

### **Better Care Fund outcomes**

- Total non-elective admissions (general and acute) per 1,000 population
- Permanent admissions of older people (aged 65 and over) to residential & nursing care homes, per 100,000 population
- Proportion of older people (65 and over) who were still at home 91 days after discharge from hospital into reablement / rehabilitation services
- Delayed transfers of care from hospital per 100,000 population
- and; two local targets:
- Rate of dementia diagnosis
- Patient/service user experience of care
