4.	Torbay SACRE Membership Ed reported that there were few vacancies on the Torbay SACRE membership. He said that he had contacted South Devon College for higher education representation, however has not received a response back. Maia said she would feedback to Ed some suggested names for higher education representation.	
	It was agreed that a practicing teacher should be sought.	
	The meeting talked about the importance of bringing balance to the membership with the right skills and knowledge.	
	It was agreed that any teacher representation should comply with certain criteria to ensure that the right skills sets are used to attract the right fit within the membership.	
	Charlotte questioned why a humanist representative was being pursued when previously it had been agreed to not invite humanist representation to SACRE.	
	Corinne and Ed updated the meeting on the recent changes following the release of the report by the Commission on RE (September 2018) which recommended that the title of the subject should be changed from RE to Religious and Worldviews.	
	Corinne said that within the teaching of the new Torbay RE syllabus children are taught to be inclusive and have representations of world views.	
	Ed said that Keith Denby was the humanist representative for Devon SACRE and leader nationally and that any humanist representation should be channelled through him. He reported that Wales have fully embraced the commissioning recommendations.	
	It was agreed that a further discussion was needed on the Commission's ecommendations/changes and Keith will be asked to forward a case for humanist representation on SACRE. This will be tabled for the next agenda.	





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	Ed reported that NASACRE had been unhappy with the commission report which might lead to the loss of Local Authority support for SACREs.	
	Election of New Chair Corrine explained that since changing her job role she is finding it difficult for her to provide cover for her to attend SACRE meetings. She asked that another Chair be nominated in view of her constraints and who would be more flexible in their availability to attend meetings.	
	Ed asked if anyone would be willing to volunteer for the role of Chair. There were no volunteers at today's meeting and this will be an agenda item at the next meeting.	
	Future Meeting Dates The meeting considered the future meeting dates and talked about the merits of having the meetings on a Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday morning which would allow more people to attend.	
	The meeting noted Yousif's request for meetings not to be arranged on Fridays.

	Members recognised that the RE Syllabus meets the new Ofsted Framework requirement. This will enable schools to demonstrate intent, implementation and impact in RE.

	Ed reported that he does not yet have the school data and will feedback the GCSE results at the next meeting.	
	The meeting recognised that there was a lack of RE provision in school curriculums and the importance of keeping schools informed about the new Ofsted Framework.	
	Corrine informed the meeting about the 3 I's stated in the new Ofsted Framework about schools having to demonstrate and evidence intent, implementation and impact in curriculum subjects including RE. She said Inspectors will be questioning teachers on what is the intent for the subject and pupil, ask teachers to explain how they are delivering the subject; what is the impact of assessments on identifying disadvantaged pupils progress against other children. She explained that the Senior Leadership Team of a school will carry out deep dives which will scrutinise specific areas i.e. maths.	Commented [EP2]: Ofsted inspectors
