National Strategy

- ▶ Resource and Waste Strategy released in 2018 the strategy sets out how the Government plan to double resource productivity and eliminate avoidable waste of all kinds by 2050
- Move from the linear economic model of 'take, make, use, throw' and move to a more circular economy allowing us to keep resources in use for as long as possible.
- ► Environment Act 2021 is wide ranging and includes provisions covering, environmental governance, air quality, water, nature and biodiversity and resource efficiency and waste.

The Biggest Waste Reform Since 1990

- Extended Producer Responsibility
- Consistency in Household and Business Recycling in England
- Deposit Return Scheme
 - Second round of consultations completed in 2021
 - ▶ Still awaiting feedback on Consistency and Deposit Return Scheme

Multiple consultations on other aspects of resource management have been released at different points through the year.

The Local Picture

- ► Torbay's Resource and Waste Management Strategy 2020-2023
- ▶ Aim to increase recycling, reduce residual waste and reduce our carbon footprint
- Action plan includes:
 - ▶ Recycling Support Co-ordinators for engagement, education and communication
 - ▶ Focus on efficiency of collections, to ensure more recycling can be collected
 - ▶ Developing of collection policy and planning guidance for developers
 - Continue work with the Devon Authorities Strategic Waste Committee (DASWC)

DASWC

- Includes Torbay Council, Devon County Council and all 9 district councils in the Devon County Council area.
- Benefit from the sharing of good practice and from jointly funded projects that promote sustainable waste management in Devon.
- ▶ Jointly funded projects include Waste Prevention Guide, waste composition analysis every 5 years, waste advisors
- Recycling education within schools.

Reuse and Waste Minimisation




Figure 1: Average residual waste composition (kg/hh/wk, %)
