

Drivers for Change – The Waste Hierarchy





In 2020/21, CAG Devon groups redistributed a massive amount of surplus food:

- saving nearly 58 tonnes of CO^{2e} emissions
- preventing nearly 15 tonnes of food waste.
- volunteers gave 2897 hours of their time.
