	Group B – Church of England Confirmed attendees: Mr Philip Mantel, Rev Angela Sumner, Mrs Charlotte Caluori Diocesan Board of Education.	
	It was noted that a quarter of schools in Torbay are Church of England schools.	
	Action: Ed to follow up possible replacement in Group B and enquire whether Mrs Caluori still wishes to be a member of Torbay SACRE.

Ī	5.	Apologia: the purpose of SACRE	
	5.	The meeting reflected on the previously circulated report which outlines the role of SACRE and what has been stated.	
		 It was highlighted that:- Local Authorities are required to establish a SACRE to advise the LA on matters pertaining to religious education and collective worship. Religious education is not a national curriculum subject but must be taught in all state funded schools but not academies Ofsted states that RE courses should be accredited Torbay SACRE has been successful in introducing a new RE syllabus Torbay SACRE continues to monitor RE curriculums across all schools in Torbay 	
		It was agreed that this was a useful and helpful report to reflect on the purpose and role of SACRE.	
		Further discussion ensued about a newspaper article naming and shaming Gloucestershire schools for not entering any pupils for GCSE Religious Education. The Council were criticised for not fulfilling its statutory duty.	
		Members reflected on the impact of naming and shaming individual schools in Torbay and were not happy to adopt this stance.	
		It was agreed that a better way forward in promoting Religious Education in schools would be for Ed to address the TASH and TAPS meetings when he can report on the Annual Report results and raise awareness of RE.

6.	Agreed Syllabus LaunchEd thanked Torbay Council for supporting the RESyllabus Launch event which received excellentresponses from those schools who attended. He saidthat this new RE Syllabus has set the bar and expectationfor schools in delivering RE. Debbie thanked Ed for hishard work in delivering the launch events.Ed reported a good attendance from Torbay primaryschools.Members recognised that the RE Syllabus meets the newOfsted Framework requirement. This will enable schoolsto demonstrate intent, implementation and impact in RE.Members reflected on the contents of the New RESyllabus.SACRE BudgetDebbie asked Members to note the position of the outturnof the SACRE budget for 2019. She pointed out thatcosts had been incurred through the RE Syllabus launch,attendee expenses, conference attendance andprofessional fees through Babcock for Ed's time.She reported that there will be a deficit by the end of thisfinancial year, however, the new 20/21 budget willbalance out the deficit. She reported that there is nomore spend available this year.	
7.	 SACRE Development plan update Ed introduced the SACRE Development Plan for 2019/20 which has an allocated SACRE adviser time of 10 days per year. Members looked at the key tasks and challenged:- 3B: To line with, support and co-operate with Learn, Teach Lead RE Programme – Debbie said that the Local Authority is not in a position support the LTLRE hubs this year, however, she can review this in the new budget in 2020. It was agreed that other funding bids should be explored. 4A – Evaluating and appraising provision for Collective Worship in community schools – Ed will agenda this item for Autumn term meeting as the guidance requires to be updated 1A Debbie asked Ed about the monitoring impact visits report – Ed said that he had not yet received Phillip's report. 	9.	Learn Teach Lead RE Updates Ed reported that a new hub has been established in mid- Devon at the request of teachers. The Team leads continue to support and embed the new RE Syllabus with schools.	
	10.	National Developments: Ofsted and RE	
		Commission updates Ed reported that the new Ofsted Inspection Framework will mark a significant change to the way subjects like RE are inspected. He said that all pupils in a maintained school are required to have a basic curriculum which includes RE.	
		 The Ofsted Inspection will be over two days and will focus on:- Broad and balanced curriculums Subjects will be chosen for a deep dive investigation which could include RE Academies will be expected to have a similar breath and ambition in delivering RE as maintained schools Teachers will need to have expert knowledge of their subjects
