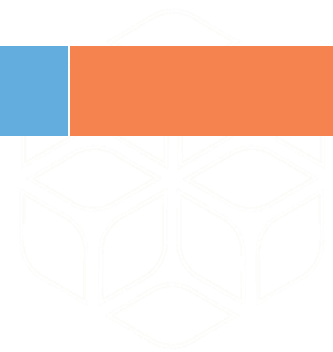

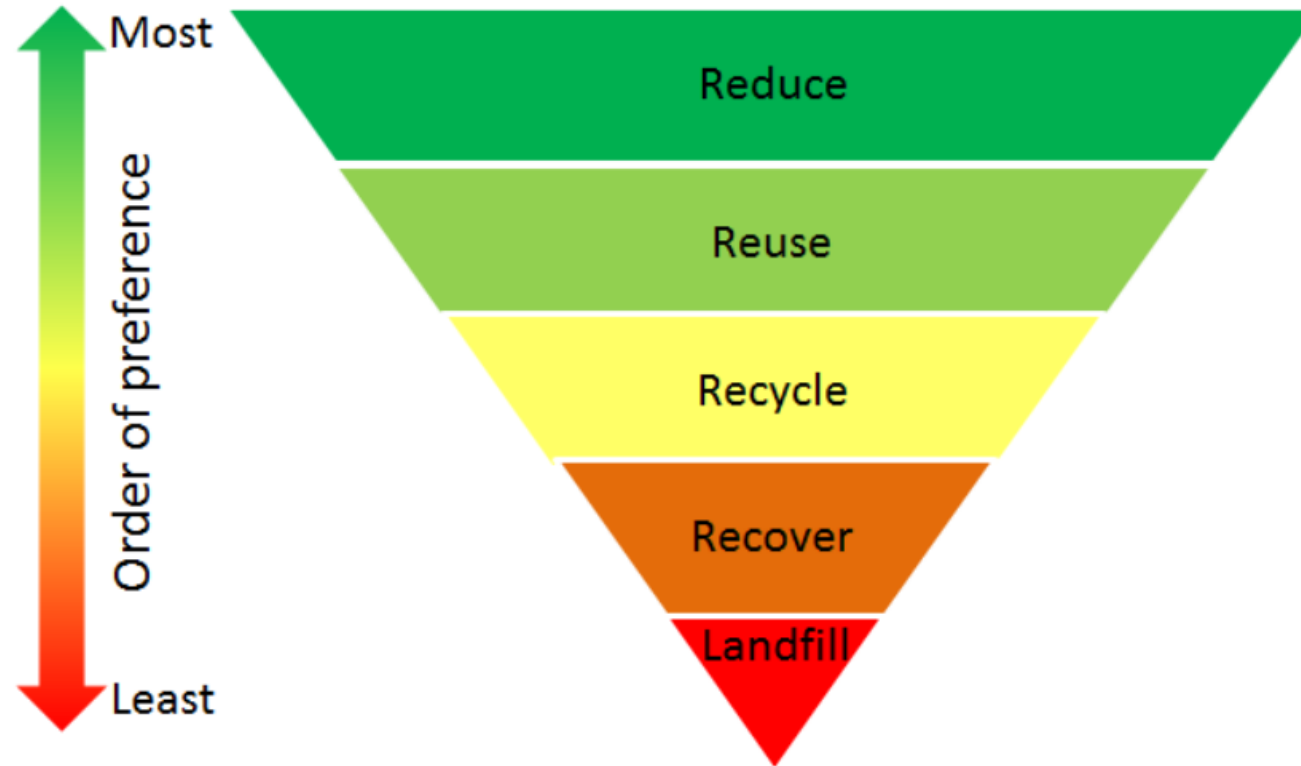

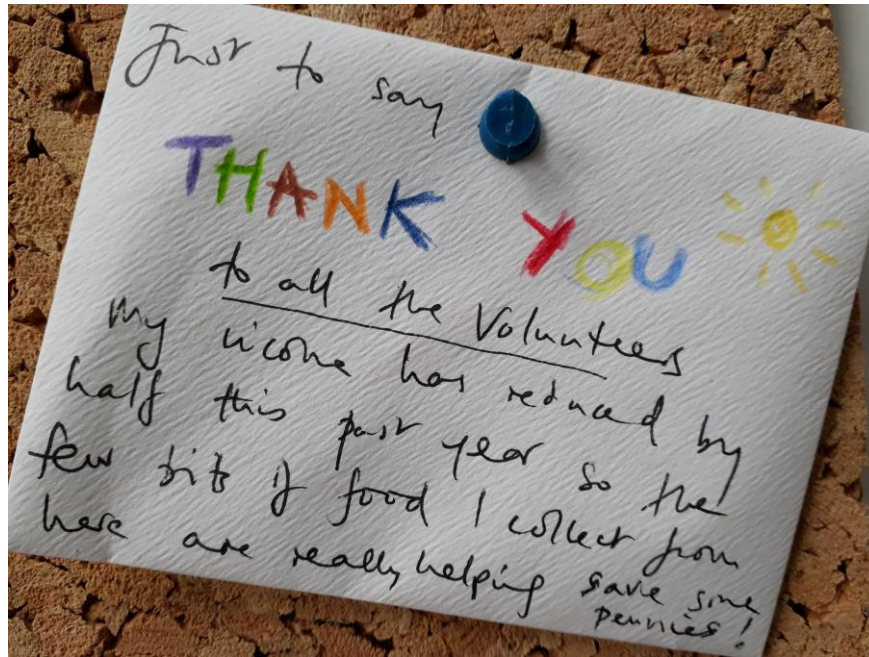

In 2020/21, CAG Devon groups redistributed a massive amount of surplus **food**:

- saving nearly 58 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub><sup>e</sup> emissions
- preventing nearly 15 tonnes of food waste.
- volunteers gave 2897 hours of their time.
