Re: Torbay Local Plan Modification Consultation

Thank you for giving us the opportunity to comment on the modifications to the Torbay Local Plan.

Our main concern is the allocation of new greenfield sites for development due to the increased figure for housing of 10,000. We are particularly concerned about the land identified south of White Rock and St Mary's campsite, Brixham as development sites.

Both these sites are highly constrained due to being located within the Greater Horseshoe bat foraging zone and within a strategic flyway for the Greater Horseshoe bat. The Greater Horseshoe Bat roost at Berry Head National Nature Reserve is highly sensitive to development pressures and the loss of available foraging habitat, particularly as the roost is located on a headland, surrounded on two sides by sea. The bats flyways from the roost are also highly vulnerable to light pollution as they abut urban areas and the flyway to the south of the roost is already at a critical pinch point.

We cannot recommend these sites are proposed until a detailed assessment and surveys are undertaken to ensure no impact to the Greater Horseshoe bat. The assessment also needs to take into account the cumulative impact of loss of habitat alongside other developments that are proposed or planning agreed within the foraging zone and strategic flyways. The impact from loss of habitat on other species such as the Cirl Bunting also needs to be assessed as this is loss of more farmland habitat on which this bird relies.

The area at White Rock was also identified in the Torbay Green Infrastructure Plan as being appropriate for a new Country Park, due to the communities in the area not having access to accessible natural greenspace. This should be considered for the future health and wellbeing of the local communities.

Thank you for inviting AONB office comments on the proposed main modifications to the Torbay Local Plan.

Land South of White Rock

We have substantive concerns over "Main Modification 3" and "Policy SS3 New Future Growth Area, Land South of White Rock". Whilst not within the designated area for the South Devon AONB the site forms an important element of the setting to the South Devon AONB and therefore its special qualities as defined in the South Devon AONB Management Plan 2014-2019. It is our view that development of "Land South of White Rock" has the potential to result in harm to the nationally important protected landscape of the South Devon AONB.

Sustainability Appraisal entries identify the area as:

- being highly sensitive to change;
- open to views from the AONB to the west and the south;
- resulting in the loss of best and most versatile agricultural land;

Mention is given elsewhere in the Local Plan documentation to the use of Land South of White Rock to protect and enhance the rural backdrop to the area. However, it would appear that there is insufficient robust information relating to views into the area from the west and south (from within and across the South Devon AONB).

If this site is to continue to be considered for allocation, we strongly urge the development of a robust evidence base including a comprehensive landscape and visual impact assessment, in advance of allocation, to ensure that the site could be developed without harm to the natural beauty and special qualities of the South Devon AONB.

St Mary's Campsite

This site has previously been identified within the Brixham Urban Fringe Study as one that would be highly sensitive to the development of buildings higher in nature than the present single storey caravans. We strongly urge the development of a robust evidence base including a comprehensive landscape and visual impact assessment, in advance of allocation, to ensure that the site could be developed without harm to the natural beauty and special qualities of the South Devon AONB.

Without a sufficiently robust evidence base to warrant the inclusion of these sites we feel it necessary to raise a holding objection at this stage in relation to these two sites, until such time that it can be demonstrated these sites will not cause harm to the South Devon AONB.
