Who should come to a Family Group Conference?

This will be different for each family. Some families may be worried about certain relatives coming to the meeting, sometimes close family friends attend as they feel more like family than relatives themselves.

We would suggest that the best people to help a child or young person are nearly always their own relatives.

Any worries about who should attend should be discussed with your co-ordinator.

In any discussions; it is the needs and wellbeing of the child or young person which is of greatest importance.

Family Group Conference Service

Information for families

We think families are able to make better decisions about their children than we can.

A Family Group Conference is a process led by family members to plan and make decisions for your child.

Family Group Conference's put the child or young people at the heart of the decision making process. They are extremely effective in making safe plans for the child or young person, improving outcomes and promoting positive changes.

Choosing to take part in a Family Group Conference is a voluntary process, and although you cannot be forced into having a meeting the process has lots of benefits.



There are three stages to t Family Group Conference

Stage 1: The referral

A referral is made by the child's social worker.

Once a referral has been made, you will be al acts as a neutral person and will not influence the planning of the meeting.

Stage 2: Preparation

Your co-ordinator will organise the Family Grothe child / young person, parents with parent carers. They help to identify who is in the fam decision for the child or young person.

Stage 3: The conference

The first part of the meeting will be led by you make sure everyone is introduced and that expurpose of the meeting, and establish any groups.

Family Group Conferences FAQs

What if my child or young person does not agree with the family decision or plan?

We believe that children and young people should be involved in the Family Group Conference and that their wishes and feelings are taken into account, their age and understanding will play a part in this. If there are any real differences you can ask your coordinator for help and guidance.

What happens if Children's Services do not agree with our plan?

We will only disagree with your plan if we think it will leave your child or children at risk. You might then decide to hold another conference to change the plan.

If we do not agree with your plan, we will fully explain the reasons to you.
