information, advice and resources as evidence by the fact that since the creation of this suit of material it has consistently been within the top 10 most frequently visited pages across both Fis and the Local Offer website.
 - [Torbay SENCo Handbook](#) – feedback from all SENCOs and especially newly appointed SENCOs is that this information and advice has proved helpful to them within their role in supporting children with SEND
 - [SEN Capital Funding](#) – this shows which schools have been successful in obtaining accessibility funds and gives a summary overview of what has been done.
- New service area site pages added as a result of feedback from service users shows that the Local Offer website is a valued resource.
- Making webpages more visually engaging has improved hits to those pages as evidenced by stats.
- Ongoing active Promotion via events has increased awareness of the Local Offer and the types of information within it as evidenced by the increase in hits to the Local Offer landing page

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
