DF updated all that Carolyn Custerson from English Riviera BID Company Ltd has withdrawn actions from the current Torbay Climate Emergency Action Plan (TCEAP), and all associations to it, until she has undertaken much more consultation with the 1300 businesses she represents. JW has offered to support any working group when established.
