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
Brief Background

 Mears Care Torbay formed from 3 traditional existing home care agencies in Torbay in April 2015

Prime purpose is to develop outcomes based working

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Traditional Home Care

- Referrals to our service is based on time and task e.g.
 - 30 minute visits x 3 times a day
 - Carer workers follow tasks set by care managers
 - Care workers spend a lot of time travelling between calls
 - People who receive care put continuity of care as one of their highest priority



New ways of working

- Netherlands model (Buurtzorg) principles
- Small teams of care workers (no more than 12)
- Small geographical areas
- Self Governing teams
- Coaching style of management



Potential Benefits

- Increase continuity of care from team of 12 carers
- Reduce travelling times opportunities for walkers
- Team working and increased retention rates
- Daily meetings improved communication
- Higher satisfaction rates



Next steps...

- Increased training and career progression
- Higher levels of support at home
- Close working relationships with GP surgeries, district nurses, voluntary sector and others
- Working with Helen Sanderson to develop new ways of care assessments and reviews
