Updates and news for Early Years setting SENDCOs, SEMH and SLC Leads in Torbay Early Years settings

First Steps - Drop ins

Just before the Christmas break, I went along to a 'First Steps' virtual drop in, run by Dr Delmar alongside other health & Education professionals. It was really useful. The session was split into two parts. The first section was a 'Ten Minute Tool-kit' presentation by Louise Brown, Highly Specialist Music Therapist. Louise described how she uses music to develop relationship and engagement with young children with SEND. She gave us lots of practical tips including

- Changing words in familiar songs to improve motivation (child's name or a favourite character etc.)
- Singing instructions to improve transitions and listening skills
- Singing repetitions of single words with a familiar rhyme
- Using rhythm to add markers e.g. a gentle pressure squeeze on the hands and arms
- Using visuals to accompany the song

The second part of the session was dedicated to anonymous case discussions, providing support ideas for the practitioner. Again this section was very useful aimed at giving some mutual learning, helping to help and joining up plans of support for the individual of concern.

Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC)

Augmentative and Alternative
Communication is a set of tools and strategies that an individual uses to aid communication. AAC can take many forms such as speech, a shared glance, text, gesture, facial expression, touch, sign language, symbols, pictures and speech generating devices. Everyone uses AAC to help them get their message across but for children, young people and adults with complex communication needs AAC provides a means to ensure they have a voice.

A group of professionals from across the whole of Devon have worked with parents and carers to create an interactive training programme that provides an introduction to AAC.

The training focuses on the following areas:

- What is AAC?
- AAC Themes and Myths
- Where can I find out more?

Self-regulation:

We are all aware of how children's PSED needs have spiked during the pandemic. Children often struggle with Christmas particularly those who rely on familiarity and sameness to regulate. In your settings, you may find children need more adult support following their return from Christmas to manage routines, boundaries, and social interaction.

Katie continues to offer support to settings who have a high level of social and emotional need which can involve:

- Virtual or face to face discussion regarding specific needs
- Training can be offered to your staff team to support their understanding of self-regulation
- A draft Self-regulation Policy is available which could link to your behaviour management policy. The Self-Regulation Policy can be adapted following the training to support your setting's individual approach.

As we are all aware, self-regulation features in the requirements regarding Personal, Social and Emotional Development under the EYFS reforms in the Educational Programmes and ELG's. Also, early identification and intervention may support a child in having their PSED/SEMH needs addressed while in the early years phase of their education.
