1. Level 3 Early Years Setting SENCO Qualification through Best Practice Network

Early Years SENCO - Level 3 | Best Practice Network
An exciting opportunity has arisen for all Setting
SENCOs wanting to achieve a formal qualification in
the SENCO role. FREE to those that apply online from
all early years settings including childminders. This is
an online course spread out over 4 months. A very
worthwhile qualification if you are SENCO.

Best Practice Network is now delivering this on behalf of the DfE rather than NASEN as previously thought.

2. A National Portage Association Workshop – A Small Steps Approach to Learning for Children with SEND

A certified course delivered in Torbay by 2 accrediated trainers, over 2 & ½ days on 8th, 15th and 22nd November, bookable through Torbay Council ilearn.

This course has a small cost of £30 which covers the certificate from the NPA.

3. Makaton Part 1 & 2

Certified 1 day courses to be held in Torbay on 19th Jan (Part 1) and 26th Jan (Part 2), bookable through Torbay Council ilearn. You will need to have completed Part 1 at any time, to complete Part 2.

4. The National Deaf Children's Society<u>Professional resources for early years</u> Supporting deaf children (ndcs.org.uk)

This website has a lot of good information about supporting young children with a hearing impairment, develop good speech, language, and communication skills. There is a section about assessment as well as how to create a good listening environment.

If you sign up for free you can download several resources including a Pragmatic Profile, which looks at how young children are using their communication skills. This may provide good evidence of where the child's needs lie and enable you to structure support plans.

There is a lot of information on NDCS site which would support your CPD in this area of need.

Practical Activities - Wow Boxes

The Torbay Portage Service have won a grant of £200 to set up a communication library for parents receiving portage services. We have decided to make up 20 Wow Boxes to support young children's

- Engagement with others and toys
- Listening and attention skills
- Exploratory play skills
- Parallel play skills
- Language skills

So far, we have collected the boxes and are about to start ordering the resources to put inside them. Here is an example.

Practical Activities - Song Boxes

Often rhyme and song is the first way to engage a child, by using repetitive language and gestures.

There are plenty of websites that cite the top 10 favorite nursery rhymes, including Baa Baa, Incy Wincy, Round and Round the garden and Wheels on the Bus.

The benefits of rhymes and song also include, encouraging young children's co-ordination & fluency of fine & gross motor skills, boosting vocabulary, developing emotional awareness, and gaining a sense of doing something together socially.



We have made song boxes to help engage children to choose and focus on a particular song by using objects in a box. Start introducing choices by having only 2 objects out on the lid of the box, for the child to choose from. Having a box with a lid that locks helps!



Once the child understands that choosing an object is followed by their favorite song or rhyme, start introducing some pictures as well.



These song cards can be found on the National Portage Association Hub <u>Early Years Songtime</u> <u>Choice Boards | National Portage Association</u> You need to have registered with the NPA to access these ones.

Also try sensory rhymes which combine the familiar words of the rhyme with on-body actions. These might be a gentle touch or something firmer, depending on the child, for example below. Have a go at making your own!
